## Mission

The mission of Elementary DAEP is to coach students in social-emotional skills, promote positive behavior choices, reduce barriers to academic success, and support a successful transition back to the home campus.



## **Program Description**

Crossroads is a supervised off-campus educational program providing structured learning with assignments provided by the home campus. Students attend Crossroads to learn and practice appropriate behavior choices while meeting academic expectations. Students assigned to Crossroads may not be on other district properties during school hours. Transportation is not provided and must be arranged by the parent/guardian.

## **Responsibilities**

### **Parents**

- View the 10-minute Intake Meeting/Orientation with their child.
- Complete all online consent forms.
- Optional: Schedule a face-to-face meeting with the DAEP Administrator.

### **Home Campus**

- Follow district procedures for assignment.
- Send all academic work to Crossroads.

### **Students**

- Complete all assigned academic work.
- Follow all district and Crossroads rules and expectations.
- Participate in daily search/seizure/surveillance procedures for safety.

### **Crossroads Teacher**

- Support students in behavior skill development and positive social interactions.
- Monitor academic progress and quality.

## **Dress Code Requirements**

Students must follow all HEB ISD dress code guidelines along with Crossroads/DAEP-specific expectations. Students out of compliance may not attend class until corrected.

### **Key Dress Code Expectations**

- Clothing must be free of inappropriate images, wording, or symbols.
- Shirts must have sleeves and remain tucked in at all times.
- No hats, hoods, caps, bandanas, or headgear.
- Pants/shorts must be worn at the natural waist; no tears or layered bottoms.
- Closed-toe athletic shoes only; no crocs, boots, sandals, flip-flops, or wheels.
- No jewelry of any kind. Items will be returned to a parent/guardian only.
- No backpacks allowed.
- No personal electronic devices. Cell phones are collected at check-in daily.
- Items deemed unsafe, disruptive, or inappropriate by administration are prohibited.
