Drop-off & Pick-up

- **Bear Branch Elementary** - At the CAFETERIA in the back of the campus. Drop off is from 6:30 - 9:00 am. Pick-up begins at 4:00 pm, and camp closes at 6:30 pm. **Phone: 832-580-0891**
- **Magnolia Elementary (SHUTTLE BUS):** - At the CAFETERIA in the back of the campus, off of Commerce Street. Drop off is from 6:30 - 8:30 am. Pick-up begins at 4:30 pm, and camp closes at 6:30 pm. **Phone: 832-963-1113**
- **Express Pick-Up:** Please call in advance any time you are on the way to pick up your camper so we may have them ready. Please make sure you have your ID available for identification purposes.
- **Authorized Pick-Up:** If you call to give authorization for someone not listed on the pick-up list, we must also receive advance written notice via email to adventuresprogram@magnoliaisd.org. If we are unable to verify a person's authorization through the above-defined process, we will not release the camper.

Water & Swim/Pool Days

- Water Day & Swimming Pool locations are dependent upon the age of the campers:

5-6 Year Olds - Weekly **Water Day** activities, including inflatable water slides. This age group will remain at camp on these days.

7 Year Olds - Wendtwoods Pool (8950 Creekside Green Dr. Spring, TX 77389) operated by The Woodlands Township. Swim time is from 10 AM - 12 PM on scheduled Thursdays (please refer to the Camp Calendar for specific pool dates).

8 Year Olds - Falcon Wing Pool (2 S Piper Trace, The Woodlands, TX 77389) operated by The Woodlands Township. Swim time is from 10 AM - 12 PM on scheduled Thursdays (please refer to the Camp Calendar for specific pool dates).

9-10 Year Olds - Alden Bridge Pool (7725 Alden Bridge Dr. The Woodlands, TX 77382) operated by The Woodlands Township. Swim time is from 10 AM - 12 PM on scheduled Wednesdays (please refer to the Camp Calendar for specific pool dates).

11-12 Year Olds - Sawmill Pool (2200 Millpark Dr. The Woodlands, TX 77380) operated by The Woodlands Township. Swim time is from 10 AM - 12 PM on scheduled Wednesdays (please refer to the Camp Calendar for specific pool dates).

- Campers should wear their swimsuits to camp and bring a towel, a change of clothes, and waterproof sunscreen. Sandals/flip-flops are optional and will be allowed on water & swim days only. No athletic shorts, undergarments, or cutoffs are allowed in the pool.
- **Lifejackets:** If parents wish to provide life jackets for their child, they must be a "USCG (U.S. Coast Guard) approved personal flotation device". Life jackets are provided at Candy Cane Pool for the 7-8 year olds. Life jackets are not provided at Alden Bridge Pool or Sawmill Pool for the 9-12 year olds.
- **In accordance with The Woodlands Township Waiver and Release form:**
 - "I hereby agree to indemnify and hold The Woodlands harmless from and against all liabilities for any injury which may be suffered by the participant arising out of or in any way connected with his/her participating in the program."
 - "I hereby authorize and give my full consent to The Woodlands Township and their agents and assigns to take, copyright, and publish all photographs, videotapes, and film (the "Media") in which I, or my child, may appear while participating in the Program. I further authorize The Woodlands Township to transfer, use, or cause to be used the Media in any exhibitions, public displays, publications, commercials, art, and advertising purposes, without limitations or reservations."
- **Please label all items with your camper's name.**
- **PLEASE NOTE: Pool locations are subject to change. Parents will be notified should pool locations change.**

What to Bring

PLEASE LABEL EVERYTHING your camper brings to camp.

- ✓ Backpack or drawstring bag (please do not send your camper with a grocery bag or paper sack, as they are easily misplaced or mixed up with other campers' belongings)
- ✓ Refillable water bottle/container (water fountains are accessible throughout the campus)
- ✓ **MORNING AND AFTERNOON SNACK & LUNCH**...unless there is a special event in which parents will be notified
- ✓ Sunscreen (SPF 30 or higher, waterproof)
- ✓ Wear appropriate clothing (refer to the Magnolia ISD Student Handbook)
- ✓ EVERY DAY, including pool days: Closed-toe shoes (tennis shoes, etc.)
- ✓ Extra change of clothes (there will be “messy” days and activities)
- ✓ Swim Days: towel, sunscreen, and a change of clothes

What NOT to Bring

- X Electronics of any sort (cell phones, tablets, smart watches, etc.)
- X Personal toys or games
- X Money or other items of high monetary value

Adventures Program staff will not be responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged items.

Behavior Guidelines

The MISD Summer Camp Adventures strives to maintain a staff-to-camper ratio of 1:10. If a camper requires a lower ratio, this program may not be the best fit for the camper. In order to provide all campers and staff with a safe and enjoyable experience at camp, we adhere to the following disciplinary guidelines.

