Executive Summary: On May 13, 2025, the Board of Trustees approved Request for Proposal (RFP) #25-0219-1, awarding a contract with an initial term of one year and the option for up to four one-year renewals. At this time, the District would like to proceed with the execution of Renewal 1 of 4, in accordance with the terms and conditions outlined in the original submittals.

Request for Proposal (RFP) #25-0219-1 was issued to acquire proposals from vendors for Workers' Compensation Insurance. The RFP was advertised in accordance with Texas Education Code (TEC) Ch. 44.031 and automatically sent to all corresponding vendors registered on our electronic bidding system. Invitations were extended to 433 potential proposers; 6 proposals were received; the top 2 proposals went to a final round, where a Best and Final offer was accepted.

Administration recommends renewal of the Workers' Compensation Insurance contract with TASB Risk Management Fund. The District has been satisfied with the services provided and recommends renewal for the contract period of July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2027. The cost decrease of \$9,676 or -3.71% for fiscal 2026-2027 is based on changes in payroll levels and loss history.

Executive Summary: Pearland Independent School District seeks Board approval to enter into a partnership agreement with Communities In Schools (CIS) of Southeast Harris and Brazoria County for the 2026–2027 program year. This partnership supports student-centered programs including after-school enrichment, truancy prevention, crisis intervention, and campus-based support services designed to improve academic achievement, attendance, and overall student success.

This agreement includes a combination of previously approved programs and programs requiring Board approval at this time, as outlined below, with certain components contingent upon the receipt of grant funding. The total estimated cost for the 2026–2027 fiscal year is \$254,885.62 and is dependent upon Communities In Schools (CIS) being awarded funding for the ACE Cycle 13 grant and Pearland ISD being awarded funding for the Truancy Prevention Program grant; accordingly, the District’s financial obligation may be adjusted based on the outcome of these awards. This Partnership Agreement between Communities In Schools of Southeast Harris and Brazoria County (CIS) and Pearland ISD establishes the roles and responsibilities of each party in implementing the following programs:

Executive Summary: Pearland Independent School District (PISD) and Dickinson Independent School District (DISD) seek to enter into a Shared Services Arrangement (SSA) to collaboratively provide innovative educational services for students with autism. This agreement is established with Pearland Independent School District serving as the Fiscal Agent and is entered into under the authority of 19 Texas Administrative Code §100.1001 and Texas Government Code §791.001 et seq.

There is no financial obligation to the District’s general fund. All services and expenditures under this agreement are fully contingent upon and limited to grant funding. The Fiscal Agent will oversee all budgeting, expenditure approval, and compliance to ensure adherence to grant requirements. The arrangement will support coordinated delivery of specialized programming, resources, and services aligned with grant requirements and applicable federal and state laws.

Recommended Term:

The agreement term is May 12, 2026 through August 31, 2027, with the potential for extension or automatic renewal contingent upon continued grant funding and approval by participating districts and the Texas Education Agency.

Approval of College Board Advanced Placement Exam Payment

Executive Summary:

Each year Pearland ISD students participate in Advanced Placement (AP) exams. For the 2025 – 2026 school year, the cost of each exam is \$99.00. Students and their parents pay most of the cost. The College Board provides a \$37.00 fee waiver for each student who qualifies for free and reduced lunch. TEA also provides an additional \$27.00 for each student who qualifies for free and reduced lunch. Advanced Academics has budgeted funds to decrease the cost to parents at a subsidy of \$20.00 per exam resulting in a total district subsidy of \$142,210.00. Due to the external support, this year's district subsidy for students who qualify for free/reduced lunch is \$10.00, bringing the cost per exam for students who qualify for free/reduced lunch to \$25.00.

There is an exception for the AP Capstone program courses, AP Seminar and AP Research. Because the AP Capstone courses require a portfolio submission, a group collaboration component, a thesis style paper, a presentation and oral defense, and multiple exam-related milestone dates throughout the year, the cost of each Capstone exam is \$99.00 (\$35.00 for free/reduced lunch students). Due to the nature of the work performed in AP Capstone classes, AP Seminar and AP Research are the only classes where students are required to take the exam, and the district pays the entire cost.

