

**Counseling and Student Support Services Program**

The School District provides a Counseling and Student Support Services (CSSS) program for students. The Superintendent or designee shall direct the District's CSSS program. School counseling services, as described by State law, may be performed by school counselors or licensed educators with a school support personnel endorsement in the area of school counseling.

The CSSS program will assist students to identify career options consistent with their abilities, interests, and personal values. Students shall be encouraged to seek the help of CSSS staff to develop specific curriculum goals that conform to the student's career objectives. High school juniors and seniors will have the opportunity to receive career-oriented information. Representatives from colleges and universities, occupational training institutions and career-oriented recruiters, including the military, may be given access to the school campus in order to provide students and parents/guardians with information.
