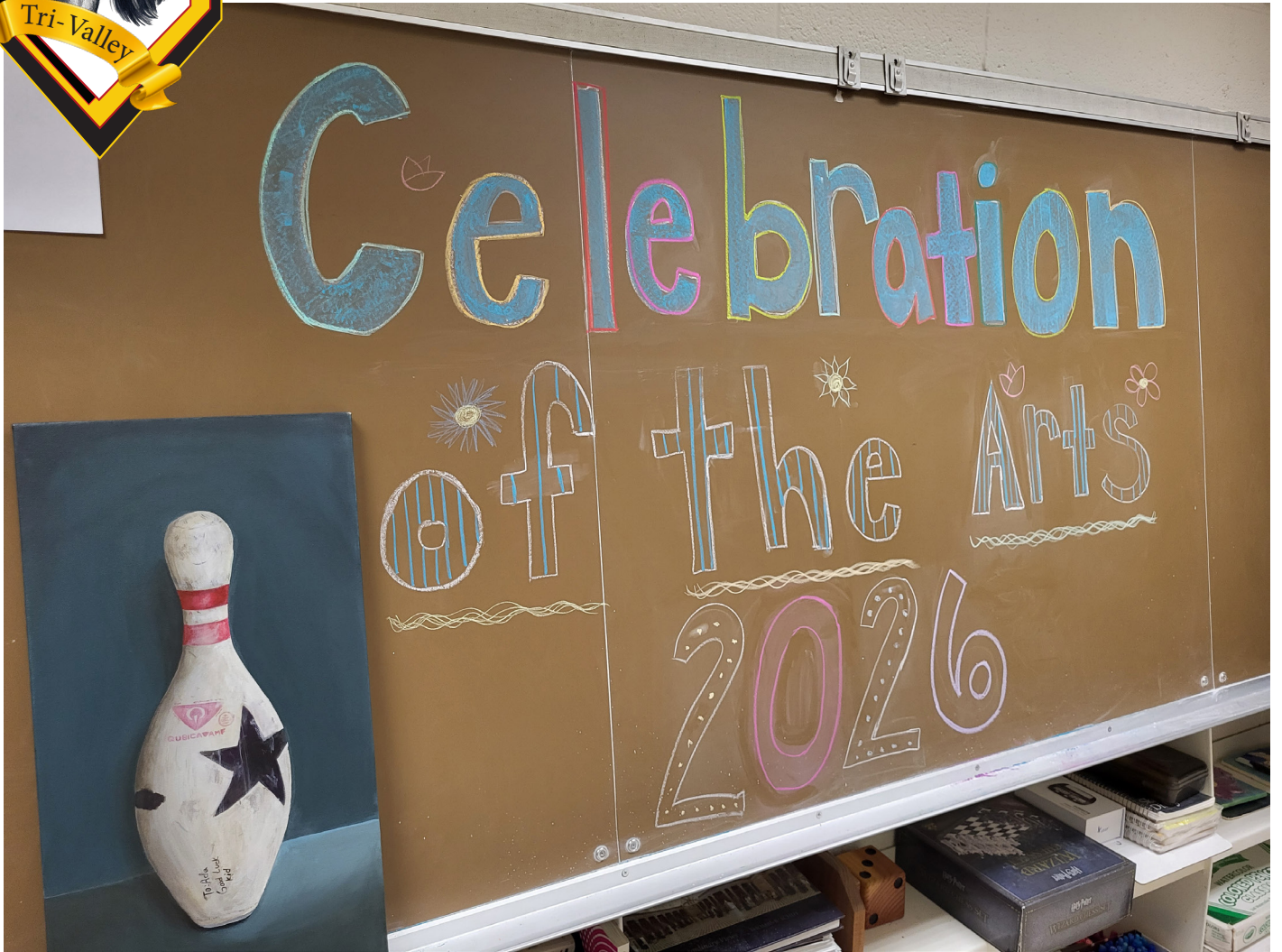

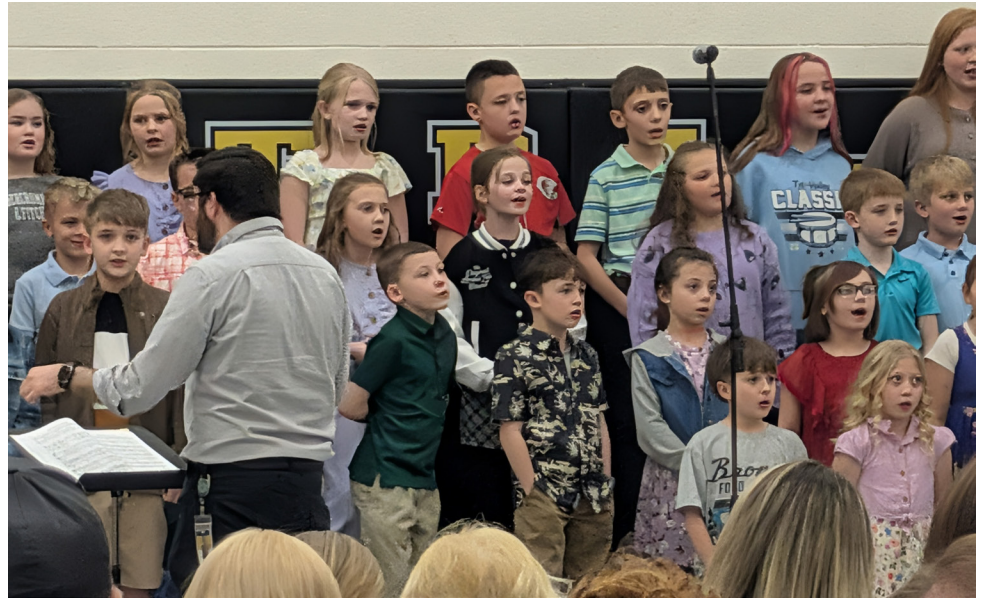
### Elementary Art:

All four Tri-Valley Elementary buildings displayed artwork created by 3rd, 5th and 6th grade students in the commons area and hallways. 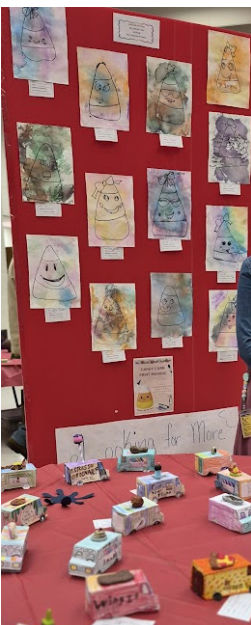
### High School & Middle School Art:

### Jazz Band

New to the Jazz Band this year is an increased focus on music theory aimed at helping students to truly improvise. The class has been dedicated to learning scalar and chordal music theory and how it may be used towards the betterment of their improvised solos. A good amount of time is spent in class playing jazz standards out of a book called *The Real Book* (a collection of jazz standards from many eras of jazz). These books contain a fraction of information when compared to their regular music. It only contains the lead line or melody, and symbols designating which chord should be played. There is no dynamics, articulation, drum music, piano music, bass lines, or accompiament otherwise. The students are enabled to decide who plays what, who solos when, and how to appropriately back up other musicians in their solos. The students have demonstrated this skill set at two concerts and are very excited to see where this progresses over the years.

### Immunizations Required for Incoming Kindergarten Students

- 5 doses **DTaP** vaccine
- 4 doses **Polio** vaccine
- 3 doses **Hepatitis B** vaccine
- 2 doses **MMR** vaccine
- 2 doses **Varicella/Chicken Pox** vaccine

### Immunizations Required for Incoming 7th Grade Students

If your child is currently up to date on all immunizations he/she will need 2 vaccinations prior to beginning 7th gr.

- 1 dose **Tdap** vaccine
- 1 dose **Meningococcal** vaccine