The total cost for AP exams for Pearland ISD as of April 24, 2026 is \$561,096.00. Additional fees for students who take a late exam or who do not take the exam may be charged to the student's campus, and students are required to pay any additional fees not covered by the cost of their exams.

All funds have been budgeted or collected, so new funds are not required. Because the single purpose cost exceeds \$100,000, board approval is needed.

Subject: Consider Approval of Revision to Board Policy CFB (LOCAL)

Executive Summary: The Federal Office of Budget and Management (OMB) released changes to the federal Uniform Grant Guidance (UGG) that are incorporated into the Education Department General Administrative Regulations (EDGAR), which changed the initial purchase price of capitalized assets from \$5,000 per unit to \$10,000 per unit. These changes went into effect starting July 1, 2025. As a result, updates to the Pearland ISD’s local policies are necessary to ensure compliance.

Policy CFB (LOCAL) governs the District’s capitalization thresholds. The proposed version of CFB (LOCAL) incorporates the update of the capitalization threshold for the District for per unit costs, from \$5,000 to \$10,000.

Subject: Consider Approval of a Public Meeting Date to Discuss the 2026-2027 Budget and Proposed Tax Rate

Executive Summary: Under Truth-in-Taxation guidelines established by the Texas Comptroller’s Office, school districts are required to hold a governing body meeting to set the date for a public hearing to discuss the 2026–2027 budget and proposed tax rate. During this initial meeting, the Board determines a proposed tax rate, which is then published in the notice for the public hearing. Following the public hearing, the Board may adopt a tax rate that is equal to or less than the rate published in the legal notice.

Because the District’s fiscal year begins on July 1, April certified estimated property values are used to prepare the Notice of Public Meeting to Discuss Budget and Proposed Tax Rate. Pending receipt of certified taxable values from Brazoria and Harris Counties and final determination of the Maximum Compressed Rate (MCR) by the Texas Education Agency, administration plans to publish a total tax rate of \$1.1350. This consists of an estimated maintenance and operations (M&O) rate of \$0.7869 and a debt service (interest and sinking, or I&S) rate of \$0.3481.

The proposed 2026 tax rate of \$1.1350 is the same as the 2025 adopted rate. The Board may adopt a tax rate at or below this published amount; however, if the calculated rate exceeds \$1.1350, the District will be required to publish an additional notice prior to adoption.

School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) Annual Report for 2025 – 2026

Executive Summary:

The School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) is composed of a parent representative from each campus, nominated by principals, and approved by the Board of Trustees. There are also three student representatives – one from each high school. In addition to four (4) community representatives, the district representatives include Federal Programs/Grants Administrator Donna Tate, PE Coordinator Isabel Gomez, Assistant Athletic Director Laneigh Clark, Food Service Director Tanya Edwards, Food Service Dietitian Ann Shetler, School Health Coordinator Monica Reynolds, District Lead Nurse Sherrie Mullikin, Director of Counseling and Guidance Services Clara Gerard, Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction Dr. Charles Allen, Director of Safe and Secure Schools John Palombo, and Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services Lisa Nixon. There were four (4) SHAC meetings scheduled for the 2025 – 2026 school year: September 22, November 10, February 2, and April 13. The SHAC Meeting Agendas, Meeting Minutes, and Audio Recordings for each meeting can be found on the district website – [Pearland ISD Councils/Committees](#).

September 22, 2025

The September 22, 2025, Pearland ISD School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) meeting opened with Dr. Nixon welcoming members and emphasizing the importance of supporting student health and wellness. The council received an overview of SHAC's advisory role to the Board of Trustees on health education, physical education, nutrition, and student wellness. Dr. Nixon then presented key legislative updates impacting public education, including HB 6 (stricter e-cigarette discipline), HB 2 (increased school funding), HB 1481 (cell phone prohibition during the school day), SB 12 (parent notification requirements for changes in student health monitoring), and SB 991 (adding chronically absent students to the at-risk list). The meeting also included the nomination and approval of Ms. Traci Chiappetta as SHAC Parent Co-Chairperson for the 2025–2026 school year, and members concluded by brainstorming future topics such as student mental health strategies, nutrition and physical activity policy updates, and staff wellness professional development. November 10, 2025

