 - EMT 104 Basic Emergency Medical Technology (10 credits) [**Prerequisite for "FIRE ACADEMY and PARAMEDICINE"**]
 - EMT 104 AB Applied Practical Studies for Emergency Medical Technology (.5 credit)
 - EMT 104 LL Emergency Medical Technology Practicum (2 credits)
- Students must pass 1st semester courses, as prerequisite to 2nd semester coursework**

 - \$15 registration fee and laboratory fees (**PAID BY WEST-MEC**)
