Physical and eye examinations are required for incoming kindergarten students, while just physical exams are required for ALL incoming 7th graders, ALL new students in the State of Nebraska, and ALL students in grades 7-12 participating in athletics at Dorchester Public School. The cost of these examinations is the responsibility of the parents or guardians. By law, you CANNOT attend school in Kindergarten and 7th grade without a physical.

It shall be the responsibility of the coach of each sport to see that physicals and parental permission forms are filed with the Activities Director. Physical examination and parental participation forms must be on file before the athlete is allowed to practice. Physical examination forms are available at the school office, from the coaches, the Activities Director, and local doctors' offices. Ways a Parent Can Help with **SUMMER LEARNING**

- 1** Provide a box with pencils, glue, crayons, and scraps of paper & cardboard for your kids to use to create whatever comes to mind.
- 2** Allow your kids to experience boredom!
Encourage them to use their imagination!
- 3** Encourage kids to keep a journal - to write about how they spend their summer days and what they want to remember.
- 4** Plant a garden. Volunteer at an animal shelter. Try a new recipe.
Do things together that you and your child can learn from.
- 5** Set a budget for summer activities and have your child help calculate and track expenses.
- 6** Visit your public library regularly.
Let your child pick out books to read that he or she finds interesting.
- 7** Find some appropriate word and math games online for your child to play.
- 8** Go on a walk together around your neighborhood.
Encourage younger kids to read the street signs.
With older kids, talk about what the different street signs and symbols mean and why they are being used where they are.
- 9** Play card or board games that involve counting, patterns, problem-solving, or using strategy.



Encourage your child to ask questions about the world around them... and help them find the answers.

Are you helping your child prepare for year-end tests?

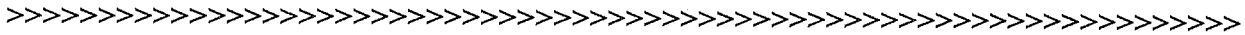
The end of the year often means lots of tests for students. Families play a vital role in helping children prepare for these important academic challenges. Are you setting your child up for test success? Answer yes or no to the five questions below to find out:

1. Do you write down test dates on your family calendar and avoid planning big activities on the day before a test?
2. Do you encourage your child to study a little each day instead of cramming the night before a test?
Research shows repeated study over time is the best way to learn facts.
3. Do you make sure your child regularly gets enough sleep and eats a healthy breakfast before a big test?
4. Do you encourage your child to wear comfortable clothing and dress in layers on test days?
5. Do you say that you have confidence in your child's ability and effort?

How well are you doing?

Mostly yes answers mean you're giving your child support to succeed on tests. For no answers, try those ideas.

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Maintain Momentum As The End Of The School Year Approaches

By May, it's common for students to start losing focus. Some "forget" to turn in assignments. Others stop giving their best effort and start avoiding anything that seems too difficult or challenging.

Here's how to help your child stay focused on learning until the last day of school:

- Review past assignments, quizzes and tests together. Use them to talk about how much your child has learned this year. Having these papers close at hand will also be useful when your child starts studying for end-of-year tests.
- Shape year-end learning around your child's interests. If there is one more project due, suggest choosing a favorite class topic. If there is a report, suggest focusing it on something your child is interested in learning more about.
- Protect sleep schedules. As the weather improves and daylight lasts longer, established sleep habits are often disrupted. Maintaining a consistent bedtime is essential for fighting spring fever. A well-rested brain processes information more effectively.
- Help your child manage large end-of-year projects. In addition to helping your child break the assignment down into smaller steps, encourage this rule of thumb: Move the deadline for finishing the project earlier by two days. If a report is due on Wednesday, your child should plan to get it finished by Monday. That way, your child will have a cushion if something comes up.

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¿Ayuda su niño a prepararse para los exámenes finales?

