5514 STUDENT USE OF VEHICLES ON SCHOOL GROUNDS

The safety of students, staff members, school visitors, and others while on school grounds is of significant importance to the Board of Education. A student's use of a vehicle and/or other modes of transportation on school grounds has the potential to present a safety hazard for the student operator and to other students, staff members, school visitors and others while on school grounds.

Students are permitted to drive their automobile to and from school and park in the area designated for student parking.

The student must enter into a lottery to receive a parking spot and register their automobile with the Principal or designee who will provide the student with school rules for driving and parking on school grounds. The school's rules may require a permit that must be affixed on a window or be clearly visible from outside the automobile when the automobile is parked on school grounds.

Students are permitted to ride bicycles to the schools in the school district.

The definition and use of electric bicycles (E-bikes) shall be in accordance with New Jersey Public Law 2025, c.285 and any other applicable laws or local ordinances.

- E-Bike Definitions
 - A low-speed electric bicycle (e-bike) is a two-wheeled bicycle with pedals where the motor assists only while pedaling and ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 20 miles per hour.
 - A motorized bicycle (moped) is a pedal bicycle that is throttle-capable of assisted speeds up to 28 miles per hour.
- E-bike Requirements
 - Minimum age - 15 years old.
 - Possess a valid driver license or e-bike license or e-bike permit.
 - E-bikes must be registered and insured.
 - A helmet is mandatory for all e-bike riders, regardless of age.

Students are not permitted to bring motorized or non-motorized skateboards, scooters, roller skates, or any other motorized or non-motorized mode of transportation on school grounds during the school day.

The Principal of each school building may revoke the privilege of a student's use of any vehicle or mode of transportation permitted by this Policy for the student's failure to

follow the provisions of this Policy and any requirements of State or local law or any school rule. The Board of Education assumes no responsibility for the loss, damage, or theft of any vehicle or any mode of transportation permitted on school grounds in accordance with this Policy.
