- RECOMMEND the Pennsauken Board of Education approve the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Pennsauken Board of Education recognizes school staff and Board members will incur travel expenses related to and within the scope of their current responsibilities and for travel that promotes the delivery of instruction or furthers the efficient operation of the school district; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.2 et seq. requires Board members to receive approval of these expenses by a majority of the full voting membership of the Board and staff members to receive prior approval of these expenses by the Superintendent of Schools and a majority of the full voting membership of the Board; and

WHEREAS, a Board of Education may establish, for regular district business travel as defined in N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-1.2, which includes attendance at regularly scheduled in-state county meetings, department or association sponsored events or in-state professional development activities, where prior Board approval shall not be required unless the annual threshold for a staff member exceeds \$1,500.00 in a given school year (July 1 through June 30); and

WHEREAS, the Pennsauken Board of Education established \$120,000.00 as the maximum travel amount for the current school year and has expended \$38,710.31 as of this date; now

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Board of Education approves professional development, travel and related expense reimbursements in accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-7.3, to a maximum expenditure of \$120,000.00 for all staff and board members for the 2026/2027 school year.

3. RECOMMEND the Pennsauken Board of Education approve the following resolution:

WHEREAS N.J.A.C. 6A:23A – 5.2 requires the Pennsauken Township Board of Education to establish maximum annual dollar items during budget preparation for dissemination of public information.

AND WHEREAS the Pennsauken Board of Education recognizes its responsibility to dissemination information to parents and the community in an efficient and timely manner.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Pennsauken Board of Education establishes a budget maximum for dissemination of public information of \$120,000.00.

4. RECOMMEND the Pennsauken Board of Education approve the following resolution authorizing the use of capital reserve funds to pay a portion of the costs of a capital improvement project; authorizing appropriate officials to undertake certain actions in connection therewith; and taking certain actions related thereto

WHEREAS, The Board of Education of the Township of Pennsauken ("Board" when referring to the governing body and "School District" when referring to the legal entity governed by the Board), in the County of Camden, New Jersey ("State"), has, after much research and investigation, determined to undertake a capital improvement program project consisting of: Furniture for eight (8) classrooms addition to Baldwin preschool building and facility improvement, Furniture for ten (10) classrooms and three (3) laboratories addition to PHS (Stem program), Administrative building eight (8) offices addition, security vestibule construction, Acquisition of land & property for bus depot relocation, Elementary schools'; as further described in the information prepared in connection therewith and on file in the offices of the Business Administrator/Board Secretary (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the School District is authorized by, inter alia, N.J.A.C. 6A:23-14.1 et seq, as amended and supplemented (collectively, the "Capital Reserve Law"), to transfer funds from its Capital Reserve Account to the Capital Projects Fund to fund the costs of a capital project; and

WHEREAS, the School District is considering paying for a portion of the Project with funds transferred from its Capital Reserve Account in an amount not to exceed \$11,000,000.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PENNSAUKEN, IN THE COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Business Administrator/Board Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to withdraw funds from the School District's Capital Reserve Fund in an amount not to exceed \$11,000,000.00 for the purpose of paying for a portion of the costs of the Project.

Section 2. All actions heretofore taken and documents prepared or executed by the Board, Superintendent of Schools, Business Administrator/Board Secretary, Solicitor, Auditor and Special Counsel in connection with the Project and the payment thereof are hereby authorized, ratified and confirmed.

Section 3. All resolutions or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed and rescinded to the extent of any such inconsistency.

Section 4. This resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption this 5th day of May, 2026.

RECOMMEND the Pennsauken Board of Education approve the following resolution authorizing the use of maintenance reserve funds to pay a portion of the costs of a maintenance improvement project; authorizing appropriate officials to undertake certain actions in connection therewith; and taking certain actions related thereto

WHEREAS, The Board of Education of the Township of Pennsauken ("Board" when referring to the governing body and "School District" when referring to the legal entity governed by the Board), in the County of Camden, New Jersey ("State"), has, after much research and investigation, determined to undertake a maintenance improvement program project consisting of: Elementary schools asbestos floor removal/replacement, Replacements of Transportation garage door, PHS auto shop garage door, PHS wood shop garage door, PHS driveway and back lot asphalt replacement, Sealcoating of Admin building parking lot, Delair and Fine elementary schools' parking lot, PHS 400 wing drop ceiling and restrooms partition replacements, Cafeteria shades replacement at PHS and door access control (20 entrances) and gym dividers replacement in PHS and Middle school.

WHEREAS, the School District is authorized by, *inter alia*, N.J.A.C. 6A:23-14.2 *et seq.*, as amended and supplemented (collectively, the "Maintenance Reserve Law"), to transfer funds from its Maintenance Reserve Account to the Capital Projects Fund to fund the costs of a maintenance project; and

WHEREAS, the School District is considering paying for a portion of the Project with funds transferred from its Maintenance Reserve Account in an amount not to exceed \$1,500,000.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PENNSAUKEN, IN THE COUNTY OF CAMDEN, NEW JERSEY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Business Administrator/Board Secretary is hereby authorized and directed to withdraw funds from the School District's Maintenance Reserve Fund in an amount not to exceed \$1,500,000.00 for the purpose of paying for a portion of the costs of the Project.

Section 2. All actions heretofore taken and documents prepared or executed by the Board, Superintendent of Schools, Business Administrator/Board Secretary, Solicitor, Auditor and Special Counsel in connection with the Project and the payment thereof are hereby authorized, ratified and confirmed.

Section 3. All resolutions or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed and rescinded to the extent of any such inconsistency.

WHEREAS proposals for Medical, Prescription and/or Dental Contract EUS#27-01 were received, opened and read on April 21, 2026 at 11:00 am for the purpose of seeking medical, prescription and/or dental insurance for the District, and;

WHEREAS, the Board of Education shall award a contract without the receipt of formal bids as an Extraordinary Unspecifiable Service according to N.J.S.A. 18A:18A-5(a) (10);

WHEREAS proposals for medical, prescription and/or dental insurance were received from the following vendors and at the estimated amount: Schools Health Insurance Fund (SHIF) - \$22,539,480.00, Benecard \$4,992,088.80, and Delta Dental \$803,567.40; Aetna (Administrative Fees only); Horizon BCBS of NJ (Administrative Fees only); AmeriHealth (Declined);
