# High School Credits

## Schedule:

High schools offer 7 classes a day.

## Credits:

Each semester course passed with a grade of 70 or higher equals 0.5 credit.

In one semester, a student may earn up to 3.5 credits (7-semester classes).

Year-long courses may average for credit at the end of the second semester.

\*The awarding of credit is also dependent on student meeting state attendance requirements.

*You must have at least 6 credits to be promoted to 10<sup>th</sup> grade.*

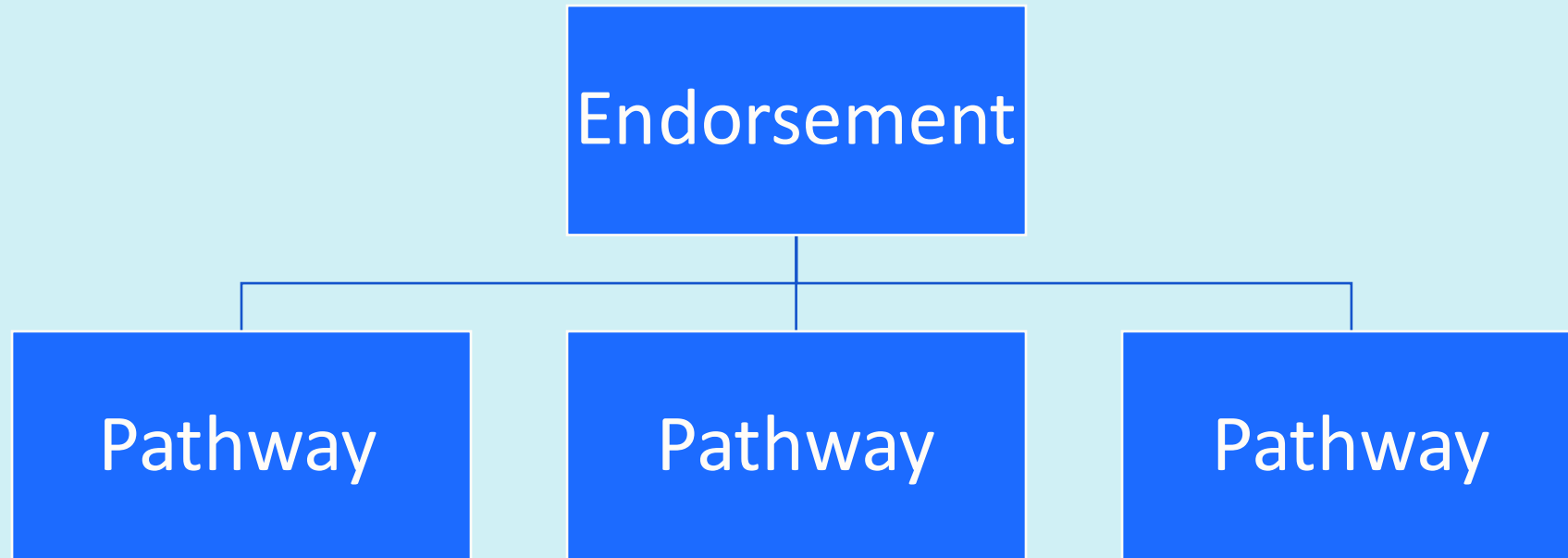

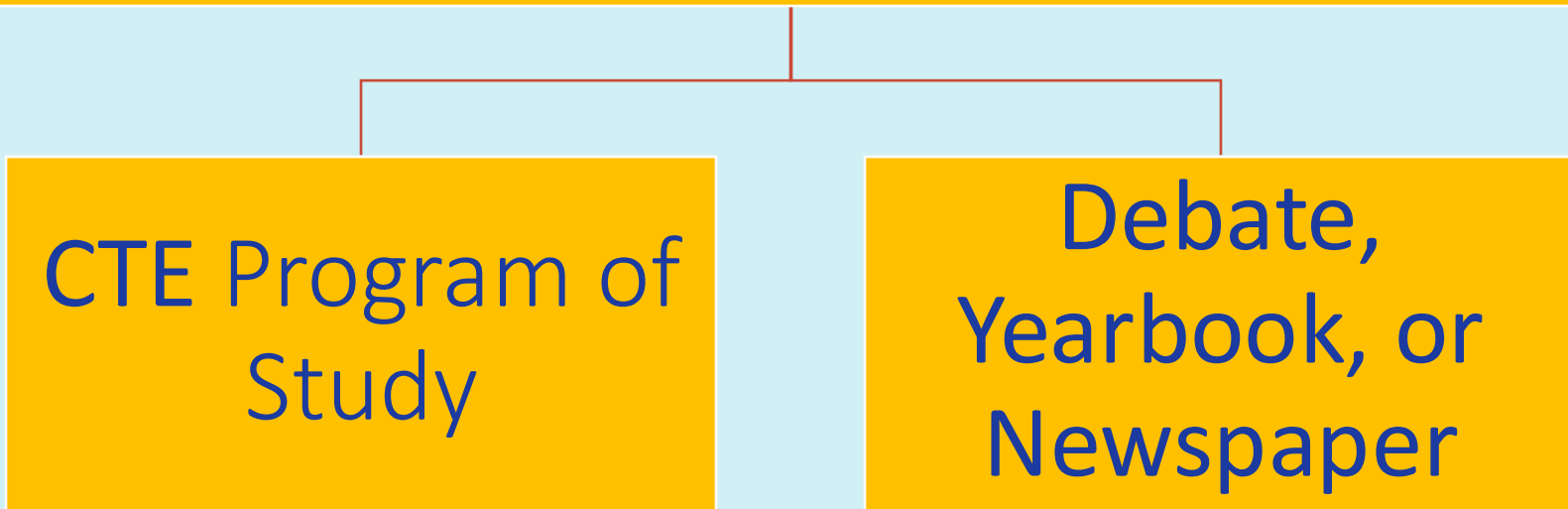

As one of Texas' top students, you may be eligible to accelerate your path to college and receive a scholarship for one or two semesters at any Texas public institution of higher education, including colleges, universities, and technical colleges.

#### THE FINE PRINT:

Here's what you need to be eligible:

- Texas residency
- FAFSA completion
- At least 22 high school credits and a final GPA equivalent to 3.0 or higher
- Additional academic requirements, including college readiness test scores, STAAR exam participation, and demonstration of mastery in various subjects

The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board website link above includes a detailed list of eligibility requirements.

If you graduate two or more semesters before your class, you'll receive a two-semester scholarship, equivalent to the amount of the TEXAS grant, upon admission to any Texas public institution of higher education, including colleges, universities, and technical colleges. You may also be eligible for additional financial aid at most of these institutions!

The Texas First Diploma does not guarantee automatic admission for students. Ask your counselor if your grade point average at graduation qualifies you for automatic admission under the state's top 10 percent law.

You can apply to any college or university you choose; however, the scholarship will apply only at the Texas public institution of higher education where you have been admitted.

