Dear Parent/Guardian,

Just as student report cards provide parents with information on their child's performance, the NC School Report Cards offer a snapshot of some of the important information about individual schools. The State Board of Education and Superintendent Mo Green are committed to ensuring that North Carolina's schools are preparing students for the demands of college and skilled work in the 21st Century.

The School and District Report Cards are divided into five areas: 2024-2025 School Performance Grade and Overall Performance; Student Performance; Teachers and Qualifications; School Environment; and Strategic Planning. Report Cards are provided for all public, charter, and alternative schools operating during the 2024-25 school year.

In most instances, data in the School Report Card is reported at the school, district and state levels. School data is based on information from all grades within the school. Parents and community members should note that the information in the School Report Card, while important, cannot tell you the entire story about the school. Other important factors that should be taken into consideration are the extra hours put in by teachers preparing for class and grading assignments, the school culture felt by families, the involvement in sports, arts, or other extracurricular programs which are all crucial aspects of a school community, but are not reflected on the School Report Card.

The North Carolina Department of Public Instruction has launched a completely redesigned website that provides the transparency parents need into the characteristics and performance of the school in an easy to use format, to better inform you.
