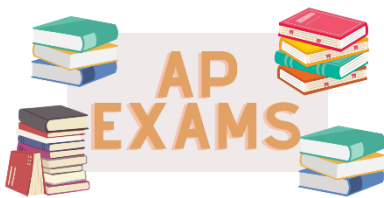

EOC Testing Schedule April 27th - May 1st

****On the day(s) a student is NOT scheduled for EOC testing, the parent(s) may choose one of the following options:**

1. Students can attend the full day of school and participate in a supervised study hall in the cafeteria during the morning testing window.
2. Students can study from home during the morning testing window and report to school at the time listed on the bell schedule. Students will not be marked absent from classes during the 8:20 am – 11:50 am time frame.
3. Once testing is concluded each morning, students will report to their advisement classroom until the regular schedule begins.
4. Each day, the "regular" schedule will begin at 11:50 am.
5. During the testing window (8:20 am to 11:50 am) the only students who will be marked absent are students who are not present for their End of Course Assessment.

NOTE: The parent must provide transportation to school for their child if they choose option #2 as buses will only be running their regular scheduled routes.



Attention students taking an AP exam:

You MUST know your College Board login and password before you take an AP exam. On test day, you will not be able to use your phone to access your login for any reason, so make sure you check and are able to login with your College Board account before test day.

If you cannot login, you will not be allowed to test, and you will not be scheduled for a late test.

If you are having any issues logging in, you will need to call College Board, because the school cannot help you get logged into College Board. **See Dr. Bounds if you have any questions.**

Fulton County Applications for the 2026-2027 Youth Commission Now Open
 Fulton County is looking for youth interested in serving in leadership roles. The 2026-2027 application process for the Fulton County Youth Commission is now underway.

The Department of Community Development is seeking high school students in grades 9 - 11 to participate in the program for the 2026-2027 academic year. The application deadline is 5:30 p.m. on Friday, May 22, 2026.

The Fulton County Youth Commission (FCYC) is a leadership program for outstanding high school students in Fulton County, Georgia, whose primary purpose is to advocate for children and youth issues. FCYC encourages tomorrow’s leaders to get involved today. FCYC leaders receive ongoing opportunities to address the many issues presently facing youth.

Youth Commissioners volunteer as many as 20 hours per month for planning meetings and community projects and over 120 hours annually. FCYC strengthens the participant’s leadership skills, increases interest in human services, and creates a means for communication between community leaders and youth in Fulton County. Responsibilities of the 31 Youth Commissioners include volunteer projects, serving as liaisons to youth, and helping local government understand the issues that impact young people.

For consideration, students:

- **Must be a resident of Fulton County**
- **Must attend a school within Fulton County (Public, Private, and Charter)**
- **Must be in the 9th -11th grade during the 2026-2027 academic year**
- **Must submit a completed application and a two-page essay**