### Immunizations Required for Incoming 12th Grade Students

If your child is currently up-to-date on all immunizations, he/she will need a second dose of the **Meningococcal** Vaccine prior to beginning 12th Grade.

(Note: If the first dose of the Meningococcal Vaccine was administered after the child's 16th birthday, only one dose is required).

Please provide updated immunization records to the school immediately following the appointment. **DO NOT** wait until the beginning of the school year.

Students who have not presented proof of vaccination may be excluded from attending school.



## A Search for All Children with Disabilities

Every school district has the responsibility of seeking out and identifying children in need of special education services. Although school-age children are identified through each building's intervention assistance team and referral process, parents of children not yet enrolled, who reside within the Tri-Valley Local Schools boundaries, may not be aware that services are available.

### What does a disability mean:

For ages birth to 3: an established condition known to result in delay or a developmental delay.

For ages 3-5: a documented deficit in one or more of the following developmental areas:

- communication
- vision
- hearing
- motor skills
- self-help skills
- cognitive skills
- social/emotional/behavioral functioning

For ages 5-21: identification of one or more of the following conditions

- autism
- hearing impairment including deafness
- intellectual disability
- multiple disabilities
- orthopedic impairment
- other health impairment
- emotional disturbance
- specific learning disabilities
- speech or language impairment
- traumatic brain injury
- visual impairment including blindness
