Bishop England High School was founded in 1915 by Reverend Joseph L. (“Doc”) O’Brien and Reverend James J. May in downtown Charleston, South Carolina. In its first year, the school was staffed by diocesan priests and Sisters of Charity of Our Lady of Mercy, serving 67 students of Irish immigrant families and other residents of the lowcountry. After 83 years on the peninsula, the school was moved to Daniel Island in 1998. Currently serving 650+ students in grades 9 – 12, Bishop England’s charism is to provide an authentically Catholic educational environment in an academically rigorous atmosphere while encouraging all students to discover and share their unique God-given talents.

Graduate Profile

Grounded in the BEHS vision for helping students become the people God intends them to be, the Graduate Profile, drafted with community stakeholder input in 2023-24, articulates the attributes and standards all students are called to meet. The Bishop England High School Advisory Council embarked on a new three-year strategic plan for the school in 2023. They hired Sarah Sprinkle Philanthropy to lead the school's planning efforts and established an ad hoc Strategic Planning Committee to guide the process. Over the course of several months that year, the committee and consultant (planning team) conducted twelve focus groups focused on key population segments and priority areas for the school including: Catholic Identity, Alumni Relations, Advancement, Athletics, Facilities, Community Relations, Programming/Academics, Faculty/Staff, and Student Feedback. The team also conducted ten in-depth interviews with key members of Bishop England administration and community partners. After the plan was drafted, the school held a final feedback event at a private residence and solicited final thoughts from notable members of the BE community.

The planning team submitted a draft plan to the diocese for approval in November 2023 and after several meetings and revisions, the plan was approved by Bishop Jaques Fabre-Jeune in August 2024. One notable revision was the re-categorization of the plan's objectives to comply with the National Standards and Benchmarks for Effective Catholic Elementary and Secondary Schools (NSBECS). This would enable the plan to be used for accreditation purposes.

- New academic schedule to accommodate “flex time” for students

- Engaged a consulting firm to create a Strategic Communications Plan to guide marketing and communications efforts

- Hired new Campus Minister
- Added a section in Faculty Handbook regarding the importance of our faith and expectations of faculty and staff
- Partnered with Department of Homeland Security to conduct a campus-wide security assessment and begin implementing improvement recommendations
- Instituted a yearly-faith formation theme to guide all campus ministry and school year events
- Revamped the Parent Guild to increase involvement with the school
- Implemented use of 2gno.Me Platform and Danielson Teacher Evaluation tools to drive professional development for faculty
- Launched new on-site partner school programs to strengthen relationships with partner schools
- Painted school hallways and began library renovation project
- Started campus master planning process
- Established a committee to begin investigating offering onsite daycare services for Faculty/Staff
- Increased financial transparency

School Year 2024/2025 Accomplishments

- Completed the first year of themed faith formation, “Water in the Wilderness”
- Increased funding for admissions and student retention programs leading to a retention rate of 99%
- Created an effective hierarchical structure that enhances Catholic identity and academic environment
- Implemented a fundraising calendar
- Developed a total compensation package to recruit/retain talented workforce
- Evaluate the need to add scholarships (new Faculty/Staff scholarship added this year)
- Increased annual fund giving by 10%

- Collaboration with area parishes to increase student and family participation through increased volunteerism and the activity of the parent ambassador program Improve the employee onboarding process

- Create marketing plan for admissions and student retention
- Continued financial transparency initiatives
- Evaluate options to remove the transportation barrier for current/potential students
- Revamp athletic fundraising
- Reviewing opportunities with flex time or a potential house system

New Academic Schedule

The 2024-25 school year saw the adoption of a significantly different school-day schedule. Having solicited and received feedback from students, parents, and faculty related to workload and school/home/work/life balance, we seated a committee of faculty and staff members to envision a new schedule that helped to alleviate some of the stress that our constituents were experiencing. This committee met in the spring of 2024, and the result of their meetings was a completely new and forward-thinking schedule that was introduced in August of 2024. Three days of the week retain the traditional 45-minute, seven-period schedule; the other two days are composed of three or four 70-minute class periods and allow time for all-school Mass and a 45-minute flex period. Flex periods are built into the schedule to allow students time to handle make-up work, receive extra help from a teacher, get caught up on homework, or just take a break and visit with friends. Flex periods are also used for important school gatherings – speakers, assemblies, and events like the Key Club/Faculty Basketball Game, the Club Fair, and the Unified PE – Options Basketball Game. When surveyed, students reported that this “bonus time” has been extremely helpful as they use it to manage their day as well as their mental health. Teachers also appreciate the opportunity to work with students during the school day rather than after school. The new schedule has been a great benefit to our school community.



FACULTY INFORMATION

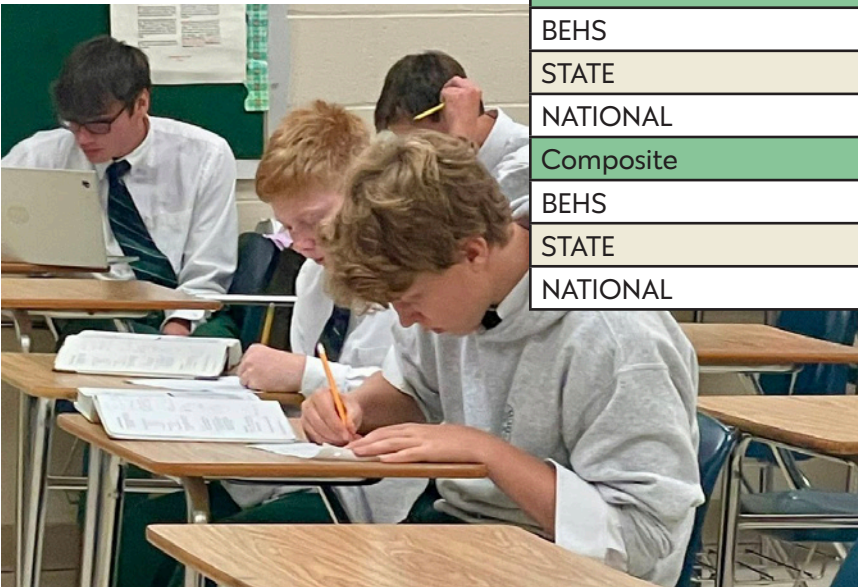
Bishop England has 91 total staff members and 62 teaching faculty members. Of those, 36 (62%) have earned advanced degrees, and 45 (77.6%) are Catholic.

