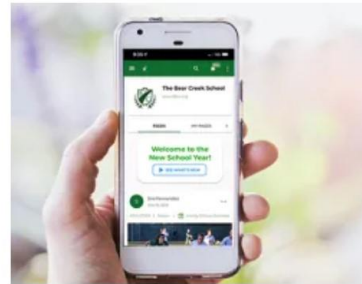

# Immunization Requirement

The Bear Creek School is required by State law to ensure all students are compliant with current immunization requirements or have an appropriate exemption. On or before the first day of attendance, **all new students** and all returning preschool, kindergarten, and grade 7 students must **upload medically verified immunization records to the health portal** by the summer deadline. Children cannot attend school until these records are provided.

*New parents will receive instructions for submitting immunization records in the health portal with Back-to-School Registration on July 7. We cannot accept any forms that have been mailed, emailed, or dropped off.*

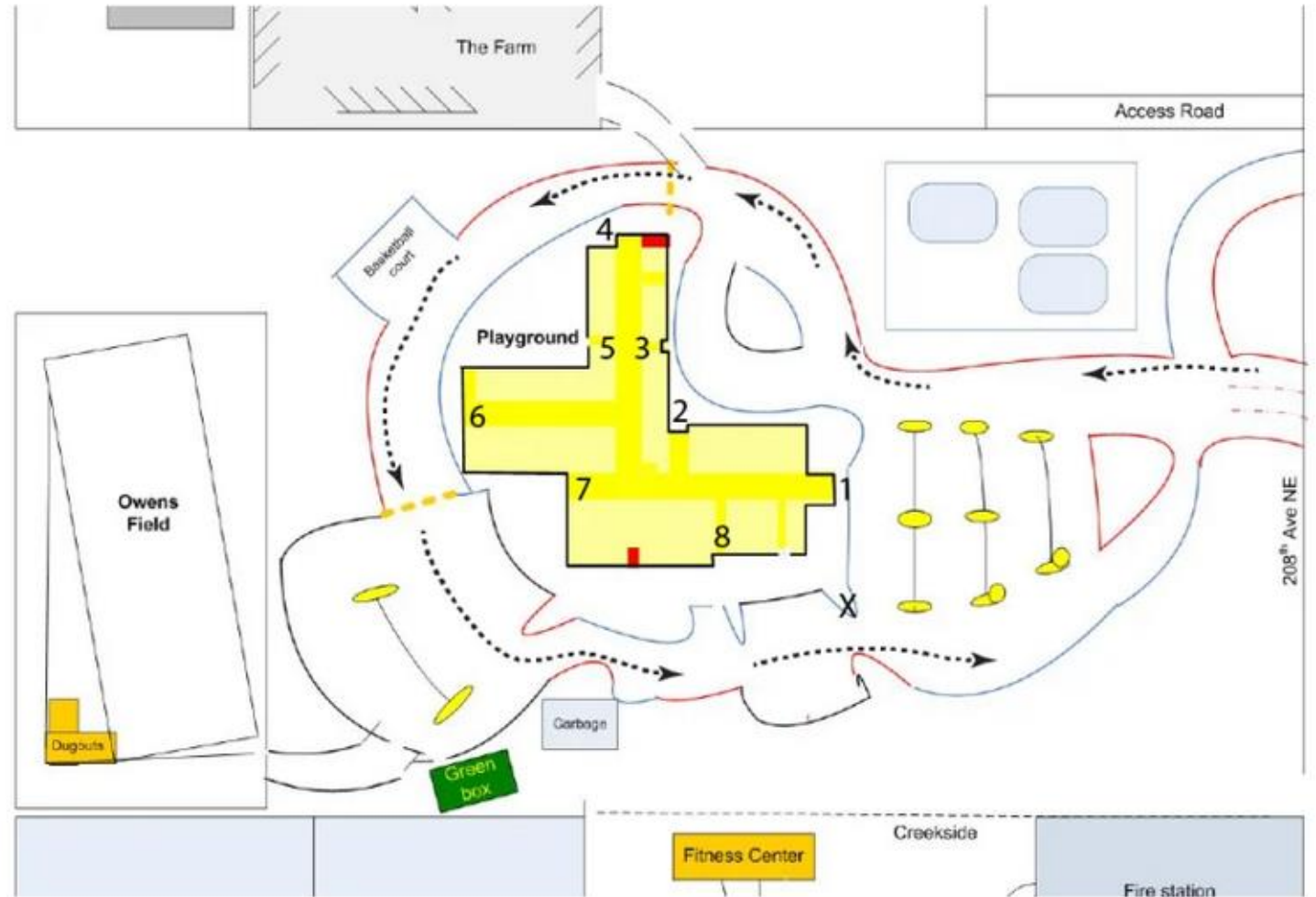

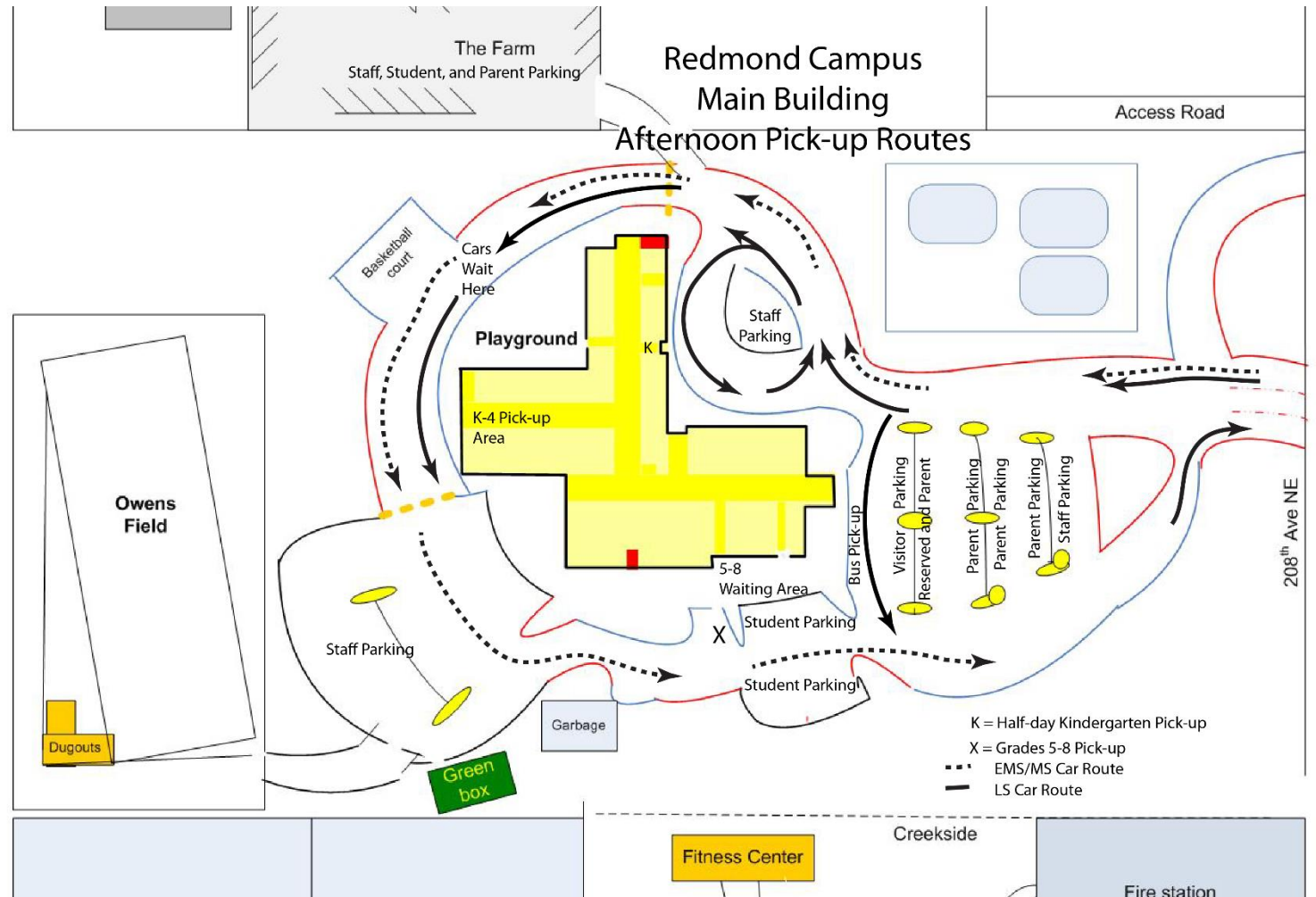
