

Remote Learning Inclement Weather Prep for Students and Parents

Davidson County Schools has a device assigned to every student, making remote learning an option when inclement weather makes it unsafe for students to travel to school. Davidson County Schools may offer remote learning options, when appropriate, during inclement weather, allowing students to continue learning remotely from the safety of their home. If a remote learning day is called, teachers will share additional requirements, so look for information from them via their established mode of communication: student email or classroom DOJO/Remind. Below are some steps to ensure that students and parents are prepared for success on remote learning inclement weather days.

	Set up a home workspace and schedule your day around schoolwork and breaks. Student work will be asynchronous/on their own during the remote days. Teachers will not provide Google Meets sessions to students. Students will be counted present based on work completion. Students will have up to 5 days to complete work.
	Teachers will share a message with instructions for the day by 8:30 a.m. via DOJO/Remind or student email. Students should check the designated online platform for the day's work and your teachers' expectations. All work would be expected to be turned in within 5 days in accordance with the late work policy. In the event of a hardship, teachers will work with families who may need extra time to complete. EC services not able to be provided remotely will be made up.
	If needed, students may request a video conference (Google Meet) session with their teacher. Teachers will share about opportunities for help sessions in their morning communications. Do not hesitate to reach out for support. A remote inclement weather day is a great time for a conference or check-in.
	Be sure to schedule in some time for brain breaks, enjoy lunch and have some fun.