Standardized Testing Results

Standardized test score comparisons from 2024 data show that BEHS students perform significantly better on average than their state and national counterparts. This result is not an isolated instance; comparative historical data shows very similar results.

Options Program

The **Bishop England Options Program** is designed to meet the needs of high school age students living with mild to moderate disabilities in an inclusive educational setting. Since 2020, our program has served 30 students living with intellectual disabilities. Sixteen students have graduated as of May 2025, eight of them have participated or are currently enrolled in higher education programs to include Clemson, South Carolina, and Coastal Carolina Life Programs as well as Trident Technical College. Three students are in the process of applying for higher education programs, two are enrolled in supervised work programs, and three are actively employed or volunteering. Our program served fifteen students in the 2024-2025 school year and will serve fourteen students in the 2025-2026 school year.



The 2024–2025 Teacher of the year is Ms. Kristen Common

Over the past 38 years as a special education teacher, I have learned that trusting relationships between teachers, parents, community members, and most importantly, the children create a safe space for all to learn and succeed. Our children living with disabilities can overcome learning differences and social challenges when the culture of their school is one of prayer, love, and trust. During the last five years at Bishop England, I have witnessed and believe even stronger in the power of a school community that prays together. The testament to this is the story of one of our options student living with autism and apraxia and his breakthrough in communication skills. He is now able to spell to communicate showing us his knowledge and sharing his ideas. One of the first things he communicated to us was his desire to become Catholic and his love of Christ. He spent his first two years at Bishop England in silence listening to the many prayers, theology lessons, homilies, and words of encouragement from his peers and teachers. Our Bishop England school community has nurtured his desire to be closer to Christ through the Eucharist, and this has strengthened my faith affirming my belief that teaching is a calling from the Lord above.

Guest Speakers and Outings for Experiential Learning

Over the past few years, BEHS has hosted guest speakers on campus to present on topics including the remembrance of 9/11 and the importance of modesty and chastity. In addition to local field trips and travel abroad to countries including Italy and Chile, students have attended many conferences, speakers' series, and lectures around the Charleston area. A highlight of the 2024-2025 school year saw a group of students participate in an insider's tour of the Volvo automotive plant in Ridgeville, SC. These students with expressed interests in science, math, engineering, and technology were treated to a full day's insight on the factory floor, meetings in the boardroom, and lunch with automotive engineers. Each year in the spring, BEHS hosts a Career Day that sees many alumni and parents pouring back into the community through their testimonials and career guidance in multiple sessions with students.

Community Outreach

Forging relationships with local partners is another essential aspect of nurturing the strength and connectedness of BEHS in the surrounding community. For many years now, BEHS students have been expected to engage in community service hours as a graduation requirement. Each year, students commit their time to helping others in myriad ways from volunteering at elder care homes to conducting beach clean-ups, organizing food drives, and baking for first responders.

Outreach to other learning communities also plays an important role. In 2023, BEHS began a collaborative partnership with Watoto Academy of the Performing Arts at Meeting Street Schools, which has resulted in numerous performances of African and African American dance on our campus as well as engagement opportunities on Daniel Island's waterfront with co-sponsorship by the Daniel Island Historical Society.

In the 2024-2025 academic year, BEHS launched efforts to better share our story throughout the state and the Diocese through Catholic Radio in South Carolina. We began creating podcast content to highlight our outstanding programs and inspiring people. Today, our content can be streamed online and on mobile devices, reaching audiences everywhere.



COUNSELING

The Counseling Department offers many parent and student services. We address academic, college, and personal issues, and provide information related to these areas. We are here to guide and lend a helping hand when needed, and we look forward to working with our students and their families throughout their high school experience.

On May 14, 2025, the Counseling Department hosted our 2nd annual College Decision Day. On this day, we select the seniors and their post-graduation plans. The seniors wear their chosen College t-shirts, and we celebrate with games, writing advice cards and a huge signing poster. Of the 183 graduates from the Class of 2025, 31 were members of our **Legacy Society** – students whose parent, grandparent, and/or great-grandparent is also a BEHS graduate.

Advancement: Scholarships and Awards

The **Fund for Bishop England** has three primary purposes:

1. Tuition assistance- During the 2024-2025 school year, over \$500,000 in tuition assistance was awarded to 110 students in need. The need for financial assistance continues to grow every year and in the 2025-2026 school year over \$700,000 are expected to be awarded to over 130 students.

2. Competitive salary and benefits for faculty and staff- BEHS is proud to provide its faculty with equal salaries to our public-school counterparts. This year, the school led the diocese in offering six weeks of paid parental leave.

3. Financial backing for student clubs and organizations- this is for expenditures over and above annual budgets. These dollars support everything from athletic teams to the campus ministry to student-led clubs.

In March, Bishop England hosted its Day of Giving and had its highest grossing Day of Giving campaign in school history, raising \$160,275.00
