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I hereby certify that the following is a true and exact excerpt from the minutes of the Public Board of Education Meeting held on April 27, 2026, at which time a quorum was present:

A motion was made by Mr. Piro and seconded by Ms. Alvarez to approve the following resolution by consent roll call:

Whereas, Dr. Chari Chanley serves in the capacity of Superintendent for the 2025-2026 school year; and

Whereas, the Board must consider certain matters concerning Dr. Chanley's employment.;  
And

Whereas, upon review of the various conflicts of interests of the current Board Members, it has been determined that six of the members have conflicts of interest pursuant to the New Jersey School Ethics Act; and

Whereas, pursuant to Policy 0163, when a quorum of the Board has conflicted interests, the doctrine of necessity may be invoked in order to allow conflicted Board members to participate and vote only when the Board of education has fewer non-conflicted Board members than are required, pursuant to statute, to take action; and

Whereas, when invoking the doctrine of necessity the Board shall state publicly that it is invoking the doctrine of necessity with the reasons for doing so and the specific nature of the conflicts of interest; and

Whereas, the Board Policy further provides that it shall read the resolution invoking the doctrine of necessity at a regularly scheduled public meeting, post the notice of the resolution for thirty (30) days and provide the School Ethics Commission with a copy of the resolution; and

Whereas, the School Ethics Act, N.J.S.A. 18A:12-21, et seq., was enacted by the New Jersey State Legislature to ensure and preserve public confidence in School Board Members and School Administrators and to provide specific ethical standards to guide their conduct; and

Whereas, the School Ethics Commission has provided guidance regarding the invocation of the Doctrine of Necessity when a quorum of the Board of Education is not available because members of the board of education have conflicts of interest on a matter required to be discussed

and voted upon; and

Whereas, the Board intends to conduct votes this evening concerning financial and employment-related matters concerning Dr. Chanley;

Whereas, members of the Board have conflicts of interest that would prevent their participation in and vote on the matters related to Dr. Chanley are as follows:

- Carmen Alvarez, Gail DiPane, Peter Piro, Usha Sharma, and Charles Zeichner are involved in litigation with Dr. Chanley.
- Kate Rattner's husband, David, is a teacher employed by the Board.

Whereas, as a result of the foregoing, the Board does not have a quorum to vote on matters related to the Superintendent's employment, and the Board's counsel and the Board have determined that it is necessary to invoke the Doctrine of Necessity;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the above paragraphs are hereby incorporated by reference; and be it


Further Resolved, that the Doctrine of Necessity is hereby invoked with respect to the Board's public votes related to Dr. Chanley; and be it

Further Resolved, that a copy of this Resolution, having been read at a public meeting of the Board on April 27, 2026 be posted in accordance with the Board's standard procedures for not less than thirty (30) days and that the Board Secretary reflect the same in the minutes of the meeting; and be it

Further Resolved, that a copy of this Resolution be provided to the School Ethics Commission.
