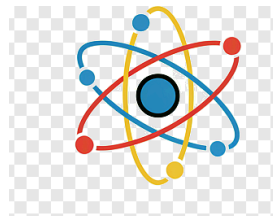

## **Dress Code**

As we approach the warm weather portion of the school year we remind everyone of the district dress code policy. The dress code, as per board policy, is implemented in order to create a reasonable and appropriate learning environment. All students are expected to dress appropriately while attending school and school sponsored functions. Dress code violations may result in the student being asked to change the attire to meet the standards. Continued violations may result in disciplinary actions.

### **Head Wear**

Hats, bandannas, and hoods shall not be worn in school, with the exception of religious reasons.

### **Jewelry**

For safety reasons, choke chains, spiked collars or other jewelry, and pocket chains are prohibited. Safety pins may not be used as a form of jewelry.

### **Sleepwear**

Sleepwear, including boxer shorts and pajamas may not be worn as outerwear or exposed in the classroom.

### **Shorts and Skirts**

Short shirts, short skirts, or rips in jeans can be no more than one hand length above the knee. Spandex shorts and form-fitting sweat pants are prohibited.

### **Shirts**

Shirts, tops and blouses that expose the following are prohibited: chest area, midriff, and lower back. Specifically, halter tops, half shirts, tube tops, spaghetti straps, mesh shirts, or shirts with excessively low cut arm holes are prohibited.

## Footwear

Appropriate footwear should be worn at all times, such as rubber soled shoes, sneakers, etc. and all footwear must cover the whole foot and be secured to the student's feet.

Flip-flops, Crocs, slides, clogs, slippers, or slip-ons are not permitted for safety reasons.

Sneakers are required at all times for PE classes

*All clothing will be considered inappropriate if they are sexually suggestive, promote alcohol, tobacco or drugs, gang related or if they are the cause of any disruption. No undergarments may be showing at any time. While classroom teachers have the major responsibility for enforcing these standards, the building principal has the final decision. The building principal shall have full discretion to temporarily suspend the dress code during after school activities and/or special theme days. Specifically organized learning activities (e.g. field trips, concerts) may reasonably dictate variations from the dress code of the normal classroom setting.*
