### **Important Deadlines for Tuition Affordability Assistance**

#### Education Freedom Accounts for 2026/27: Deadline June 1

The application window for Education Freedom Accounts (Tuition Vouchers) for the 2026/27 school year will remain open only through June 1, 2026. The Department of Education is encouraging families to complete the renewal process as soon as possible to help ensure their place in the program for the upcoming school year.

Students that participated this year and want to renew their application to participate next year must complete this process through their ClassWallet account. Students that are new to the program will complete their application at <http://arkansasefa.com>.

#### ACE Scholarships: Deadline April 15

ACE Scholarships is a privately funded program that can provide partial scholarships to attend private school and is based on a family's financial situation. Family household income may not exceed 350% of the federal poverty level for a household of their size. Standard ACE award amounts are \$3,000 for grades K-8 and \$4,000 for grades 9 – 12.

For more information, and to submit an ACE Scholarship application, go to ACE Scholarships - Arkansas. Applications will be accepted only through April 15.

#### Episcopal Collegiate School Financial Aid

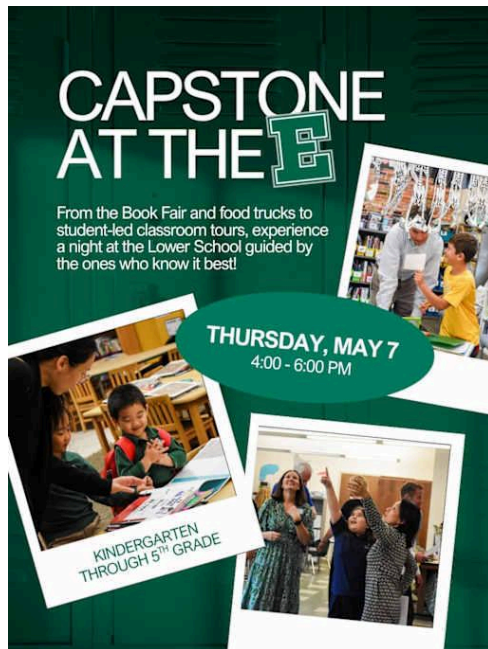

### 7th Grade Vaccine Reminder

This is a reminder that when kids enter 7th grade they are required to have a meningococcal vaccine (Usually called Menactra, MENVEO, or MemACYW). Most students get both meningococcal and Tdap vaccines when they turn 11. If you are unsure if your kids had the vaccine, reach out to their pediatrician or Nurse Hopkins to see if they are up to date.



### Reminder: Procedure for Obtaining an Excused Absence

If your child has to miss a full day of school or more, their adults need to email Dr. McCormick requesting the given time off and do so at least one week in advance. After this has been approved, the student will collect a Planned Absence Form from the Middle School Office, take it around to their teachers whose classes they will be missing for their signatures, and then bring it back to the Middle School office for Dr. McCormick's signature. They will also be given a copy to take with them.

### SWEET 16 - Check-up and Vaccine Requirement Reminder [Written by Nurse Lenna]

This is a reminder, that as your kids are turning 16 years old, don't forget to make their 16 y/o check-up with their pediatrician. At this visit they will get their second meningococcal (booster) dose that is required for students who are 16 years of age or older on or after September 1, 2025. This meningococcal vaccine goes by names like: Menactra, MENVEO, or MemACYW.

- Widespread Adoption: Over 90% of schools using digital ticketing in Arkansas currently use GoFan, making it easier for families to use one platform for both home and away games.
- Consistency with AAA: The Arkansas Activities Association (AAA) utilizes GoFan for all postseason events, so aligning with this system creates a consistent experience throughout the season and into playoffs
