JH Principal's Notes

We have almost made it through the year. Our last day of scheduled student attendance is on May 20, 2026, which has a 1:00 p.m. dismissal. JH report cards are issued at the end of the semester and will be mailed home the week of May 26th.

Students have about three weeks to make a final push towards improving their grades by making up any missing work or assessments. After school study hall is every Tuesday and Thursday from 2:30 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. and is a great opportunity for students to get extra help. Any students who fail core classes will be recommended to take summer school. We will be working with students and families for the final weeks. Students who cannot or choose not to attend summer school will have to take credit recovery classes next school year in place of electives and may be ineligible for extra curricular activities.

The Junior High Student Council is hosting a Spring Fling Dance on Friday, May 8th after school. The dance will start at 2:45 p.m. and will end at 5:00 p.m. Students can either be picked up or ride the activity bus at 5pm. Snacks and refreshments will be available for purchase. Tickets must be purchased in room J8 between May 4th - 7th. Tickets will not be available at the door. Students must meet academic and behavioral requirements to attend. A group of our JH students have been rehearsing since Easter break to put on a series of one-act comedies, each directed by 4 of our own SHS seniors. Come out to support these students and all of their hard work to entertain us. You are sure to have some laughs. Show times are Thursday & Friday, May 7th & 8th, in the auditorium. \$5 adults and \$3 for students K-12.

Students have finished up all of their state testing in April. Throughout that month, all JH students took the IAR (Illinois Assessment of Readiness) and eighth grade students also took the ISA (Illinois Science Assessment). All students will be taking their last MAP assessments in May.

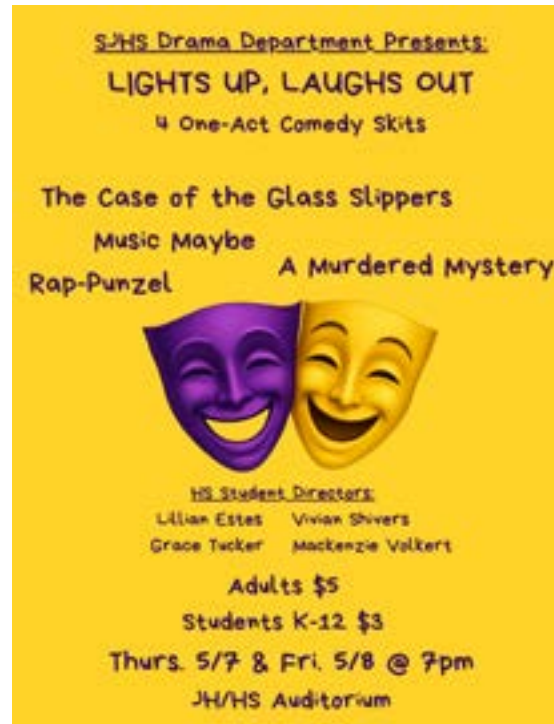

Mud Volleyball

The 34th Annual Mud Volleyball Tournament will take place for high school students on Wednesday, May 20th, starting at noon on the Northwest grassy area behind the school. All completed forms should be given to the team captain to turn in the entire team packet with the \$90 entry fee during lunch by Friday, May 1st. No late entries will be allowed and no refund for inclement weather or absences.

Sports Physicals

Get your physicals over the summer for the 2026-27 school year!

Fall sports will begin **August 10th, 2026**. All students participating in any sport must have a current physical on file **BEFORE** they are allowed to tryout and/or practice. Sports physicals cannot be used for the ninth grade physical. However, ninth grade physicals may be used for sports physicals. Physicals are active for one calendar year plus 30 days from the date of the physical and may only be signed by a physician licensed to practice medicine, a physician's assistant or an advanced practice nurse (NOT a chiropractor). If the physical expires during the middle of a sport season, they will not be allowed to practice or play until a new physical is received. The IHSA sport physical form can be picked up in the office or the high school website. Please contact the athletic office or school nurse if you have any questions.

Assessment Information

Students enrolled in AP classes will be taking the AP Exams in May. Parents/Guardians and students should have received a letter in the mail with important information about test day. Senior Parents:

FAFSA:

Reminder that the FAFSA is required by the State of Illinois. Anyone who hasn't completed the FAFSA should have received an email that includes a Non-Participation form. This form needs to be completed and returned to the counseling office if you plan on NOT completing the FAFSA. Forms can also be found in the Counseling Office.

If your student plans on attending college or a trade school, FAFSA is the form you need to complete in order to access federal grants, loans, and work-study funds.

