Confidentiality and Public Information

- Generally, security documents, records, and information reviewed by the committee or discussion of the documents and records should **remain confidential**.
- Texas Education Code section 37.2071(i) makes any document or information collected, developed, or produced during the review and verification of a multi-hazard EOP not subject to disclosure under the Texas Public Information Act (PIA).
- Texas Education Code section 37.108(c-1) provides that any document or information collected, developed, or produced during a safety and security audit conducted under the provision requiring regular safety and security audits of a district's facilities is confidential and not subject to disclosure under the Texas Public Information Act (PIA).
- Access to documents and records by committee members are to be confidentiality protected and not shared with the public. **Any security documents, records, or information shall only be released by the District with permission from the Texas Attorney General.**

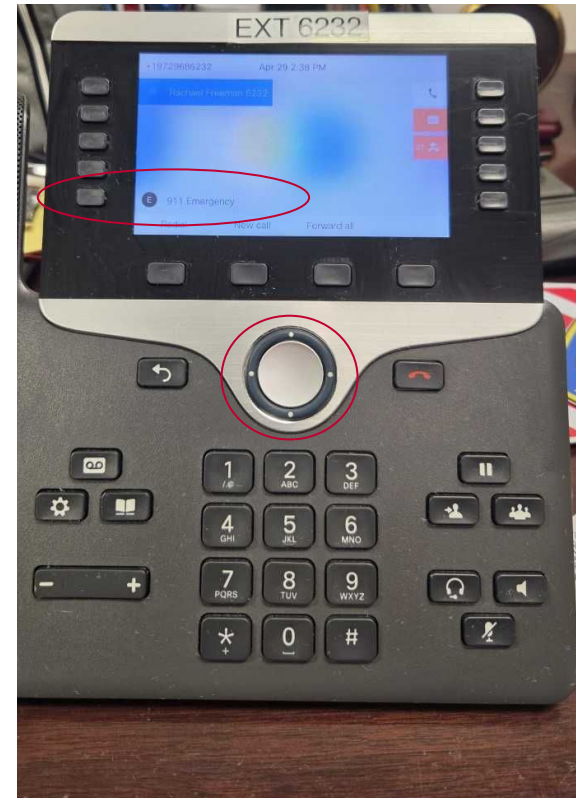

- Safety & Security has changed its K9 vendor for the 2026-27 school year
- Visits will look a little different as the K9s are trained in some different areas
 - **Not** trained in OTC meds
 - Visits will **not** be randomized
 - Half-day visits
 - Each campus will have an allotted number of visits that will be selected by the campus
 - Campus Admins/SRO/Security

Evaluation of Emergency 911 Button on phones

- SPAT (Silent Panic Alert Technology) must be available to all staff members and in all classrooms
- 1-touch 911 button was added to become SPAT compliant
- Safety & Security Department receives notifications for all calls AND 911 is also called.
- The result is an increased amount of false 911 calls.

CFB Security Officer 101: Handcuffs

Student and campus safety is our highest responsibility. To support that, our Security Officers carry certain tools that help them respond quickly and safely in emergency situations. One of those tools is a pair of handcuffs.

Handcuffs are not for everyday discipline and never used for:

- Misbehavior
- Defiance
- Classroom disruptions
- Emotional outbursts
- Special education behavior needs

They are not a punishment or a behavior-management tool

Why carry them?

Handcuffs are carried for situations where someone poses an immediate danger, such as:

- A trespasser refusing to leave campus
- An adult becoming aggressive toward staff or students
- A person attempting to harm themselves or others
- Assistance as directed by our School Resource Officers

When could they be used with a student? Only in the most extreme circumstances, such as:

- A student actively trying to hurt someone
- A student attempting to access a weapon
- A life-threatening situation

Even then, our Security Officers are trained to use de-escalation first. Physical restraint is only a last resort. Schools are public spaces, and most serious safety incidents involve non-students, not children.

Commitment to families and staff

Families and staff should feel confident that:

- Safety tools are used responsibly
- Security staff are trained in de-escalation and crisis response
- Students are treated with dignity and care
- Parents are informed when serious incidents occur

Handcuffs are simply one tool available for the rare moment when they are needed to keep everyone safe.

- Security Specialists are not permitted to serve as the primary responder for situations involving special education students. Specialists are prohibited from engaging in any form of physical intervention unless a student presents an imminent threat of serious bodily harm to themselves or others. This expectation aligns with state restraint laws, IDEA requirements, and district liability standards.

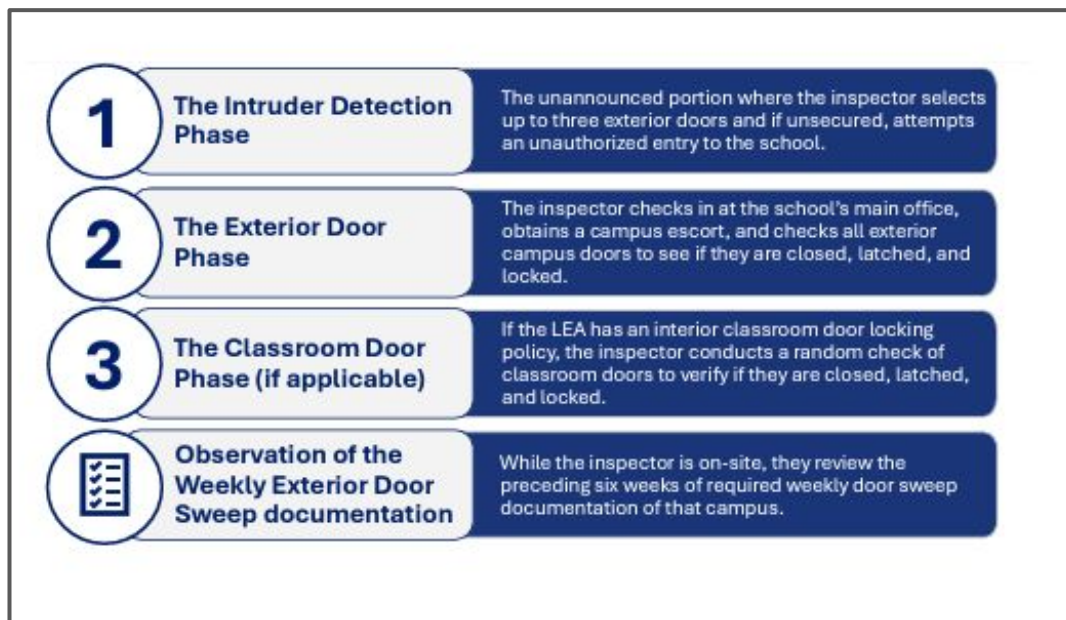
