Jamestown Public Schools Board Regular Meeting on Monday January 19, 2026 at
Thompson Community Room, Jamestown Middle School

Present: Heidi Larson, President, Jamie Bear, Owen McKenna, Jacob Meier, Aaron
Roberts, Jason Rohr, Steve Veldkamp, Superintendent, Robert Lech and Kristi
Grounds, Business Manager. Melissa Gleason and Dan Tweten were absent.

Guests: Teresa Olson, Jerry Waagen, McKenna Pettys, Miranda Erickson, Ethan
Erickson, Dustin Erickson, Chelsa Ackerman and family.

President Larson called the regular meeting of the Jamestown Public School Board to
order at 5:30 p.m. and welcomed the audience.

Mr. Veldkamp moved to approve the consent agenda which consisted of
December 15, 2025 regular board meeting minutes, payment of bills, pledged
securities, submission of team Nutrition Equipment Grant for food service, December
8, 2025 Health Insurance Committee minutes, January 6, 2026 Communication
Committee notes, January 12, 2026 Facilities Committee minutes and a student home
bound agreement for 9 weeks . Mr. Roberts seconded the motion. Motion passed
unanimously by voice vote.

The Board recognized students accepted into various music programs

McKenna Pettys, Student Council Executive Vice President, provided a report
on upcoming snowball activities, and plans for 8th-grade orientation to assist incoming
freshmen.

Veronica Askew, Internship Program Coordinator, reported the program began
in 2017 for seniors, aiming for career awareness, employment readiness, and career
goal progression. Requirements include 60 hours at an internship site, weekly
seminars, time logs, journal entries, and a final portfolio. Current placements include
Jamestown Police Department, Interstate Engineering, JHS, and Face to Face Salon.
The program helps students confirm or reconsider career paths.

Jerry Waagen, is the Work-Based Learning Coordinator. The program has run for 3.5 years, emphasizing partnerships with 54+ local businesses with the goal is to prepare students for the workforce and create win-win relationships with businesses. The upcoming semester will have 36 students.

Teresa Olson, Little Blue Jays Nest Coordinator, presented on Internship and Work-Based Learning programs that support the Little Blue Jays Nest program. She noted the program's benefit and the hiring of two former Work-Based Learning students.

Adam Gehlhar presented the Strategic Plan Progress Goal 1.1 Culture of Learning: Cognia Family Survey. The district average of 4.3/5 meet the 4.0 goal. Cognia Student Engagement Survey showed 40% of students as "Emotionally Committed," not meeting the 45% goal, but showing a committed trend.

Adam Gehlhar presented the Strategic Plan Progress Goal 2.4 Leadership for Learning - Partnerships: Community Survey. The average was 2.7/4, not meeting the 3.0 goal, with areas for improvement in communication, volunteering, and volunteer training. Work-based Learning/Internships had 22% senior participation (30 of 135), not meeting the 30% goal, but showing improvement. Community Service showed 64.03% of the Class of 2024 with 25+ hours, not meeting the 75% goal, with the Class of 2025 at 69.59%. Business Partner Feedback was 100% positive from 31 surveyed partners, meeting the goal. Dr. Lech connected this data to the board retreat discussions on enrollment and finances, emphasizing proactive planning. Mr. Roberts moved to accept the Progress Monitoring Report for Strategic Focus Area 1, Goal 1.1 and Focus Area 2, Goal 2.4. Mr. Rohr seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Dr. Lech presented his report. He reviewed the successful visit from Lt. Governor Michelle Strendan and state officials regarding the district's childcare program, noting the critical role of State CTE program and ARPA grant flexibility.

Dr. Lech announced State Superintendent Levi Bachmeier's upcoming visit on Friday, which will include school tours, classroom observations, and meetings with community leaders.

Dr. Lech emphasized revisiting Long-Term Planning topics from the December 1st school board retreat, particularly long-term planning for declining enrollment, highlighting its direct impact on state funding and the need for proactive changes across all school levels.

Mrs. Bear moved to accept dual credit speech high school course for 2026-2027 school year. Mr. McKenna seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Mrs. Grounds, Business Manager, presented board members with the general fund balance sheet and the monthly financial reports.

Mr. Rohr moved to accept the resignation in lieu of discharge of Mike Romans. Mr. Roberts seconded the motion. Roll call vote: Bear, yes; Larson, yes; Rohr, yes; Meier, yes; Roberts, yes; Veldkamp, yes. Motion carried 7-0.

Mr. Veldkamp moved to accept the notice of recognition for Jamestown Administrators. Mr. Roberts seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Mrs. Bear moved to accept second reading of policy HCBA (Vendor Conflict of Interest Disclosure). Mr. Rohr seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Mrs. Grounds reported on school board positions up for election on June 9th. Mrs. Grounds announced there are 2 rural openings and 3 city openings. Deadline to file intent to run is April 6, 2026 at 4 pm, the forms are on our website.

No further business, President Larson adjourned the meeting.