Ninth Grade Dental Exams Due 5/15/2026

Illinois law (Child Health Examination Code, 77 Ill. Adm. Code 665) **states that all children in ninth grade must show proof of having a current dental exam completed by a dentist within the last 18 months. Exams must be dated after Nov. 15 of 2024. The deadline for completion is May 15, 2026.**

The Department of Public Health does allow for a waiver for those who show an undue financial burden or who do not have access to dental facilities. The waiver form must be completed and provided to the student's school.

If you aren't able to get your student in for an appointment prior to 5/15/26, verification can be faxed to the school from the dentist.

Dental forms and waivers are also available at all district buildings as well as on the district web site www.sherrard.us. Click on **Departments**, then **Health Services, Health Forms, and Dental Exam or Dental Waiver**.

Contact the school nurse at 593-2175 for more information. Completed forms may be faxed to 309-593-2775.

Medication Administration for the 2026-2027 School Year

If your child will need to take any medication at school—whether prescription or over-the-counter—a doctor's order with signed parent/guardian permission must be submitted at the start of the 2026-2027 school year. Medications cannot be administered at school without the completed form.

Medication forms are available on the District website at www.sherrard.us. Navigate to **Departments > Health Services > Health Forms** to find the appropriate form for your child's needs, including:

- Medication order form (daily and as needed medications)
- Inhalers
- Allergy management
- Bee Stings
- Seizure
- Diabetic Management Plan

Students are permitted to carry and self-administer inhalers if the required documentation is on file.

Printed forms are also available at all schools throughout the district. Please be sure to select and complete the correct form for your child's medication needs.



NINTH GRADE HEALTH REQUIREMENTS for SCHOOL YEAR 26-27

- All ninth grade students are required to have an updated school physical.
- State law requires Illinois Department of Public Health form to be used.
- Physical forms are available at the school and on the school district web site www.sherrard.us, go to **Departments** and select **Health Services, Health Forms** and **Student Physical Form**.
- Physicals must be completed and signed by a physician licensed to practice medicine, a physician's assistant, or an advanced practice nurse. **Chiropractors MAY NOT perform school or sports physicals.**
- Parents or guardians are required by state law to complete and sign the **health history** portion on the back of the physical form.
- **Sports physicals will not fulfill this requirement.** The ninth-grade physical may be used for a sport physical for 395 days from the date of the exam. Students who receive freshman physicals March 1, 2026 will need another sports physical by April 1 of 2027, if they desire to participate in spring sports. Please keep this in mind when scheduling your child's physical.
- A copy of your child's immunization record may be required by the health care provider.
- **STUDENTS NOT IN COMPLIANCE WITH PHYSICAL AND IMMUNIZATIONS WILL BE EXCLUDED FROM SCHOOL PER SCHOOL CODE AND DISTRICT POLICY. Please provide completed physicals by the first day of school. Students not in compliance by 10/15/26 will be excluded from school until the physical requirement is met.**

Dental Requirement

All 9th grade students must have a current dental exam dated after 11/15/25 or waiver completed by May 15, 2027. Forms are available on the district web site, select **Departments, Health Services, and Health Forms**.

Health Requirement information and physical forms were given to parents at the registration meeting on January 13, 2026. The remaining forms were given to the students whose parents were not in attendance at the meeting. Please contact the school nurse if you did not receive this information.



2026-2027 IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENT FOR TWELFTH GRADE

All students entering the **12th grade** shall show proof of having received two doses of the **meningitis vaccine** prior to entering the **12th grade**. The first dose shall have been received on or after the **11th birthday**, and the second dose shall have been administered on or after the **16th birthday**, and at least eight weeks after the first dose. If the first dose is administered when the child is 16 years of age or older, only one dose is required.

STUDENTS NOT IN COMPLIANCE WITH IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS WILL BE EXCLUDED FROM SCHOOL

ACCORDING TO SCHOOL CODE AND DISTRICT POLICY. Please provide verification of vaccines by the first day of school. Students not in compliance by October 15, 2026 will be excluded until requirements are met.

*****NOTE:** This must be the Meningococcal vaccine (Menactra or Menveo). The Meningitis B Vaccine otherwise known as Trumenba or Bexsero **does not** meet this requirement. Some pharmacies such as Walgreens have administered the Meningitis B vaccine instead of the Meningococcal Vaccine.

Notices regarding the need for the vaccine were given to the students during their registration meeting in January. Please contact the school nurse if you do not receive this information from your student.