**Use it or lose it!** The scholarship offer will expire at the end of the first academic year following your graduation, so we encourage you to attend college directly after high school.

**NOTE:** Before September 1, 2023, the Texas First Scholarship was only applicable at 10 Texas public universities. However, effective September 1, 2023, the number of

institutions of higher education eligible to award the Texas First Scholarship to eligible Texas First Diploma graduates expanded from 10 universities to all Texas public institutions of higher education, including colleges, universities, and technical colleges (Senate Bill 2294, 88th Texas Legislature, Regular Session). Please see your high school counselor for information regarding eligibility requirements to graduate early under the Texas First Program and receive a scholarship up to one year upon admission to any eligible Texas public institution of higher education, per Texas Education Code, Section 61.003.

# Texas First Early High School Completion Program

**Purpose:** To promote efficiency in the state public education system and incentivize the enrollment of high-performing students at eligible institutions within the State of Texas. Students *may* receive scholarship funding as part of this program.

## Two top eligibility requirements include:

- Graduate one or more semesters early from high school.
- Demonstrate mastery in ALL FIVE of the following areas: English/Language Arts, Math, Science, Social Studies, AND World Languages and Culture.
  - Demonstration of mastery in EACH area will be assessed through a combination of scores from SAT, ACT, PSAT/NMSQT, AP, TSIA2, Dual Credit, CLEP, and/or FLATS

If a student is interested in the Texas First Early High School Completion Program, the student should meet with their high school counselor to learn more about this graduation option and verify eligibility based on all requirements.

Completion of the Texas Early High School Completion Program DOES NOT guarantee automatic admissions.

