Proposed Budget Vote Set for Tuesday, May 19

Dear Glen Cove Community,

The Glen Cove City School District Board of Education and administration have developed a proposed budget for the 2026-27 school year that is both educationally sound and fiscally responsible while remaining within the New York State tax levy cap. The proposed budget includes a **2.42% tax levy increase**, which is at the district's allowable tax levy limit and does not pierce the tax cap.

Proposition I - School District Budget

To adopt the annual budget for the fiscal year 2026-27 and to authorize the requisite portion thereof to be raised by taxation on the taxable property of the District totaling \$122,314,624. The proposed tax levy percentage increase for the 2026-27 budget stands at 2.42%.

Election of Board Members

To elect two (2) members to the Glen Cove City School District's Board of Education. Each member will serve a three-year term commencing July 1, 2026 and ending June 30, 2029.

POINTS OF PRIDE

Academic Excellence

The Class of 2026 is bound for top-tier institutions including Washington University, Hamilton, Trinity, Virginia Tech, Webb Institute, Penn State, UConn, Binghamton, Stony Brook, American, Howard, Loyola University Maryland, Iona University, and the Illinois Institute of Technology. Others are pursuing service through the U.S. Army and Marine Corp.

GCHS earned bronze on the AP College Board's School Honor Roll, with platinum for College Optimization, gold for College Credit and bronze for College Culture. 141 GCHS students earned the distinction of AP Scholar for their exceptional exam performance.

51 GCHS students were nominated for BigFuture Awards through the College Board National Recognition Program.

U.S. News & World Report named GCHS one of the nation's Best High Schools for 2025-26, ranking it in the top 40% nationwide.

RM Finley MS was named a 2025 U.S. News Best Middle School, ranking among the top 40% in New York State.

Three GCHS seniors earned National Merit Commendations for their outstanding performance on the 2024 PSAT/NMSQT, placing among the top 50,000 scorers out of 1.3 million nationwide.

One GCHS junior earned second place at the High School Research Competition at Adelphi University's 23rd Annual Scholarship and Creative Works Conference.

For the fourth year, Deasy second graders won the Regional First In Math Competition, advancing to the State Competition.

Our seventh annual Family STREAM Night brought science, technology, research, engineering, arts, and math to life for hundreds of families welcoming them to the new state-of-the-art HS science classrooms.

GCHS delegates from the Puerto Rican/Hispanic Youth Leadership Institute traveled to Albany to debate bills in the Assembly Chamber.

Hundreds of families came together for a successful Districtwide International Night, celebrating interdisciplinary cultural highlights from across the community and the world.

43 musicians were selected for All-County, 4 for LISFA, and 3 earned the honor of All-State Chorus.

One GCHS junior was selected for LIU Honor Band Festival.

Student artwork was featured in the AP Art exhibition in the Art Guild, with one senior receiving a prestigious Scholastic Art Award.

One GCHS junior earned first place for their PSA, *Know Where the AED Is*, at the Locust Valley Film Festival.

One GCHS senior was honored at the Tilles Center as one of 20 Long Island Scholar-Artist Merit Award winners in the category of Media Arts.

GCHS receives National Recognition as a Premiere Community by the Educational Theatre Association.

GCHS Masquers earned a collection of Gold and Silver honors at the third annual Eastern Student Artist Guild (ESAG) Awards for their production of *Peter and the Starcatcher*.



13 GCHS students represented the district at the 29th Annual NYSTEPA Student Conference.

GCHS Yearbook Club received national honors in the Entourage Yearbooks competition.

GCHS students in Advanced Ceramics class were featured in the statewide 2026 MLK Jr. Fine Arts and Essay Exhibition.

In partnership with the Glen Cove Education Foundation, the Junior Masquers of Connolly and Landing Schools delivered spectacular performances of Disney's *The Lion King KIDS*.