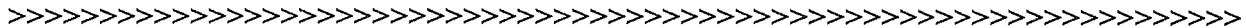
Para los estudiantes, fin de año suele implicar muchos exámenes. Las familias desempeñan un papel fundamental a la hora de ayudar a los niños a prepararse. ¿Está preparando a su niño para que alcance el éxito en los exámenes? Responda sí o no a estas preguntas para averiguarlo:

1. ¿Escribe las fechas de los exámenes en el calendario familiar y evita planificar actividades importantes para el día anterior a un examen?
2. ¿Anima a su niño a estudiar un poco todos los días en lugar de estudiar de forma intensiva la noche anterior al examen? Las investigaciones demuestran que el estudio repetido a lo largo del tiempo es la mejor manera de aprender datos.
3. ¿Verifica que su niño duerma lo suficiente y tome un desayuno saludable antes de un examen?
4. ¿Anima a su niño a ponerse ropa cómoda y a vestirse en capas el día del examen?
5. ¿Dice que confía en la capacidad y el esfuerzo de su niño?

Cómo le está yendo?

Si la mayoría de las respuestas fueron sí, usted está ayudando a su niño a rendir bien en los exámenes. Para cada respuesta no, pruebe esa idea.

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Mantenga el impulso mientras se acerca el final del año escolar

En mayo, es habitual que los estudiantes empiecen a perder la concentración. Algunos se “olvidan” de entregar los trabajos. Otros dejan de esforzarse al máximo y comienzan a evitar todo lo que parezca difícil o complicado.

Esta es la manera de ayudar a su niño a mantenerse concentrado en el aprendizaje hasta el último día de clase:

- Repasen juntos los trabajos anteriores, las pruebas y los exámenes que hizo. Úselos para hablar sobre todo lo que ha aprendido este año. Tener estos trabajos a mano también será útil cuando su niño comience a estudiar para los exámenes de fin de año.
- Moldee el aprendizaje de fin de año según los intereses de su niño. Si le queda pendiente entregar más de un proyecto, sugiérale que elija uno de sus temas favoritos de la clase. Si tiene que trabajar en un informe, sugiérale que se centre en algo sobre lo que le interese aprender más.
- Proteja los cronogramas de sueño. A medida que mejora el tiempo y los días se alargan, los hábitos de sueño establecidos suelen verse alterados. Mantener un horario constante para acostarse es esencial para combatir la fiebre primaveral. Un cerebro bien descansado procesa la información de manera más eficaz.
- Ayude a su niño a abordar los proyectos de fin de año extensos. Además de ayudar a su niño a dividir el trabajo en partes más pequeñas, anímelo a aplicar esta regla: adelantar el plazo dos días para terminar el proyecto. Si hay que entregar un informe el miércoles, su niño debería hacer planes para terminarlo el lunes. De esa manera, le quedarán unos días adicionales por si surge algo.

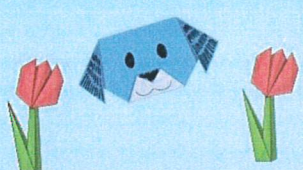

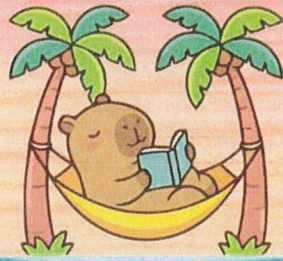

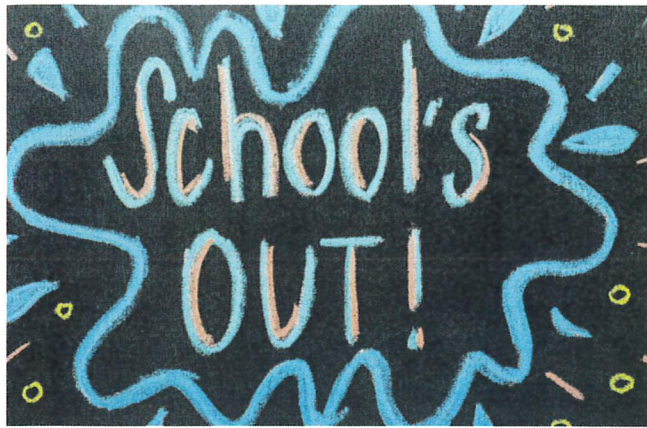
