Polina is the 2015 Four Continents champion, the 2014 U.S. Classic champion, and a two-time U.S. National silver medalist (2014, 2016). She represented the United States at the 2014 Winter Olympics in Sochi, finishing 9th. Earlier in her career, Edmunds won two ISU Junior Grand Prix events and the 2013 U.S. National Junior title. Edmunds was in skates by two and in lessons by four. She's a fierce competitor and mentor in the figure skating world and is looking forward to sharing her passion, expertise, and grit with Shattuck-St. Mary's. Team USA Coach, former U. S. National Competitor and former Head Coach of Alysa Lui, the 2025 World Champion, 2-time U.S. National Champion, International medalist, World Medalist, National Medalist and Olympian. Laura holds a degree from UC Berkeley and specializes in jumps, spins and skating skills.

Max is the 2013 U.S. National Champion and a four-time U.S. Championship Medalist, having won Gold, Silver, Bronze, and Pewter medals between 2013 and 2016. He won several Grand Prix medals, taking Gold at Skate America in 2016, and Bronze in 2014, as well as Bronze at Skate Canada in 2015 and Cup of China in 2018. Max is a four-time World Team member and two-time World Team Champion.

PETER BIVER

Peter is the Director of Summer Camp and Head Coach of Shattuck-St. Mary's (SSM) Figure Skating Center of Excellence. He is a US National and International Coach (for Poland) as well as a US National Competitor in Senior Pairs. Peter is a 6-time US Figure Skating (USFS) Gold Medalist in Skating Skills, Singles, Pairs, Compulsory Dance, Partnered Free Dance and Solo Free Dance. He is the coach of multiple USFS Gold Medalists in Skating Skills, Singles, Pairs and Ice Dance. He specializes in the portable pole harness to assist skaters in learning jumps and enjoys working with all ages and levels. He toured with Holiday on Ice throughout Europe and Russia and earned a BBA degree from St. Norbert College in De Pere, WI. Peter is guided by his passion to bring a holistic approach to each skater's development in pursuit of their potential as an athlete and artist.



SURYA BONALY

Surya Bonaly is a 9-time French and 5-time European figure skating champion, 3-time Olympian, and 3-time World silver medalist. She is the first female figure skater to attempt quadruple jumps in ISU competition (Salchow and Toe Loop) and is known for being the only skater who can land a back flip executed with a full spilt in the air and landed on one foot. Her coaching style is electric and innovative, drawing upon her numerous years as a featured skater in some of the world's premier skating shows. SSM is privileged to have Coach Surya on staff during the school year.

CAREY TINKELBERG

Carey Tinkelenberg is the founder of the Northfield Figure Skating School and is a PSA Triple Master Rated coach and director, an SSM Staff Coach, and an ISU Coach Developer. Carey coaches athletes from beginner through senior levels, specializing in technical coaching, skating skills, off-ice jumps and flexibility, and mental training. She has a passion for cultivating life skills through skating, and challenging athletes to "become their best selves." With a B.A. in Psychology from Carleton College, she is a longstanding member of numerous U.S. Figure Skating and PSA leadership committees as well as the author of several articles and training materials for skating's national governing body. Carey was one of the original development specialists of Learn-to-Skate USA and is passionate about teaching the fundamentals of skating technique.



MICHAEL CHAPA

Michael is an elite competitive figure skater and current member of the U.S. National Team. An Austin native, he began skating at the age of three and quickly developed into a multi-discipline athlete with national and international experience. At sixteen, Michael relocated to Minnesota to pursue advanced training and academics at Shattuck–St. Mary's (SSM). After graduating, he moved to the Chicago area to continue both his collegiate studies and his competitive skating career. **Competitive Achievements:** International Competitor (Singles and Junior Pairs), Four-Time U.S. Figure Skating Gold Medalist, (*Skating Skills, Free Skate, Solo Dance, and Pairs*), 2024 U.S. Figure Skating Novice Pair National Competitor – **Silver Medalist**, 2024 U.S. Figure Skating Pair Final – Novice – **Champion**, 2022 U.S. Figure Skating Junior Collegiate **National Champion**, 2020–2023 U.S. Figure Skating **National Development Team** Member. **Coaching Experience:** Since 2016, Michael has coached Learn to Skate and private lessons at multiple rinks across the country, including Chaparral Ice in Austin, Texas; Shattuck–St. Mary's in Faribault, Minnesota; Centennial Ice Arena in Highland Park, Illinois; Twin Rinks Ice Arena in Buffalo Grove, Texas; and Oakton Ice Arena in Park Ridge, Illinois. His broad coaching experience across diverse training environments has strengthened his ability to support skaters of varying ages, levels, and learning styles. In addition to his figure skating work, Michael serves as an AAU Gymnastics Coach, bringing a deep understanding of body awareness, athletic development, and safe skill progression to his athletes both on and off the ice.

Coaching Specialties: Skaters from Pre-Preliminary through Junior levels, Jump technique and jump development, IJS-level spins, Off-ice electric spinner training with harness, Off-ice jump technique and conditioning. **Background:** Michael is a proud SSM alumnus (2018–2022). He continues his competitive career this season as a Junior-level pair skater, balancing high-performance training with his academic and coaching commitments.

Coach Amy is a 2-time Master Rated Coach with over 20 years of coaching experience. She also serves as a U.S. Figure Skating Technical Specialist and is certified as an Exercise Physiologist through the American College of Sports Medicine. Following her competitive career, Rosie travel around the world as a professional figure skater, working for Royal Caribbean Cruise Lines, Willie Bietak Productions, Delice Productions in France, and Ucha-Atayde Entertainment in Mexico.

Garrett is a PSA-Master Rated Choreographer, choreographing for international skaters spanning 6 continents, ranging from beginners to Olympic skaters. He is Co-Executive Director of American Ice Theatre, an artistic figure skating organization where he also directs the Minneapolis-St. Paul branch. Touring professionally since 2012, he has skated with Holiday on Ice, Willy Bietak Productions, Dynamic Shows, StageWorks Worldwide Productions, Ice Theatre of New York and Le Patin Libre's production "Murmuration". As a certified RYT-200 yoga Instructor and background in ballet and modern dance, Garrett is passionate about teaching skaters the mind-body connection and nurturing each individual's inner artist to come onto the ice.

Makenna is a former Team USA synchronized skater with over 20 years of figure skating experience and 7 years of coaching. Nicolas (Nico) Osseland is a French former Olympic pair skater. With his partners, he won the Junior National title and the silver medal at the Senior level. He competed in several Junior Worlds, European Championships, the Senior Grand Prix, and the 1998 Olympics in Nagano, Japan. Following his competitive career, Nico earned his Brevet d’Etat d’Educateur Sportif from the INSEP in Paris, France. This degree in the instruction of sports allowed him to begin his coaching career as the Head Coach and Skating Director with the Luxembourg Skating Federation. He has coached skaters who have become National gold medalists as well as qualifying for the Junior Grand Prix, the European Figure Skating Championships, Junior Worlds, and Worlds. Nico moved to the United States in 2015 to marry his now wife, Victoria, and coaches in the Orlando area where he enjoys working as a secondary coach with a focus on jumps and spins for singles and pairs skaters. He also teaches many hockey skaters, working on their skating skills and power.
