H. STAFF REPORT

There were no staff reports.

I. BOARD MEMBER REPORTS

Mr. John Croisant praised the BTW and Edison girls' basketball teams and the boys' basketball teams going to State. He also acknowledged the boys' soccer teams for their wins as well. BTW over Sand Springs and Edison finishing 3rd.

Ms. Woolley shared that it is currently fundraising season and invited families and community members who wish to support Tulsa Public Schools to attend and participate. She also noted that voter registration closes on March 13 and encouraged young voters, as well as all eligible voters, to ensure they are registered. She emphasized that there will be an opportunity to vote for Board of Education candidates in Districts 4 and 7, as well as on bond propositions.

Ms. Ashley shared that the board meetings are to bring forward questions and information in the meeting, so that members of the audience can hear and understand. She shared that she has been knocking on hundreds of doors talking with parents and the community.

Ms. Lamkin shared that she had the privilege of joining Dr. Johnson on a School Bus Tour in west Tulsa to the community in their neighborhoods to share information about the District and the 2026 Bond proposal. She also shared that the goal is to visit all of the Board Districts over the next few weeks.

Ms. Kyra Carby shared that many positive developments are taking place across Tulsa Public Schools, from athletics to a variety of extracurricular activities. She also noted that she participated in surprise visits recognizing the District's Support Staff finalists. Ms. Carby encouraged members of the public to get involved by supporting the District through donations, volunteering, or participation in the Tulsa Ambassador program. In closing, she requested that more of the District's bright spots—such as the academic progress being made across schools—be highlighted during Board meetings so that the community can see and celebrate these achievements.
