### Day 1 - Monday

Time	Activity
8:10 a.m.	Leave EAS
9:30 – 11:00	Arrive Bowman Bay—All Students/ Parents Unload Gear and sort to 3 camps. Student tours.
11:15 – 1:45	Rotation <b>M1</b> (begin with sack lunch from home)
1:55 – 3:55	Rotation <b>M2</b>
4:10 – 6:00	EVERYONE back to camps- Set up tents, picnic tables, dining areas. Alumni tent check-offs and journal check-offs. Dinner stewards report at 5:00.
6:00	Dinner: Parents – Be in camp to help with all evening preparations.
7:00	After dinner details/Wide Games
8:00	Campfire: Led by teacher, 8 <sup>th</sup> grade students, Alumni and parents

6:30	After dinner details. Continue packing and tidying tents. Bags must be re-packed with PJs and clothes for tomorrow on top. Cooks consolidate food.

9:45	Bed time: Brush teeth, wash up, bathroom use, in tents by 10:00

### Day 5 – Friday

Time	Activity
6:30	Rise and Pack up personal gear and TENTS. (If raining: all gear under group tarp.) BB parents load all carpool gear and your rotation gear before breakfast. <b>ALL Adults-</b> Strike Kitchen Area of your camp site. Help students with tents and movement of personal gear. Kids report to kitchen area when tent and personal gear is properly stowed. It is a busy time: Stay active and helpful!
7:30	Breakfast - Eat all leftovers
8:00-8:30	Camp area pack-up and clean-up and Park clean-up
9:15 9:45 Start	HAIDA CHALLENGE (Meet at Campfire Circle : Rotation Leaders must grade/ initial journals during Haida Challenge while group performs task.) <b>Then:</b> Give them a score on their performance. Keep track of all group scores. All EAS Alum help pack Box Truck
11:15	<b>End of Haida Challenge:</b> All meet by CAMPFIRE AREA- Head count and <b>Lunch: Award Haida Challenge (All 4’s for the week)</b> Miller/ Rose pack big trucks and off to EAS (by 12:00 noon) & Minato: Set up cleaning stations back at EAS
11:35-11:50 11:55	Carpools arrive – Bartoletti /Holck in charge of gathering carpools Depart Bowman Bay > Sweep Vehicles (Last vehicles out): Holck/ Alumni
1:15  2:20	Return to E.A.S. – No one stops on way back. <b>All students help unload and clean up gear. This could take upwards of 60 minutes. Please do not leave EAS until we are done with cleanup and sorting and cleaning of gear.</b> <b>All Students are dismissed!</b>
