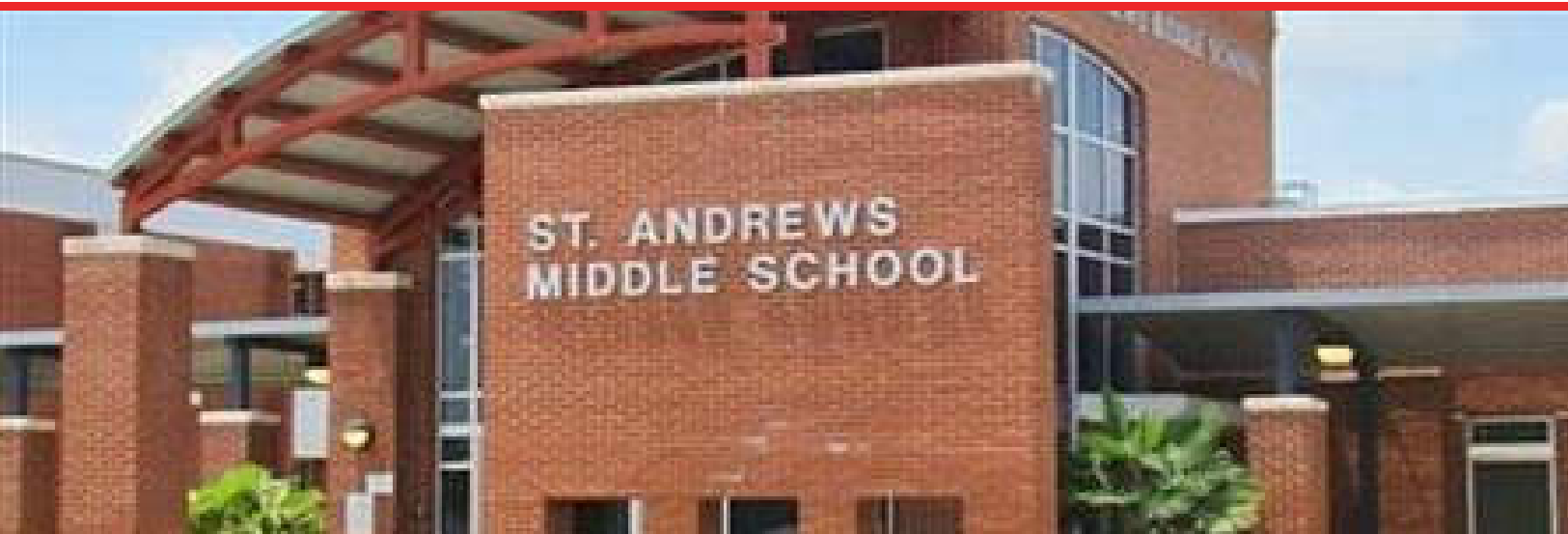




# 2025-2026 SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT COUNCIL ANNUAL REPORT TO PARENTS

## School Improvement Goals

**Goal 1:** By the end of the 2025–2026 school year, SAMS will increase the percentage of students scoring meets or exceeds in English Language Arts (ELA) from 33.2% to 38% and from 10.3% to 15% in Math on SC Ready.

### Key Progress

To support the SC Ready goals for ELA and Math, the school used STAR Reading and Math as a universal screener to progress monitor.

- Based on the Fall-to-Spring STAR Reading Growth Report, 55.6% of students demonstrated typical or high growth, indicating measurable progress in reading achievement.
- From Fall to Spring, 44.1% met their growth targets, demonstrating moderate progress math achievement.

**Goal 2:** By the end of the 2025–2026 school year, SAMS will increase the percentage of students scoring meets or exceeds in sixth grade science from 21.6% to 26% on SC Ready.

### Key Progress

The school implemented targeted, data-driven instruction based on STAR assessment results, including small-group interventions for students not meeting growth targets. Teachers utilized progress monitoring tools (District Common Formative Assessments- Mastery Connect) to adjust instruction and provide timely support. Additional strategies included differentiated instruction during core lessons, the use of intervention programs (IXL and ALEKS), and regular data team meetings (Professional Learning Communities) to review student performance. Professional development was provided to strengthen instructional practices in reading and math- (We are a Palmetto Math Project School, where support was provided to us from a consultant from the state department and teachers and administration attended OGAP- Ongoing Assessment Project-training for Multiplicative Reasoning), and ongoing communication (grade-level family nights and Financial Literacy and Test-taking Strategies Family Night) with families supported student learning and attendance.

**Goal 3:** Reduce the percentage of chronic absenteeism from 40% to 37% and the percentage of out-of-suspensions from 18.9% to 13.9% by following the progressive discipline procedures.

### Key Progress

- As of April 2026, the school's chronic absenteeism rate is 32.9%, a decrease from 38.6% at the same time last year. This indicates positive progress and suggests the school is on track to meet its year-end goal of 33.2%.
- Monthly attendance incentives are implemented to encourage consistent student attendance and support progress toward the school's attendance goals.