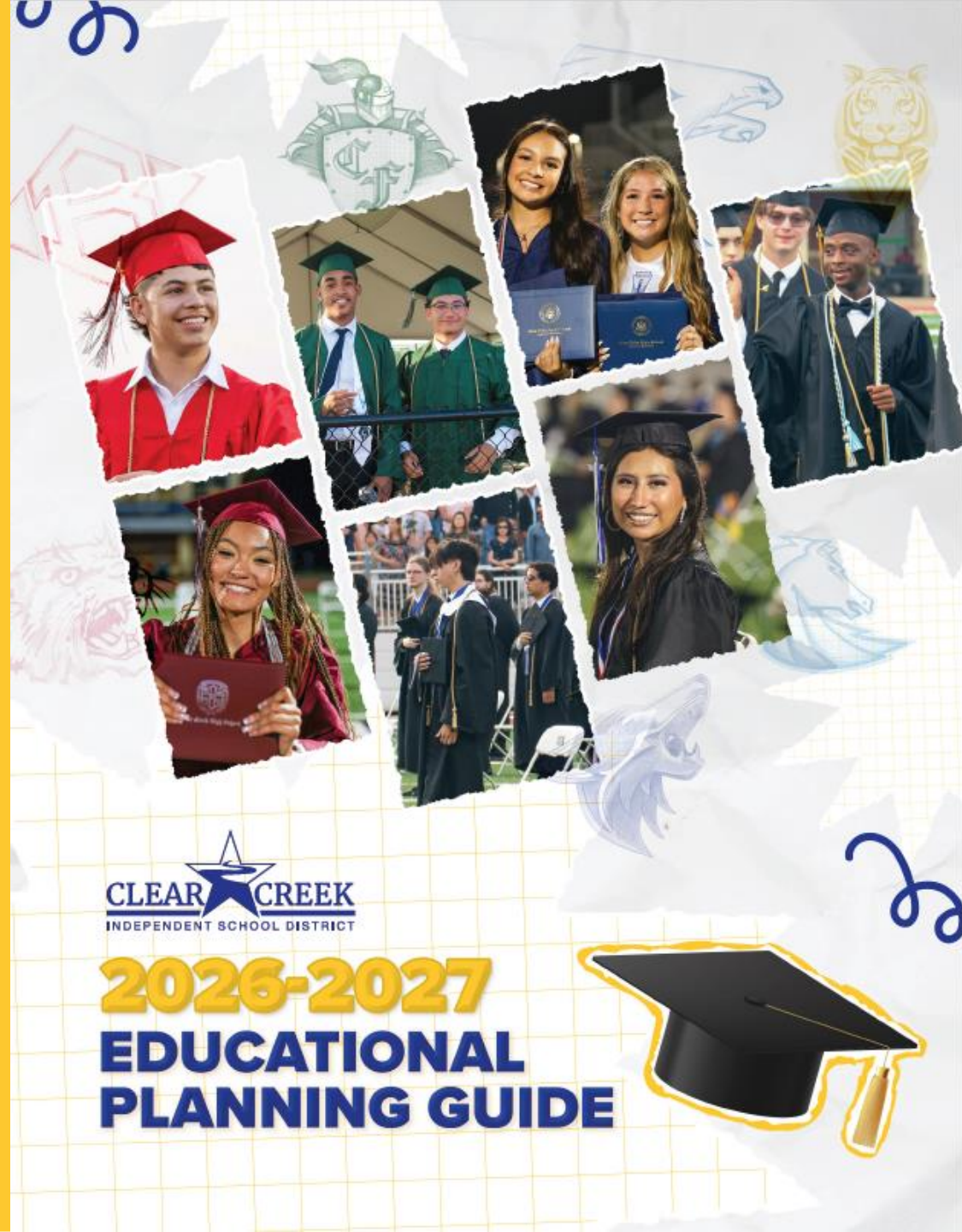

To be considered for a transfer from an Honors, Honors/GT, or AP/GT course, the student must have made a sincere effort to succeed by attending tutorials, completing his/her work, and by conferencing with his/her teacher. The parent must conference with the teacher before a course level change will be considered. If these conditions are met and the student is earning less than a grade of 75 on the first progress report or at the end of the first nine-week grading period, that student will be considered for a change. Course level-up changes will only be considered before the first progress report. Space availability in the receiving course will be a consideration for all course level changes. Refer to CCISD's Grading and Reporting Procedures for further details.

