- The Math Achievement Fund Coaching Grant has been submitted. If awarded, the district will receive \$62,000 for a middle school math coach.
- The district submitted a grant to KDE for an additional six AEDs worth about \$12,000.
- The district has been awarded a Read to Achieve Grant from KDE in the amount of \$140,000 for two years. We can reapply for two more years.
- Kelly Shaw has submitted a grant to the Snapdragon Book Foundation for \$3,000 for Battle of the Books.
- Harley McIntyre has been awarded a \$5,000 KY Dept. of Ag Raising Hope Grant to be used for Farm Safety Day.
- MCMS students Lilly Billingsley and Lucy Blythe won a \$1,000 Drs. Mody Make a Difference Grant from the Center for Gifted Studies at WKU to be used for dental health care. We will have a TV crew on March 24 for the dental health assembly.
- MCES recently received notification that it was awarded a Nationwide Educator Resource Grant by the American Farm Bureau Foundation for Agriculture. They sent a second letter stating it was a mistake, but agreed to send some consolation prizes.
- The district will once again apply for the Summer Boost Reading and Math Grant sponsored by KDE's Office of Teaching and Learning and Summer Food Service Program.
- Spring Meet the Hornets is March 13 at the MCHS softball field.
- Open Enrollment at all schools is March 24.
- Local TV stations recently covered our MCMS Ice Cream Parlor Math Event and MCES/MCHS Teddy Bear Clinic.


