III. H1-K9 Introduction and Demonstration at 4:06 pm

- Rachael introduced our new K-9 vendor, Kendal Maas with H1K9. Kendal is Vice President of Operations.
- Their K9's are not trained on over the counter medications
- Visits will not be randomized. The campus will be able to provide dates for a specific number of days. H1K9 will solicit the dates monthly.
- Half-Day Visits
- Rachael advised that this is a cost savings move and we believe that this move will produce more efficiency with our alerts.

- We discussed several scenarios on how their K9's have been used in surrounding school Districts. Kendall discussed how they were proactive with regards to the hoax threats received recently in Frisco ISD.

IV. Emergency 911 Button at 4:16 pm

- SPAT must be available to all staff members and in all classrooms. We previously purchased Raptor Alerts for SPAT Technology. As TEA rolled out the District Vulnerability Assessment, several school Districts were failing in the SPAT Technology area because Raptor's vulnerability is with substitute teachers, and giving them the ability to use Raptor without email access.
- 1 touch 911 button was added to become SPAT compliant.
- The Safety and Security Department receives notifications for all calls and 911 is also called.
- The result is an increased amount of false 911 calls
- Rachael pointed out two ways that the phone can call 911, and that is the pre-programmed button, and the circle which is intended to arrow down your pre-programmed buttons.
- Action items for campuses - please discuss this in your next staff meeting.
- Questions asked about the buttons: Can it be moved to the right or moved up?
- Per technology, no. We actually wanted the button to be the 5th button on the right side, last button.
