- Friday marks the end of the third quarter. We met with teachers last week to plan for third quarter conferences the week of 3/23.
- We have now had four SARB meetings at the Dairyland office; so far the outcomes have been positive.
- Super-Tutoring is in full swing at both campuses; we have about 35 students riding the late bus on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
- The LCAP Parent Information night is scheduled for tomorrow at 5:30. Sheriff Deputy Rob Blehm will be presenting information to parents on cybersecurity and social media monitoring. The District Wellness Coach will also give a short presentation on student social/emotional well-being and the services she offers. We will be offering pizza and blue tickets for families in attendance.
- The Dairyland DC Trip received a \$3500 donation from Chowchilla Women's Prison. They presented the check to us two weeks ago.
- After a year of monitoring the solar panels at Dairyland, we have had a total savings of almost 42K KWH and \$24K.

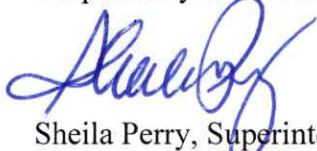

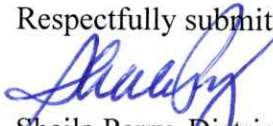
