Annotations reflect your personal conversation with the book. Effective annotations...

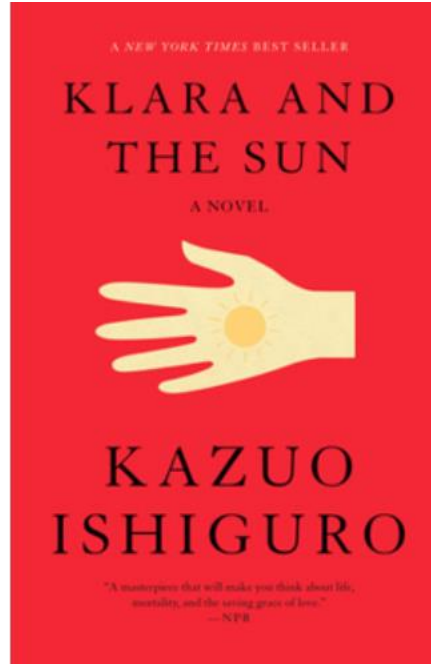
- ❑ Cover the entirety of the reading and are well dispersed, ***but not so numerous as to become a burden to your reading***
- ❑ Contain words and phrases in the margins (not just underlining or highlighting); unfamiliar vocabulary is defined
- ❑ Vary in type and purpose (ex: personal response, summary, questions, predictions, connections within or outside the text, observations about literary elements/patterns, etc.)
- ❑ Demonstrate deep thinking about the selected reading, going beyond the surface of the text [Click Here For More Annotating Ideas](#)

A Note to Students and Parents: The reading choices may include sensitive topics, or content that may be considered sensitive. However, we have chosen these novels because they allow us to have meaningful discussions on the Four Apostolic Preferences: (1) showing the way to God, (2) walking with the excluded, (3) journeying with youth, and (4) caring for our common home. These Preferences, presented to Pope Francis in 2019 by representatives for the Society of Jesus after a period of discernment, will be a particular focus of the Jesuit Mission until 2029.

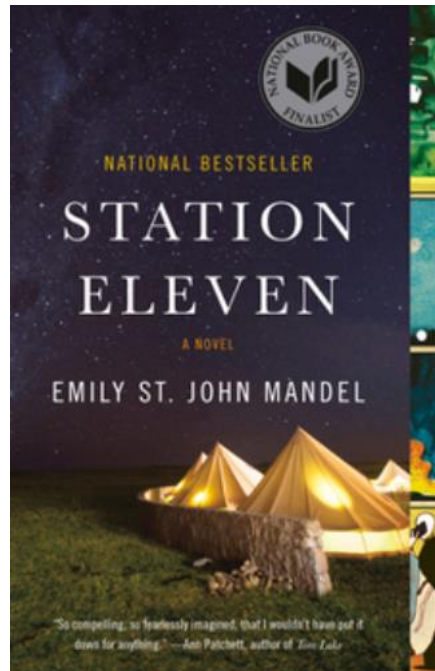

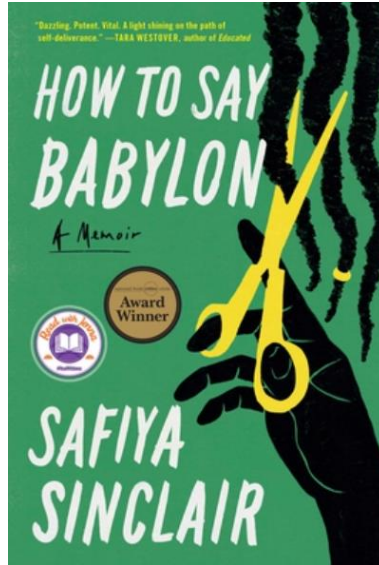
Description

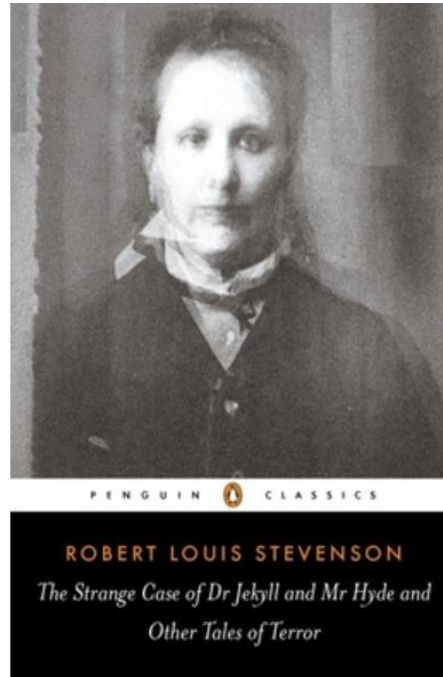
Description

Throughout her childhood, Safiya Sinclair's father, a volatile reggae musician and a militant adherent to a strict sect of Rastafari, was obsessed with the ever-present threat of the corrupting evils of the Western world outside their home, and worried that womanhood would make Safiya and her sisters morally weak and impure. For him, a woman's highest virtue was her obedience.

Safiya's extraordinary mother, though loyal to her father, gave her the one gift she knew would take Safiya beyond the stretch of beach and mountains in Jamaica their family called home: a world of books, knowledge, and education she conjured almost out of thin air. When she introduced Safiya to poetry, Safiya's voice awakened. As she watched her mother struggle voicelessly for years under relentless domesticity, Safiya's rebellion against her father's rules set her on an inevitable collision course with him. Nevertheless, Jekyll has allowed Hyde free access to his home and laboratory and, surprisingly, made him the sole beneficiary of his will. Given the closeness of their bond, it seems peculiar that no one has ever seen the two men together in public. And yet they share a remarkable chemistry . . .

First published in 1886, *The Strange Case of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde* is Robert Louis Stevenson's classic tale of the duality of human nature and his iconic presentation of what would come to be referred to as the "split personality."
