BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION PROGRAM OUTCOMES:

Upon completion of this program, the graduate will be able to:

1. Recognize ethical and legal dimensions of business decisions and identify the probable outcomes and effects on stakeholders.
2. Identify key issues and requirements involved in the startup, financing, and operation of a for-profit business.
3. Demonstrate professional forms of communication.
4. Differentiate opportunities and challenges of tribes, tribal enterprises, and minority entrepreneurs.
5. Interpret numerical analysis and quantitative methodologies for managerial decision making.
6. Develop effective verbal, written, interpersonal, and technical communication skills for organizational management.

Students enrolled in the Bachelor of Science in Business Administration must complete a minimum of 120 credits, with a minimum of 45 credits completed at the 300-level or higher. Also, 33% of the credits earned must be completed at the College of Menominee Nation. Students must have completed 60 credits to enroll in 300- and 400-level courses.
