

Findings:

NES 11- Policy does not mention that “snacks in aftercare are served via the CACFP and meet requirements of that program”

NES 12- Policy does not mention “all snacks sold to students during after school programs will meet the same nutrition standards as foods sold during the school day”

PEPA 11- Policy suggests that family and community engagement in physical activity opportunities at all schools be addressed

PEPA 16- Policy does not mention “each school shall partner with local government and community-based agencies to support active transport to school to implement a comprehensive active transport program”

Recommendations:

NES 11- Add language, “snacks in aftercare are served via CACFP and meet requirement of that program”

NES 12- Add language, all snacks sold to students during after school programs will meet the same nutrition standards as foods sold during the school day”

PEPA 11-Add language, “all schools are required to develop comprehensive school physical activity programs that address family and community engagement in physical activity, and provide a wide variety of offerings”

PEPA16- Add language, “each school shall partner with local government and community-based to support active transport to school to implement a comprehensive active transport program”
