Together, we've accomplished so much in just a few short months:


- Received a **\$125,000 4-year commitment from an Archbishop Wood Graduate**

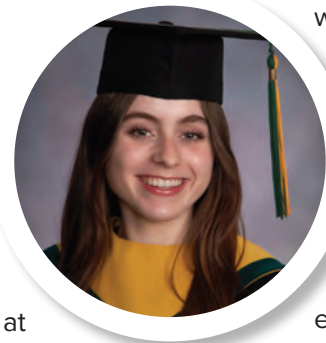
2025 GRADUATE SPOTLIGHT

Ambassador's Fund Grant Awarded to Wood!



We are thrilled to announce that Archbishop Wood has received a \$75,000 grant from the Ambassadors Fund for Catholic Education in support of our robotics program!

Archbishop Wood's RoboVikings, otherwise known as FIRST Robotics Competition ("FRC") 2607, is a group of dedicated students passionate about science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM). The team competes annually in regional and worldwide competitions, where they build robots to solve complex engineering challenges. The awarded grant funds support essential robotics lab equipment aiding in the RoboVikings' efforts to recruit additional membership, increase community outreach opportunities, and provide career-building courses for 9th-12th grade students at Archbishop Wood High School.

"Thanks to the Ambassador's Fund, we are able to expand the Robotics Program to include two FIRST Tech Challenge teams for 7th and 8th graders. These teams will allow kids to begin building skills and interest in engineering and allow students from our team to mentor them and build valuable leadership skills. It will also allow us to invest further into our own team, from our robot's performance on the field to our team's impact within our community."

At Archbishop Wood, STEM isn't just about science and technology—it's about preparing students to lead with purpose. This grant strengthens our ability to cultivate curiosity, inspire innovation, and equip our students with the skills to lead in college, career, and life.