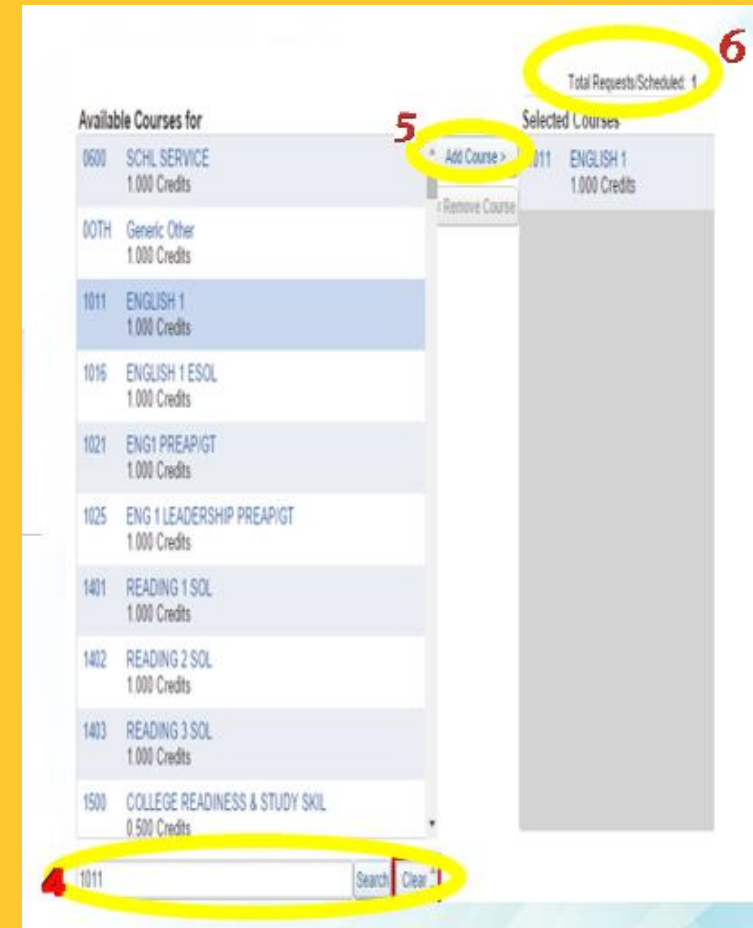

# GPA and Class Rank

## Class 2027 & Beyond

- High School GPA (Grade Point Average), both Class Ranking GPA and Cumulative GPA begins with coursework in the 9<sup>th</sup>-grade year.
- CCISD's Class Ranking GPA and Cumulative GPA scale are a weighted 5.0 scale with additional points for Honors/AP (Level 1) courses.
- Cumulative GPA, Class Ranking GPA, and Class Rank are calculated at the end of the school year for 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade and each semester for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade.
- Class Ranking GPA is used to determine class rank.

# College Admissions

- College admission requirements may be greater than FHSP graduation requirements and will vary from college to college.
- Review college admission requirements early and often to ensure high school coursework meets the expected standard of a college/university.
- College admission officers will review a student's transcript for rigor and course selection during all four years of high school.
- GPA/Class Rank may be an admission criterion at a college/university.



# What is College, Career, and Military Readiness and how do I earn it?

- What is it?

CCMR stands for College, Career, and Military Readiness, and it's a Texas program that helps students prepare for life after high school. CCMR helps students develop the skills and knowledge they need for higher education, careers, and military service.

- How do I earn it?

- **Dual credit courses:** Earn college credit in English or math, or a total of nine credit hours in dual credit courses
- **Advanced Placement (AP) exams:** Score a 3 or higher on one or more AP exams
- **Texas Success Initiative (TSI) criteria:** Meet the minimum score requirements on the TSI assessment in English and Math
- **OnRamps courses:** Complete an OnRamps course
- **Industry Based Certification and Program of study:** Complete a program of study in CTE and earn an approved Industry Based Certification OR earn a Level 1 or 2 certificate.
- **Military enlistment:** Enlist in the Armed Forces
- **Associate degree:** Earn an associate degree