In partnership with Friends of Arts and Music Enrichment (FAME GC) and the MS PTA, Finley MS hosted award-winning actor Luis Guzmán for an interdisciplinary arts experience that transformed the MS into a live media production set for GCTV, photography and podcast students.

Athletic Highlights

The Boys Varsity Golf Team earned the NYSPHSAA Scholar-Athlete Team Award, with one senior awarded the prestigious Charles Evans Scholarship covering full tuition and housing.

The Boys Varsity Soccer Team finished its season with a 6-5-5 record after a hard-fought battle in the Nassau Class AA quarterfinals.

Softball traveled to Mudville, NY, where they went 1-1 on the weekend, including a win over last year's state runner-up.

Boys Varsity Lacrosse currently holds a 7-3 record.

Girls Varsity Lacrosse is 9-2. One GCHS senior has reached 120 career goals, and another senior is ranked fifth in Nassau County in assists.

Two varsity basketball players (one girl and one boy) joined the elite 1,000-Point Career club.

The Kickline Team secured first place at the Long Island Dance Team Association competition.

GCHS athletes were featured on *Newsday's* Top 100 lists for football, soccer, and softball.

One GCHS softball player was selected for the Puerto Rican National Softball Team.

One freshman earned All-State and All-Federation honors following a standout performance in the Intersectional Relay.

Two seniors earned Physical Education Student of the Year honors at the Nassau Zone of the New York State Association for Health, Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance.

Community & Inclusion

The district is entering the final phase of the bond, finalizing GCHS parking lots and walkways. Completed projects include the turf field, tennis complex, HS science labs, new doors districtwide, and the HS cafeterias.

The Landing extension opened to students Sept. 2025, and the Deasy extension has been completed and will open to students in Sept. 2026. Both extensions were built using COVID-relief and capital reserve funding.

Over the past four years, our teachers and administrators have presented at 20 national, state, and regional conferences, sharing the work happening across the district and their pride in working in such a dynamic community. This year alone, they have presented at nine national, state, and regional conferences.

In partnership with Northwell Glen Cove Hospital, 58 GCHS students participated in the Junior Volunteers Academy, gaining hands-on experience in patient care.

In partnership with Loggia Glen Cove, one GCHS student and one Landing student were recognized in the inaugural Italian Heritage essay contest, held to celebrate Italian heritage.

In partnership with Glen Cove's 42nd Annual MLK Commemorative Commission, students in grades 3 through 12 participated in the inaugural essay contest with winners recognized at the MLK march and at a BOE meeting.

Best Buddies launched the "Buddies Brew", a student-run coffee cart providing hands-on vocational experience and promoting campus-wide inclusion.

Eighth-grade athletes and Life Skills students teamed up for the "Abilities Volleyball Game" a high-energy event celebrating school unity.

The Connolly School and K-Kids demonstrated the power of giving by raising \$1,767 for Breast Cancer Awareness and \$917.92 for the Nassau/Suffolk Autism Society of America for Neurodiversity and Autism Awareness.



Landing School's Student Council and K-Kids organized a successful food drive to support the NOSH Food Pantry.

The district was featured twice on Spotlight on Long Island Schools, with two back-to-back episodes airing on Nov. 22 and Nov. 29 highlighting the district's ongoing work in literacy and its alignment of instruction with the Science of Reading.

The district was also featured on Oct. 4 on Spotlight on LI Schools with a segment showcasing the completion of the new state-of-the-art science classrooms and the innovative science programs at GCHS. All episodes are available online via SoundCloud.

FAME GC honored a veteran elementary visual arts educator as the 2025 Tree of Inspiration recipient.

GCHS Principal was recognized at the 23rd Annual Glen Cove Chamber of Commerce Awards Celebration along with other community members for his leadership, dedication, and vision to enrich our community.

The Superintendent of Schools joined community members and the Glen Cove Police Chief in being recognized by the North Shore Hispanic Chamber of Commerce for long-standing service, leadership, and contributions.

