WHEREAS, the Department of Community Affairs, Division of Local Government Services (DLGS) is tasked with administering these grant funds through the Local Efficiency Achievement Program (LEAP); and

WHEREAS, LEAP Implementation Grants exist to support costs associated with shared service implementation to ensure that meaningful, efficiency-generating initiatives are not hindered by short-term transitional expenses; and

WHEREAS, the Northern Valley Regional High School District (NVRHSD) and the Haworth School District propose to enter into a shared services agreement, but face certain expenses associated with implementation that present a burden to the local units; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this shared services agreement is to build, equip, and furnish a Career and Professional Learning Center, which will benefit the students and staff of NVRHSD and the school district of Haworth; and

WHEREAS, the NVRHSD has agreed to be the lead agency in this program and will submit the application to DLGS on behalf of all participating units; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Haworth School District, that the Haworth School District does hereby join with NVRHSD in applying for a LEAP Implementation Grant in the amount of \$300,000 to support implementation of this shared service.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a public hearing be held at the Haworth Public School located at 205 Valley Road in Haworth, NJ. on Thursday, April 29, 2026 at 7:30 p.m. for the purpose of conducting a public hearing on the budget for the 2026-2027 school year.

- j. BE IT RESOLVED that the Haworth Board of Education includes in the final budget the adjustment for enrollment in the amount of \$555,800.00. The district intends to utilize this adjustment for supplies and materials necessary for the additional students.

k. BE IT RESOLVED that the Haworth Board of Education includes in the final budget the adjustment for increased costs of health benefits in the amount of \$106,592.00. The additional funds will be used to pay for the additional increases in health benefit premiums.

l. Upon the recommendation of the Superintendent, the Haworth Board of Education approves the Haworth Public School's participation in the Northern Valley Regional High School District Consortium, BEN 17007414, for the procurement of eligible Category One services and related equipment and authorize the Northern Valley Regional High School District Consortium and its agents, designees, employees, or representatives to submit FCC Forms 470, FCC Forms 471, and other E-rate forms to the Schools and Libraries Division of the Universal Service Administrative Company on behalf of the Haworth Public School District, and to order eligible services/equipment on the District's behalf.

m. BE IT RESOLVED by the Haworth Board of Education, that the Board, upon recommendation of the Business Administrator, approves the following resolution regarding Employee Travel and Related Expenses:

WHEREAS, school district policies 4131/4131.1, 4133, 4231/4231.1 and bylaw 9250 regarding travel reimbursement and related expenses and N.J.A.C. 6A:23B-1.2(b) provides that the Board of Education shall establish in the annual school budget a maximum expenditure amount that may be allotted for such travel and expense reimbursement for the 2026-2027 school year.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Haworth Board of Education hereby establishes the school district travel maximum for the 2026-2027 Tentative Budget in the sum of \$20,000; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the School Business Administrator shall track and record these costs to ensure that the maximum amount is not exceeded.

n. BE IT RESOLVED that included in the general fund appropriations, budget line 620 is a withdrawal from Capital Reserve - Other Capital Projects in the amount of \$400,000.00 for other capital project costs of the kindergarten playground replacement and technology infrastructure projects. The total cost of these projects is \$400,000.00 which represents expenditures for construction elements or projects that are in addition to the facilities efficiency standards determined by the Commissioner as necessary to achieve the New Jersey Student Learning Standards.

o. Be it resolved that the Board, upon recommendation of the School Business Administrator approves the following resolution:

Whereas, NJAC 6A:23A-5.3 provides that a school district may request a waiver of compliance with respect to the district's participation in the Special Education Medicaid Initiative (SEMI) Program for the 2026-27 school year, and

Whereas, the Haworth Board of Education desires to apply for this waiver due to the fact that participation in SEMI would not provide a cost benefit to the district based on the projection of the district's available SEMI reimbursement for the 2026-27 budget year.

Now therefore, be it resolved, that the Haworth Board of Education hereby authorizes the Business Administrator to submit to the Executive County Superintendent of Schools in the County of Bergen an appropriate waiver of the requirements of NJAC 6A23A-5.3 for the 2026-27 school year.

*Mr. Lane explained some of the budget resolution items. He noted that the preliminary budget will be submitted to the county for review and approval next week. The final budget will be presented at the April meeting. He also shared the plans for the primary playground to be redone, the internet switches to be replaced, as well as teaching responsibility changes for STEM, and also adding an inclusion teacher for Kindergarten. He explained that the district will be creating a new Autism program to bring many of the out of district students back into the building. He shared his excitement for this program to benefit both the students and the community.*

*Mr. Lane noted the 31.9% increase in the cost of health benefits, as well as growing enrollment, rising energy costs, and just general inflation as the main budget challenges.*

*P. Wolford - shared that the district did not cut any programming while balancing this budget.*

*C. Crowley - asked how much of the 31.9% is due to our population increase?*

*P. Wolford - explained that it's all from inflation. Health care costs went from 1.3 million dollars to 3.3 million dollars in 5 years. He is happy to disclose that even with these obstacles the budget is balanced.*

*D. Egan - what is the cost for the internet switches?*

*K. Lane - there is a high demand for it, so we budgeted between \$55,000 - \$75,000.*
