**1. CALL TO ORDER**

Board of Directors Chair Drew Gottfried called the April 6, 2026 board meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance. Board members present were Stephen Hammond, John Oldham and Jennifer Woodland. Others present were Superintendent Jim Crist, Business Manager Sheri Longobardo, Special Education Director Whitney Connolly, Elementary School Principal Brenna Fairchild, Middle/High School Principal Chris Reiersgaard, Middle School Assistant Principal Caleb Salmond and Board Secretary Kimberly Silbernagel.

Chair Gottfried read the mission statement.

**2. CHANGES OR ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA**

4.1 Licensed Appreciation Resolution, May 4-8, 2026 (Resolution 2526.118)

5.2 Approve OSAA Cooperative Agreement Track and Field (Resolution 2526.120)

Superintendent Crist explained that this resolution will allow Lowell High School and Pleasant Hill High School to have a cooperative sponsorship for the 2026 track and field season. Lowell High School has a coach with necessary experience to train Pleasant Hill and Lowell athletes in the pole vault event and Pleasant Hill High School has an all-weather track and pole vault pit that Lowell athletes can use.

The district has asked the state for a grant amount of \$146,066. If the grant is approved the district would enter into a contract with Catapult Learning

not to exceed that amount. Pleasant Hill School District contracted with Catapult Learning for summer learning in 2025.

The recommended candidate is the result of a comprehensive and multi-step hiring process designed to ensure strong alignment with the district's instructional, athletic, and community priorities. The position was posted on March 2, 2026, with application review beginning March 16, followed by a screening process that included committee review, reference checks, and identification of finalists. Finalists participated in a structured interview process during the weeks of March 30 and April 6, including multiple stakeholder engagement components such as student panels, classroom observation, and a coaches/community panel.

Through this process, Mr. Patrick Jarman emerged as the leading candidate. Mr. Jarman brings approximately 17 years of experience in education, including service as a middle school principal, assistant principal, athletic director, and classroom teacher. His background reflects a strong emphasis on instructional leadership, student engagement, and building positive school culture, along with demonstrated success in improving attendance, implementing professional learning communities, and expanding student programs, including athletics and extracurricular opportunities. His experience, leadership approach, and demonstrated commitment to students and community align well with the needs and priorities of Pleasant Hill High School.
