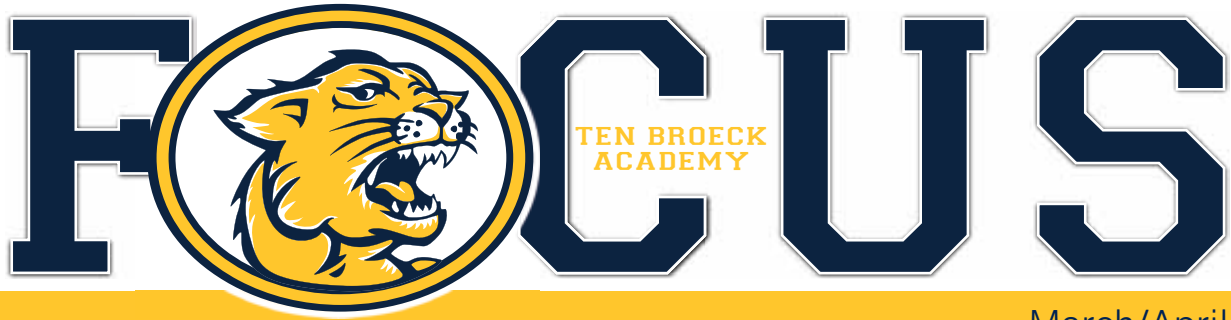

Franklinville FFA competes at District 10 Leadership Development Events Hosted by Sherman FFA

Nineteen members of Franklinville FFA traveled with their advisor, Mrs. Mitrowski, to Sherman Central School to compete in a wide variety of speaking contests at the District X Leadership Development Events on Saturday, Jan. 31. This was Franklinville's first widely-attended competition of the year. FFA members competed in Junior People In Ag, Employment Skills, Senior Prepared Speaking, Senior Extemporaneous Speaking, Conduct of Chapter Meeting and Parliamentary Procedure.

In the competition for Conduct of Chapter Meeting, the team received second place. The Parliamentary Procedure team placed first, and both teams will be advancing to the substate level at Alfred State on March

14. For Junior People In Ag, two students presented the research they have completed in Agricultural Careers, and Clayton Lathrop will be advancing to substates. In Senior Extemporaneous Speaking, students randomly selected a topic, preparing their 4-6 minute speech in a 30-minute time frame, and then presented that speech to a group of judges. Kierra Knobloch placed second and will be advancing to substates.

The team that competed in Employment Skills, which included preparing a job description, cover letter, resume, and job application ahead of time, completing an interview at the contest with a panel of three judges, and then drafting a thank you/follow-up letter at the conclusion of

the interview. This has been a valuable experience for team members and will better prepare them for their future. Lilly Owens was the only member competing in Senior Prepared Speaking with her speech on sustainability and meeting consumer demands within the agricultural industry.

Mitrowski shared some comments following the competition, "Congratulations to all of our competitors today. You positively represented our FFA chapter and you should be proud of taking that 'first step' in your leadership journey. For many of our FFA members, this was their very first speaking competition and their initial introduction to opportunities within the FFA organization."

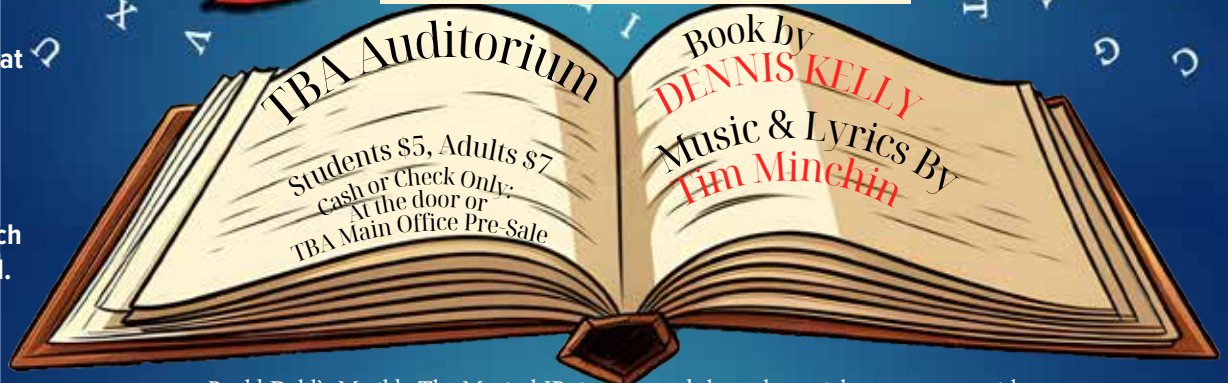

There is one (1) seat up for election. This is a full five-year term commencing July 1, 2026, expiring on June 30, 2031, and to succeed William Weigel, whose term expires on June 30, 2026.

