Reading

Pupils should spend 20 minutes, 4 times a week reading for pleasure. This can be a novel, magazine or any reading material that pupils enjoy.

Mathematics and numeracy

This half term will have a focus on sequences, ratio, proportion and numerical reasoning. Complete the task on Google Classroom looking at continuing and giving rules for a sequence, simplifying ratios, simple recipe proportions and numerical reasoning.

English, literacy and communication

Lots of books today are graphic novels. A popular one currently is Dog Man by David Pilkey. On google classroom is an online example of Dog Man. Create your favourite scene from Twelfth Night or another of Shakespeare's plays as a graphic novel.

Science and technology