GCHS Choir Director was named the 2025 Educator of Note by the Long Island Music and Entertainment Hall of Fame, and was recognized, alongside other community members, at the I Am My Sister Black History Month Gala & Legacy Awards for their leadership and impact.

Three Glen Cove staff members across the categories of: Teacher Service, Support Staff Service, and Administrator Service were honored at the SCOPE 25th Annual School District Awards. The district takes great pride in all its dedicated employees, whose service reflects the very best of Glen Cove.

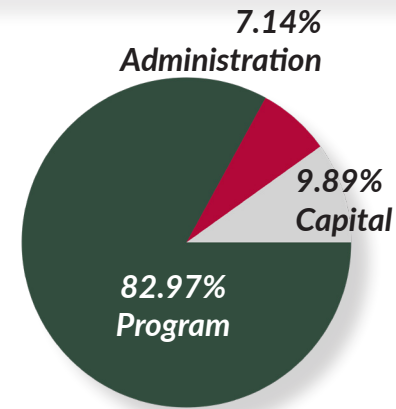

BUDGET Q & A

Q. What are the expenditures and tax levy increases associated with the proposed budget?

A. The proposed budget-to-budget expenditure increase is 3.55%. The associated proposed tax levy increase is 2.42% which does not pierce the tax cap. The Board of Education has applied existing reserves as well as New York State school aid to minimize the tax impact of the budget.

Q. Is it feasible to propose a lower expenditure budget?

A. No, not without materially impacting the educational and support programs and services for our students.

Q. How is the tax levy cap determined?

A. Districts must use the formula provided by the Office of the New York State Comptroller. Included in this formula, is the allowable levy growth factor, which is the lesser of 2 percent or inflation.

Q. What happens if the proposed budget is defeated?

A. If the proposed budget is defeated on May 19, the Board of Education has several options.

- propose the same budget for a revote
- propose a reduced budget that would require a reduction in current educational programs, services, and or staffing
- immediately adopt a contingency budget



If the same or a reduced budget is put up for a second vote and is defeated, the Board of Education must adopt, by law, a contingency budget. Under a contingency budget, a district cannot increase the tax levy from the previous year, requiring the Board of Education to consider some or all of the following cost reductions:

- increase in class size across all grade levels
- elimination of clubs and after-school activities
- elimination of band, orchestra, and chorus
- elimination or reduction in high school electives
- elimination of the use of school buildings and grounds by outside organizations
- elimination of some or all sports
- elimination of expenditures on equipment
- elimination of new capital projects

Q. Where can I get more information?

PREGUNTAS Y RESPUESTAS SOBRE PRESUPUESTO

P. ¿Cuáles son los gastos y aumentos de impuestos propuestos?

R. El presupuesto plantea un aumento de gastos del 3.55% y un incremento en la recaudación de impuestos del 2.42% que no excede el tope impositivo. Se utilizaron reservas y ayuda estatal para reducir el impacto fiscal.

P. ¿Se puede reducir más el gasto?

R. No, sin afectar seriamente los programas educativos y servicios de apoyo para los estudiantes.

P. ¿Cómo se calcula el límite del impuesto?

R. Según la fórmula del Contralor del Estado de NY, aplicando un crecimiento máximo del 2% o la tasa de inflación (lo que sea menor).

P. ¿Qué pasa si el presupuesto no se aprueba?

R. Si se rechaza el 19 de mayo, la Junta puede: repetir la votación del mismo presupuesto, presentar uno reducido o adoptar un presupuesto de contingencia.

Si el presupuesto es rechazado dos veces, la ley exige un presupuesto de contingencia. Esto congela los impuestos al nivel del año anterior y obliga a recortes como:

Aumento de alumnos por clase.

- Eliminación de clubes, deportes, banda, orquesta y coro.
- Reducción de materias electivas.
- Restricción del uso de instalaciones a grupos externos.
- Recorte en la compra de equipos.
- Eliminación de nuevos proyectos de capital

P. ¿Dónde hay más información?