Qualifications of a School Board Member:

- ▶ Must be able to read and write
- ▶ Must be a qualified voter of the District
- ▶ Qualified Voters Must:
 - Be a citizen of the United States
 - Be at least 18 years of age or older

- ▶ Must be and have been a resident of the District (but need not be a taxpayer) for a continuous and uninterrupted period of at least one (1) year immediately before the election
- ▶ May not have been removed from any school district office within the preceding year
- ▶ May not reside with another member of the same school board as a member of the same family
- ▶ May not be a current employee of the school board
- ▶ May not simultaneously hold another incompatible public office

- ▶ April 1, 2026 – Publication of Legal Notice for Budget Hearing, Vote, and Election
 - Subsequent publications on April 15, 29, and May 13.

- ▶ April 21, 2026 – Board of Education ballot position selection at 9:00 a.m.
- ▶ May 5-19, 2026 – Budget newsletters available to residents upon request

 - Budget hearing at 5:30 p.m.
 - Absentee Ballot applications due, if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter
- ▶ May 13, 2026
 - ▶ Budget Notice mailed to district residents
- ▶ May 14, 2026 - Early Mail ballot applications due, if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter

Letter of intent should be addressed to the organization. They will select the winner. INDOOR TRACK AND FIELD TEAM

The team has shown remarkable improvement this indoor season, and it has been incredible to witness their growth in various events. Baylee Green has emerged as our top weight thrower, having improved by over 2 feet since the beginning of the year. Rylie Pilarski has also made significant strides, increasing her distance by more than 5 feet in the same event. Alexis Keller has also done great in the shot put and weight throw improving each meet.

In shot put, Mya Sullivan has qualified and met the standard for sectionals, while

also improving her time in the 55-meter dash. Genevieve Herman has proven to be very versatile in the running events, serving as our leading runner in the 300-meter, 600-meter, 1500-meter, and 1000-meter events. Additionally, she leads the 4x200-meter relay team, which has also qualified for sectionals, alongside teammates Trinity Herman, Mya Sullivan, Grace Chapman, and Peyton Blue.

Nora Reynolds has made impressive progress in pole vault, improving four feet, and she has also performed well in the 600-meter event. Peyton Blue is close

to qualifying for sectionals in the high jump and has also excelled in the hurdles. Grace Chapman contributes to our team by competing in the high jump, 300-meter, and 600-meter events. Trinity is our fastest 300-meter runner and has done well for our team as well as competing in the pole vault. Mia Duclon is our long jumper and also has made improvements in her event.

WRESTLING

The 2025-2026 Franklinville wrestling team began its first year of a new direction with a merger with Hinsdale, West Valley, and Ellicottville, a new coaching staff, a new location for home duals, and some new faces on the varsity team that made significant contributions. Participants for our boys team this year included Ayce Caswell, Dakota Tidd, Ericson Banas, Derek Ossont, Gunner Jochen, Evan Nesbit, Luciano Varno, Christian Sexton, Brayden Clayson, Brenden MacWilliams, Dakota Smith, and Maverick Jennings. Selena Hernandez, Hannah Deppa, Nola Buchanan, and Bailynn Dewitt were also on our mixed dual meet roster.

The team's dual meet record was 1-7, but the group made great improvements as individual wrestlers. Ayce Caswell and Evan Nesbit had exceptional individual seasons, taking home a St. Joes JV Tournament 1st place finish and placing top 4 in four other season tournaments. Dakota Smith had a strong rookie season, taking 2nd in the Franklinville Varsity Tournament, winning the St. Joes JV Tournament and taking 4th in the Rich

Morton (Salamanca) Tournament. Dakota T, Ericson, Derek, Brayden, and Maverick all came away with at least one place finish throughout the season as well.

Leaders of the team included senior Christian Sexton and junior Brenden MacWilliams, both were named team captains and had strong individual seasons themselves. Brenden took 2nd at Rich Morton, 3rd at Franklinville, and 5th at Avoca. Christian took 4th at Franklinville. Ayce, Evan, Christian, Brenden, Dakota S, and Maverick will go on to compete at the section 6 championships and individual state qualifiers on February 14th and 15th at SUNY Fredonia. I am grateful for each of the team participants this year for their dedication and look forward to growing with the team going into next season.

The Franklinville Girls' Varsity Wrestling team this year wrestled a full schedule and pioneered the first Franklinville Girls Wrestling Tournament (January 10th). The girls made contributions to our mixed dual meet lineup with the boys this year and wrestled a separate girls'

schedule. Participants this year included Bailynn Dewitt, Nola Buchanan, Selena Hernandez, and senior Hannah Deppa. Nola had a strong rookie season, winning multiple matches despite being a first-year wrestler. Bailynn made strong growth as an individual wrestler throughout the season.

Team captains Hannah Deppa and Selena Hernandez had strong seasons. Hannah took 3rd at the Franklinville Girls Tournament, and 6th at the Eden Tournament. Selena Hernandez took top 6 at the Linda Knuutilla Memorial Tournament, an especially tough tournament with roughly 30 teams, 4th at Franklinville, 3rd at the 1st Dorthy Palma Memorial (Hornell Invitational) and second at Gowanda. Selena also spent 7 weeks (weeks 2-present) and an honorable mention in the WNY Girls High School Individual Rankings. The girls will be competing in the post season at the second annual section 6 girls state qualifier on February 12th and 15th at Sweet Home High School (12th) and SUNY Fredonia(15th).