During the November 10, 2025, Pearland ISD School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) meeting Dr. Nixon reviewed survey results from the previous meeting, identifying the top three priority areas for the 2025–2026 school year: mental health and coping skills, bully prevention and social skills, and healthy relationships and conflict resolution. Dr. Nixon also formally recognized Ms. Traci Chiappetta as the SHAC Parent Co-Chairperson for the year. The council then heard a comprehensive presentation from Ms. Katie Conklin, Vice President of Programs at Erika's Lighthouse, an organization founded in 2004 to promote adolescent depression awareness, reduce mental health stigma, and support suicide prevention through free, evidence-

informed school resources across four pillars: classroom education, student empowerment clubs, family engagement, and staff training. Ms. Melissa McDavid, Student Support Counselor at Turner College and Career High School, followed with a report on Turner's multi-year implementation of the program, highlighting their student-led "Cats Care" club and various campus wellness activities. Members expressed strong support for districtwide expansion of Erika's Lighthouse resources, with plans to share materials with all school counselors and continue growing mental health support across all grade levels. February 2, 2026

The February 2, 2026, Pearland ISD School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) meeting featured two guest presentations focused on student wellness and prevention education. Jenna Fondren from Crime Stoppers presented on the Safe School Institute's prevention-focused programming, which covers digital safety, bullying prevention, substance use, mental health awareness, teen dating violence, and human trafficking for elementary through high school students, while also addressing Senate Bill 9 compliance requirements including parent opt-in provisions and transparent communication resources. Alexis King, Director of ADAPT Prevention Programs, then presented on ADAPT's free, grant-funded prevention services, which include substance use education, behavioral health programming, positive alternative activities, curriculum-based support groups for at-risk students, and the Strengthening Families program designed to improve family communication and relationships. Dr. Nixon also introduced the District Wellness Plan for member review, noting that the three-year audit cycle results would be presented at the April meeting ahead of any planned updates. Members expressed strong support for both the Crime Stoppers and ADAPT programs as valuable resources to support student wellness and prevention efforts across the district. April 13, 2026

The April 13, 2026, Pearland ISD School Health Advisory Council (SHAC) meeting focused primarily on reviewing and approving key district health and wellness documents and resources. Members approved the Wellness Plan Implementation Assessment, which is required every three years and documents evidence that the district and campuses are meeting established wellness goals, as well as the Pearland ISD Wellness Plan itself, which addresses nutrition, physical activity, and school-based wellness initiatives aligned with state and federal requirements. Mrs. Reynolds, Pearland ISD School Health Coordinator, presented the parent education resource booklet *Always Changing & Growing Up*, which supports fifth grade puberty education, and members approved its inclusion in parent notifications. The council also reviewed and approved the *Song for Charlie* video and accompanying classroom resources as an approved option for the district's required annual Fentanyl Prevention Activity for students in grades 6–12, in compliance with Texas Education Code §38.040. The meeting concluded with members offering input on priorities for the upcoming school year, including topics such as understanding student disabilities and behavior, coping skills and conflict resolution, student stress and academic pressure, bullying awareness, and student discipline transparency, followed by Dr. Nixon expressing appreciation for members' service and contributions throughout the year. Executive Summary: The Interim Financial Statement Report provides an estimate for the Fiscal Year 2025-26 nine-month period ending March 31, 2026. This report includes an interim statement of revenues and expenditures for all appropriated funds (i.e., General Fund, Food Service Fund, and Debt Service Fund.)

- General Fund – Revenues realized total 72.5% of the budget while actual expenditures total 70.9%.
- Food Service Fund – Revenues realized total 73.6% of the budget while actual expenditures total 74.0%, which are covered by fund balance reserves.
- Debt Service Fund – Revenues realized total 98.4% while actual expenditures total 100.0%, which are covered by fund balance reserves.