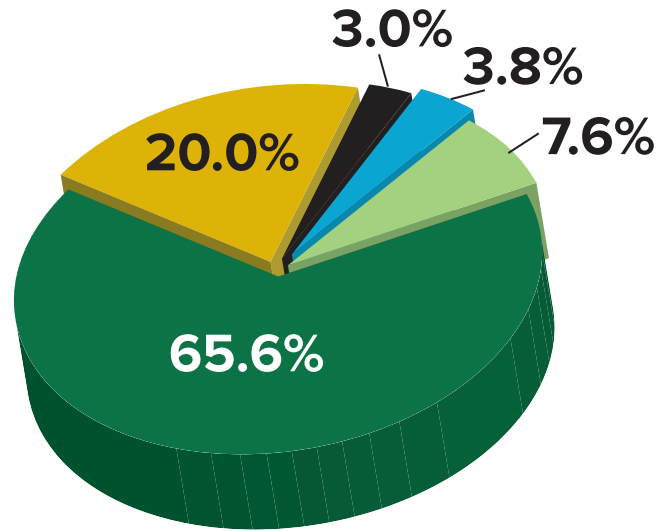

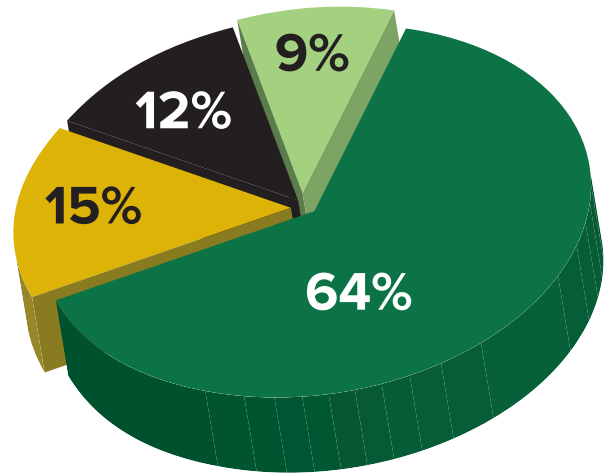

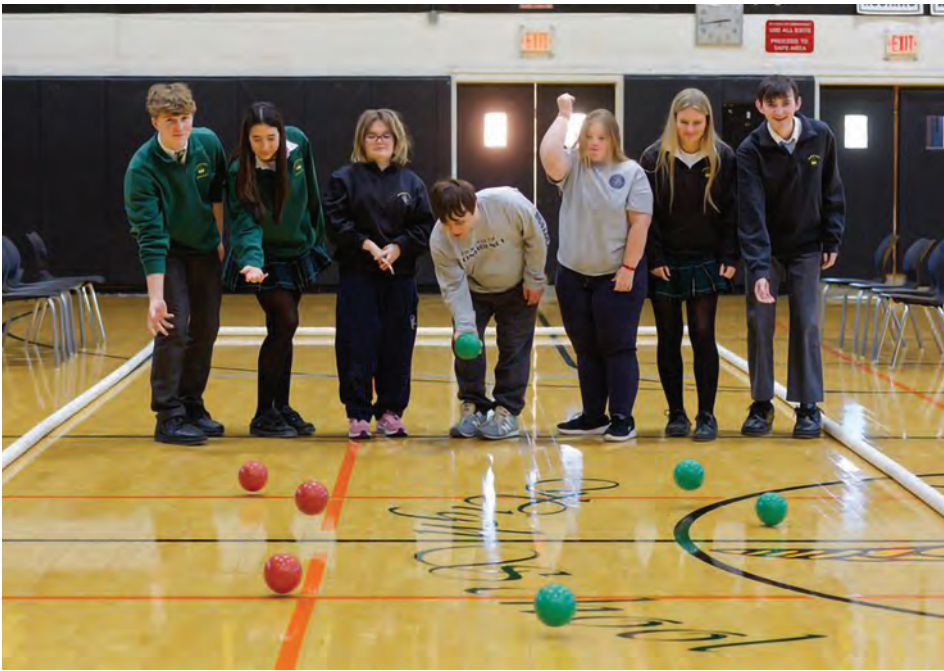

2025 Hall of Fame



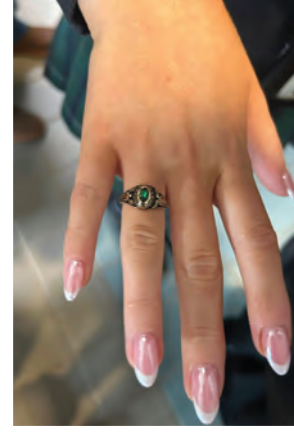

Archbishop Wood Welcomes Our New Patron Saint - Carlo Acutis

For over 60 years, Archbishop Wood High School has formed young men and women in faith, service, and leadership. Now, for the first time in our history, we have a patron saint to guide us—Saint Carlo Acutis, canonized in September 2025 as the first millennial saint.

The idea came from our Campus Minister, Deacon Steve Guckin, who has long had a devotion to Carlo. With the support of President Gray Zimmario and Principal Dr. Katherine Nobles, he petitioned Archbishop Nelson J. Pérez to place Archbishop Wood under Carlo’s patronage. The request was granted on January 15, 2025.

Carlo Acutis was born in 1991, loved soccer, video games, and programming, and used his tech skills to create a website cataloging Eucharistic miracles worldwide. His life was marked by a deep devotion to the Eucharist and the Blessed Mother, daily Mass, and a joyful faith that drew others to Christ. Carlo died of leukemia at age 15, leaving behind an inspiring legacy of holiness in everyday life.

Saint Carlo once said, “The Eucharist is my highway to heaven.” May his example inspire our students, alumni, and community to live with that same joy and faith.

As we entrust our students, faculty, and entire community to the patronage of Blessed Carlo Acutis—a modern, joyful witness to Eucharistic love and digital evangelization—we are reminded of the power of holiness in the everyday. Carlo’s life challenges us to use our gifts, especially in the digital world, to draw others to Christ.

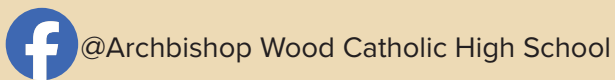


STUDENTS HELPING SENIORS

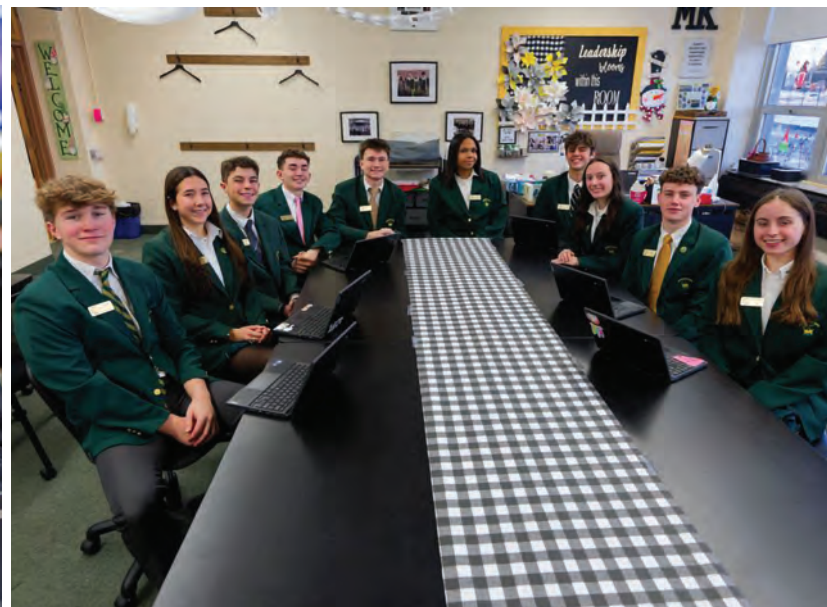
