Proficiency Exam Guide

Students who apply for LFI for grades 1 through 12 must pass a proficiency exam in order to be eligible for enrollment, unless the student has attended a school accredited by the French Ministry of Education. You can find the list of schools accredited by the French Ministry of Education worldwide [here](#).

Exam Waiver Requirements

Students who wish to have the testing requirement waived must prove the following:

- If entering 1st grade, 1 year of attendance in a French-accredited school
- If entering 2nd grade, 2 years of attendance in a French-accredited school
- If entering 3rd grade and beyond, at least 2 years of attendance in a French-accredited school with passing grades

Families should submit report cards reflective of the required time period to admissions@lfi.us. Report cards must include all grades earned and show attendance over 80%. If the report card does not list attendance, this information may be provided in a separate document.

Alternatively, students entering 6th grade may provide DELF A2 certificates, and students entering 9th grade may provide DELF B1 certificates. The minimum acceptable DELF score is 70%.

Testing Procedure

Each proficiency test assesses the following components: oral comprehension (listening), written comprehension (reading), oral production (speaking), and written production (writing). The content is grade-level specific, and topics are familiar to students. Students entering grades 3 through 12 must pass a written exam with a minimum score of 60% before being offered an oral exam. Students entering grades 1 and 2 test in a single session.

Exam duration varies by grade level:

Test results are communicated to families via email within 5 business days after the test date.
