VII. Presentation – CAC Recent Alumni Study

Ian Klinger, Dale Kleinschmidt, Mary Ellen Knickel, Marta Stewart Moeller and Sven Schreiber (Chair) presented their findings from the Recent Alumni Study. The study gathered feedback from 159 WHS graduates from 2017 to 2024. The presentation included demographic findings, coursework and post-high school data, college major/field of study data regarding preparedness, academic and extracurricular feedback, skills data, and data regarding resources, support and overall experience. As reported by respondents, feedback was generally positive, the use of technology appears to lag behind, and teachers make the difference.

VIII. Presentation – Vermont Design Workshop

Mike Ruetschle, Architect with Ruetschle Architects, shared an update on Vermont Design from the most recent design workshop.

IX. Committee Reports

Belonging and Inclusion Collaborative – Mr. Weber and Dr. Simmons reported on a meeting held on March 17th where equitable design practices were discussed in universal design learning.

Citizens Advisory Committee – Mrs. Zoller thanked the Alumni Study team for their presentation tonight and reported that the Homework and Study Best Practices team will present their findings on April 20th.

District Leadership Team / Student Achievement – Mr. Weber reported that the DLT met on March 16th to discuss the District’s 26-27 goal planning, pro-growth trends, feedback from parents on the 27-28 calendar, and a potential schedule change for the basketball state championship game.

Facilities Committee – Mr. Weber reported that the Primary Facilities Core Team met on March 18th to review input from the recent Vermont design workshop and progress on Elm approvals through Wyoming Historic Preservation Commission, Architectural Review Board, City Planning Commission and City Council. The next meeting is April 1st.

Finance Committee – Mrs. Johnson shared that the committee met earlier in the evening where they reviewed the salary and benefit analytic, the primary facilities financial update, the commencement of the FY25 financial audit and sections C, D, F and G of the ODEW District Profile Report.

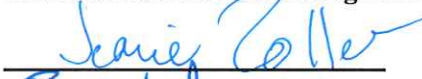
