Dear 4th Grade Parents and Rising 4th Graders,

Welcome to 4th grade at St. Mark's! Summer is a wonderful time to read and write and strengthen your foundational math skills. Rising 4th graders read independently and fluently to gain new information. As writers, they independently compose multiple paragraphs about a topic using correct grammar and punctuation. In math, entering 4th graders are fluent in their multiplication facts up to 12, subtract and add multi-digit numbers, and solve multi-step number stories. We are excited to build on these skills next year and encourage you to use the following summer activities to stay familiar.

Each student is asked to read at least 2 books this summer:

1. **1 graphic novel or chapter book from the [Texas Bluebonnet Award List](#) and [HAISLN list](#)**
2. **1 book from the following options for an in-class book study:**
 - ***Frizzy*** by Claribel Ortega, 2022. This charming coming-of-age tale follows Marlene's journey of self-acceptance and confidence as she learns to celebrate her naturally curly hair.
 - ***Saving Sorya: Chang and the Sun Bear*** by Trang Nguyen and Jeet Zdung, 2021. This graphic novel is based on the true story of a young girl who becomes a conservationist and returns a sun bear back into the wild.

Your child may choose any spiral notebook to serve as their St. Mark's summer journal. The journal should be divided into 3 parts:

- **Part 1 — Summer Reading:** Make a list of the books you read over the summer. Choose 1 response to share about 2 books you read: write about your favorite parts, write a new ending to the book, short summary, or why you would or would not recommend the book.
- **Part 2 – My Summer:** Write, illustrate, or use photos to share your summer adventures!
- **Part 3 – I Wish My Teacher Knew...** Take some time to tell your 4th grade teachers the important things about you. What are you most excited about? Do you have any questions for us? What is your favorite subject? Is there anything else you wish we knew?

For math, we ask all students to practice their math facts frequently. The Unit 9 workbook for Imagine Math will be sent home with the students. We encourage students to spend a few minutes each week completing these pages. Doing these activities will help solidify the concepts our 4th graders have learned this school year. **Please note there is not a requirement to work on math daily.** See below for some additional resources.
