

# 2025 GOSA Single State Accountability System Awards Internal Analysis



## Overview of Single State Accountability System Awards

In accordance with O.C.G.A. §20-14-37 and State Board Rule 160-7-1-.01, the Governor’s Office of Student Achievement (GOSA) recognizes schools demonstrating exceptional academic performance and growth through the Single Statewide Accountability System (SSAS). For the 2025 SSAS awards, College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) data from the three most recent school years (2022–23, 2023–24, and 2024–25) were used to identify award recipients in two categories: **Greatest Gains** and **Highest Performing**. Each category includes **four recognition tiers**: Platinum, Gold, Silver, and Bronze.

### Greatest Gains Overview

Greatest Gains schools demonstrate strong growth in student achievement by earning a three-year average CCRPI Progress Score at or above the 93<sup>rd</sup> percentile statewide. Eligibility is based on sustained growth over time and excludes schools identified on the Georgia Promise Scholarship Public School List or the Georgia Department of Education Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) or Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) lists. Award tiers and detailed criteria are outlined in Table 1.

### Highest Performing Overview

Highest Performing schools exhibit high academic performance by earning a three-year average CCRPI Content Mastery Score in at least the 93<sup>rd</sup> percentile. Recognition reflects consistently high levels of Content Mastery and Closing Gaps, with eligibility limited to schools not identified on the Georgia Promise Scholarship Public School List or the Georgia Department of Education CSI or TSI lists. Award tiers and detailed criteria are outlined in Table 2.

# FCS 2025 SSAS Awards

Fulton County Schools earned the highest number of SSAS awards statewide across both categories. In total, **39 Fulton County schools** received recognition for Greatest Gains and/or Highest Performing. Of these, five schools earned Greatest Gains awards only, 15 earned Highest Performing awards only, and **19 earned recognitions in both categories**.

## FCS 2025 Greatest Gains Awards

In 2025, Fulton County Schools received **24 Greatest Gains awards**, representing an increase of four schools compared to the 2024 SSAS results. Of the awarded schools, **eight earned Platinum** recognition, two more than the previous year, while **seven received Gold**, **seven received Silver** (an increase of four from 2024), and **two received Bronze**.

Five schools that earned Platinum recognition in 2024 maintained their status in 2025: Creek View ES, E.C. West ES, Northview HS, Webb Bridge MS, and Wilson Creek ES. Lake Windward ES advanced from Gold in 2024 to Platinum in 2025. Chattahoochee HS, Findley Oaks ES, Mountain Park ES, and River Trail MS earned Gold recognition for the second consecutive year.

Notably, Shakerag ES improved from Silver in 2024 to Gold in 2025, while Cogburn Woods ES and Dolvin ES advanced from Bronze to Silver over the same period.

## Highest Performing Overview

In 2025, Fulton County Schools received **34 Highest Performing awards**, reflecting an increase of six schools compared to the 2024 SSAS results. Of the awarded schools, **10 earned Platinum recognition**, representing an increase of seven from the prior year. **Fourteen schools received Gold**, an increase of three from 2024, **six received Silver**, and **four received Bronze**, an increase of one from the previous year.

Lake Windward ES and Webb Bridge MS maintained Platinum recognition for the second consecutive year. Four schools advanced from Gold to Platinum in 2025: Barnwell ES, Creek View ES, Heard's Ferry ES, and Wilson Creek ES.

Six schools maintained Gold status for a second year: Birmingham Falls ES, Chattahoochee HS, Dolvin ES, Mountain Park ES, River Trail MS, and State Bridge Crossing ES. Additionally, Alpharetta ES, Cogburn Woods ES, Johns Creek HS, Medlock Bridge ES, New Prospect ES, and Ocee ES advanced from Silver in 2024 to Gold in 2025. Cambridge HS and Spalding Drive ES remained at the Bronze tier for the second consecutive year. Roswell North ES advanced from Bronze to Silver in 2025.
