FACILITY PROJECTS

GRANT ELEMENTARY

Construction began this past September 2025 and will continue through the Fall of 2026. Grant School has been undergoing significant upgrades to building infrastructure and student spaces. These improvements will help foster more engaging, collaborative, and student-centered learning environments.

Over the summer crews will continue the construction of the building storage addition and the new main office, designed to provide a more secure visitor screening and better access control procedures, aligning with best practices for school safety. Additional summer projects will include, finishing the remaining classroom renovations, kitchen expansion and remodel project, library renovations, exterior excavating for new parking lots and installation of new HVAC units.

HIGH SCHOOL

Marshfield High School's design phase was completed in November and construction is beginning this Spring, set to wrap up by Fall of 2028. Main projects will include additions and renovations to key areas including: entry and main office, classrooms, commons/kitchen, wrestling/pool, roof, receiving and loading dock, as well as needed updates to mechanical and fire safety systems.

HIGH SCHOOL SUMMER PROJECTS:

- Site utility relocations to support new areas
- Sitework and excavation
- Interior remodels of the existing tech ed, agriculture, and special education rooms
- New additions to agriculture, metals, and woods area
- New greenhouse
- Boiler plant renovations and mechanical work
- Fire protection projects throughout building