- Campers will be redirected to a more appropriate behavior and expectation
- If an inappropriate behavior continues, the camper will be provided with a consequence (ie, time-out based on age, sitting out from gym/pool time, etc).
- If a camper's behavior still does not improve and is affecting the experience of other campers, he/she will be referred to one of the Camp Site Managers.
- If the inappropriate behavior continues, as a final step, the camper may be suspended or no longer permitted to attend camp.
- Depending on the severity of the incident, disciplinary actions are at the discretion of the summer camp administration, which may include immediate suspension or removal from camp.

Parents may be notified depending upon the severity of the incident and/or to discuss further action. Camper fees are non-refundable if a camper is sent home for disciplinary reasons.

If a camper is dismissed from summer camp, they will not be eligible to attend any programs until the following calendar year.

Camper Behavior Expectations

- We respect ourselves, other campers, and staff
- We use respectful and appropriate language
- We use appropriate voice levels inside and outside
- We respect school/camp property and equipment
- We are responsible for our belongings and do not take what belongs to others
- We participate in activities, follow instructions, and cooperate with staff
- We ask permission before leaving the group
- We respect Safety Guidelines (on the bus, on field trips, on the playground, etc.).
- We have FUN!!

Camp Safety

Emergency Preparedness

The safety of campers and staff is the highest priority in Magnolia ISD and its programs. Each campus has a comprehensive Crisis Handbook that addresses emergency situations. The Adventures staff is familiar with the plan for their location.

Health and Well-Being

Safety and well-being are a priority for the Adventures Program. All reasonable and necessary precautionary measures will be taken. Campers should be able to participate comfortably in the summer camp activities. If a camper cannot participate, parents should notify the Adventures staff accordingly. Although the Adventures Program does not maintain an on-site school nurse or other health professional, the Adventures staff are trained in basic first aid, CPR, and procedures for handling accidents and incidents.

- Parents who have campers with medication needs must complete an ***Authorization for Dispensing Medication*** form. Forms may be obtained through the Adventures Program staff. The delivery, maintenance, and dispensing of medication will follow the same guidelines outlined in the Magnolia ISD Student Handbook.

- The Adventures Program does not provide extra clothes on-site. Campers should have an extra set of play clothes to help with accidents of any type, and, if necessary, the change of clothes could help your camper immediately.
- Please refer to the Magnolia ISD Student Handbook for information regarding Accident Insurance and Emergency Medical Treatment. For specific questions, please contact the Adventures Program administration at 281-252-2040 or email adventuresprogram@magnoliaisd.org.
- Per the Texas Health Department, immunization records are required for each camper to participate in the summer camp program, even if records were previously provided to a MISD Campus. Immunizations can be uploaded to your Enrollsy account and scanned to adventuresprogram@magnoliaisd.org.
- A current copy of any applicable **Custody Records/Legal Documents** must be sent to adventuresprogram@magnoliaisd.org, even if a child's school may already have a copy on file.

The Adventures Summer Camp Program is licensed through the Texas Department of State Health Services. It is associated with Magnolia ISD and is operated by MISD employees.

Rates and Payment Information

*Reduced Rate applies to MISD employees or those eligible for Free/Reduced Lunch

Registration Fee: A non-refundable and non-transferable Annual Registration Fee of \$40 (or \$30 Reduced*) will be charged per camper upon enrollment into this year's Adventures Summer Camp.

Tuition Rates

Weekly: Regular \$160.00 / *Reduced \$120.00

No Drop-In: There is not a drop-in option for Summer Camp. Camp is by the week only.

Payment Options: It is the expectation that payment will be made in advance of attendance as follows:

- Auto-Draft / Recurring Billing Cycles: Weekly, drafted each Tuesday prior to the camp week
- Payment through our billing software system, Enrollsy, with Credit/Debit Card

Payment Deadline: Auto-draft will be scheduled on each Tuesday, the week prior to Camp starting. If payment has not been received by the end of the day on Tuesday, the Camper will not be included in the next week's attendance roster and will not be allowed to attend the following week.

No Late Registration: Space is limited for Summer Camp, and **there will not be an option for late registration.** Enrollment is scheduled by the week, and a waitlist will be available if capacity has been reached for each week.

Withdrawals and Refunds: The cancellation deadline is the Tuesday prior to each week of camp. A notice must be provided by email to: adventuresprogram@magnoliaisd.org and must be received no later than the Tuesday prior to the week of camp. Credits/refunds may take up to 30 days to be processed.

Waitlists: If space is not available, parents can add their child to a waitlist for any weeks that are full. Once space becomes available, parents will be notified in the order in which their child was added to the waitlist.

Any accounts that are unpaid by the end of the day Tuesday, the week prior to Camp starting, will result in the student being unenrolled for the following week, and space will then be made available for those on the waitlist.

If campers are enrolled for several weeks of Summer Camp and their enrollment gets canceled more than once due to non-payment, future enrollments for any remaining weeks of camp will also be removed. Parents will then have the option to re-enroll at a later date if space is still available.