# Superintendent's Scholars Class of 2028 and Beyond

## Eligibility Requirements:

- Earn a grade of at least 95 in Level 2 courses
- Earn a grade of at least 85 in Level 1 courses
- No discipline records
- No more than 10 absences (excused and/or unexcused) in each semester

## Other Notes:

- Earn certificate and award
- Fall and Spring semester grades of the prior year will be used to determine
- Will be honored the year following the year in which grades are earned
- Can qualify for all four years of high school

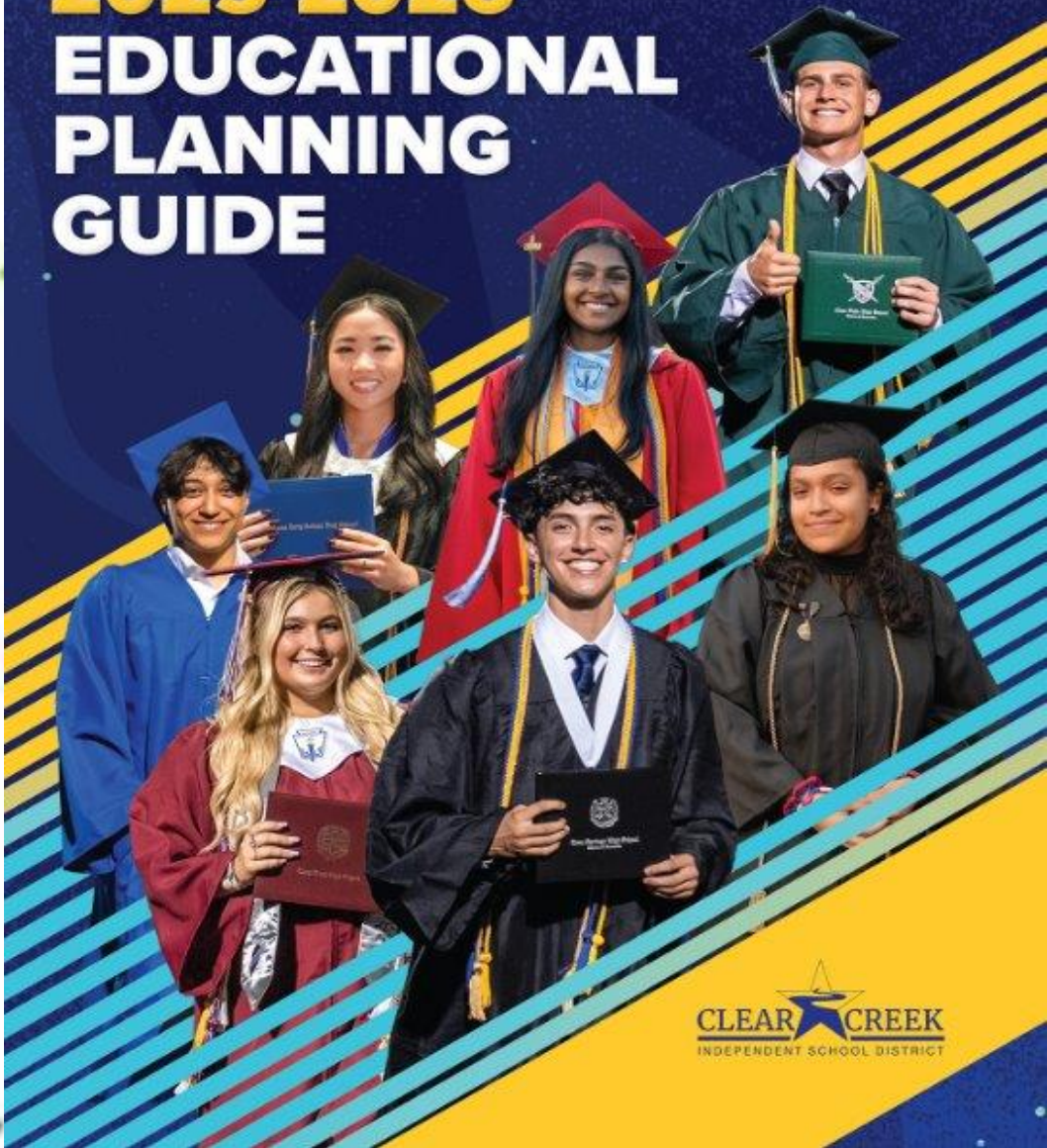
