- In 2025-2026, 85% of freshmen enrolled as 1st time 9th graders will graduate within four years.
- In 2025-2026, C.A. Johnson High School will decrease chronic absenteeism by 3-5%.

CAJHS Progress

- This year CAJHS held its first Multicultural Day sponsored by the SIC, and it was a huge success.
- CAJHS has been making steady progress towards its goals.
- Chronic absenteeism is down by 11%
- The school increased its report card overall score by 11 percentage points this year alone, and the school has gone from Unsatisfactory to Below Average. Also, the number of CTE completers has increased tremendously.
- 92% of freshmen enrolled as 1st time 9th graders graduated this year.
