From the Principal:

Currently, Crestwood High School has 76 Juniors and Seniors enrolled in Dual-Enrollment courses at Central Carolina Technical College, as well as 38 Juniors and Seniors enrolled in the Early College Program at USC Sumter and 11 enrolled in Advanced Placement for U.S. History.

Listed below are just a few of the many points of pride for our school. Any success that Crestwood High School has achieved could not have been accomplished without the support of our stakeholders, and we sincerely thank you all for your continued investment in our children and community.

- Over \$6 million in scholarships were awarded in the past five years.
- GEAR UP is a six to seven year grant program designed to increase the number of low-income students who are prepared to enter and succeed in postsecondary education. GEAR UP funds are used to provide college scholarships to low-income students. This program helps to close achievement gaps and to become another resource to schools as support for students to succeed academically, socially, and emotionally. Crestwood High School GEAR UP has exposed our students to over 30 colleges to promote post secondary education. GEAR UP offers scholarship workshops, parent workshops, financial aid workshops, college and career fairs, professional development for teachers, ACT/SAT preparation, and free tutoring for all GEAR UP students.
