Board Approves English Language Arts Curriculum and Student Transportation Services

English Language Arts Adoption and Purchase

Dr. Cole Amaya, assistant superintendent of teaching and learning, presented a recommendation for purchase of Amplify CKLA (grades K-5) and Amplify ELA (grades 6-8). These high-quality instructional materials will provide a vertically aligned, and research-based literacy system to build a strong foundation in decoding, fluency, vocabulary, background knowledge, and comprehension through systematic and explicit instruction.

The structured literacy adoption represents a cohesive approach across grade levels, strengthens instructional practices, and supports improved literacy outcomes for all students. Official field testing of both selected resources occurred over the spring, and teacher and principal feedback was solicited and in support of the recommendation.

The Board of Education approved (5-0 vote) the purchase of Amplify CKLA and Amplify ELA for a total amount of \$1,162,698.00 to be paid from the teaching and learning curriculum adoption fund. The six-year contract includes teacher access through 2031-32, and includes a four-year consumable purchase for school years 26-27, 27-28, 28-29, and 29-30. The board also approved (5-0 vote) a one-time purchase of Amplify CKLA (K-5) and Amplify ELA (6-8) professional learning in the amount of \$140,900 paid from the Title II budget.

Funding of these purchases is designated for curriculum and professional development, and are not eligible to be used for staff wages.

- [Kindergarten Orientation was held on Wednesday, April 22.](#) Families of incoming kindergarten students visited schools to meet staff, learn about daily routines and curricula, and receive tips in preparing for a successful transition into Kindergarten in August.

Student Transportation Update

Dr. Larry Englebrick, deputy superintendent, and Cynde Frick, CFO, shared an update on student transportation and a summary of the process for evaluation of proposals to provide transportation services for the 26-27 school year.

The district is concluding the last year of a 5-year contract with First Student. A recommendation was made for a 3-year contract with Durham School Services, with two optional one-year renewals. Stated factors for the recommended partnership with Durham included: student and staff safety as a top priority; demonstrated performance in customer satisfaction; focus on service to students and parents; and commitment to refinements and identifying efficiencies and cost savings.

Transportation enhancements to be delivered include a bus driver wage increase of \$1.50/per hour; signing bonuses of \$2,000/per employee; and reduced lease costs by using the district's Facilities and Operations lot as the vehicle bus barn location.

The estimated annual cost for the recommendation is \$6.8 million for 26-27 with 4% annual increase in subsequent years. Funding will come from the General Fund and Special Education Fund. Funding will also come from the FY 2026 Capital Outlay (bus lease) funds. The bus lease capital outlay funds cannot be used for classroom salaries. The board approved with a vote of 5-0.
