As we approach the end of the school year, please review the important dates and information below for all Underclassmen.

Keystone Exams and Make-Up Date

May 12, 13, and 14

Keystone Exams will be given on:

- Tuesday, May 12 – Literature
- Wednesday, May 13 – Biology
- Thursday, May 14 – Algebra I
- Friday, May 15 – Make-up date
 - THIS IS A NORMAL IN PERSON SCHOOL DAY FOR ALL STUDENTS

Students that are scheduled to test will receive a reminder card in the mail and homeroom, (this will be given a few days prior to testing).

Who Comes to School?

- Only students taking a Keystone Exam report to school at the normal time.
- Transportation will be provided for those students.

If Your Student Is NOT Taking a Keystone:

- They will work from home (asynchronous day).
- Work will be posted online.
