NATIONAL PARK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT 2026-2027 BUDGET

A-4394/S-3148 was signed into law on January 17, 2012, establishing procedures to move the date of the annual school district election from April to November as long as the budgeted general fund tax levy does not exceed 2% of the prior year, plus statutory adjustments.

School board candidates will be elected at the November 2026 general election and the board will re-organize the first week in January 2027.

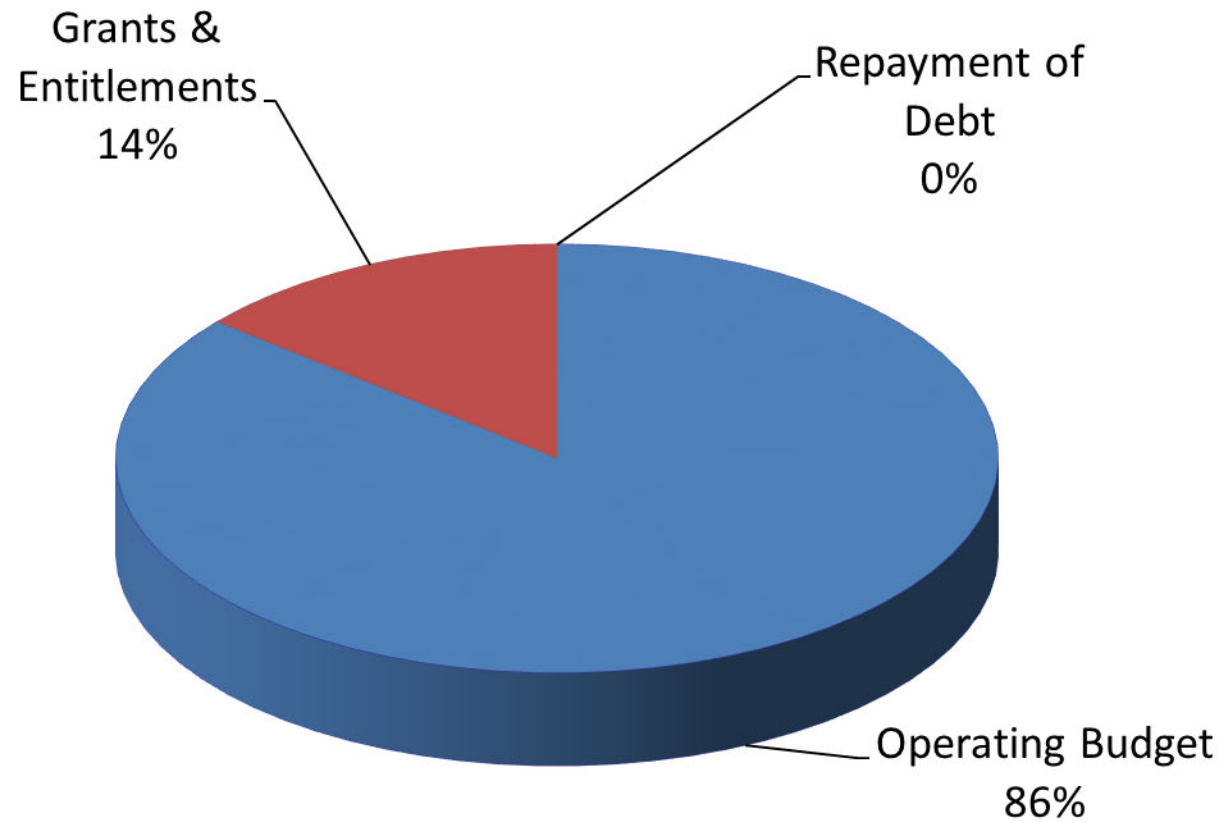

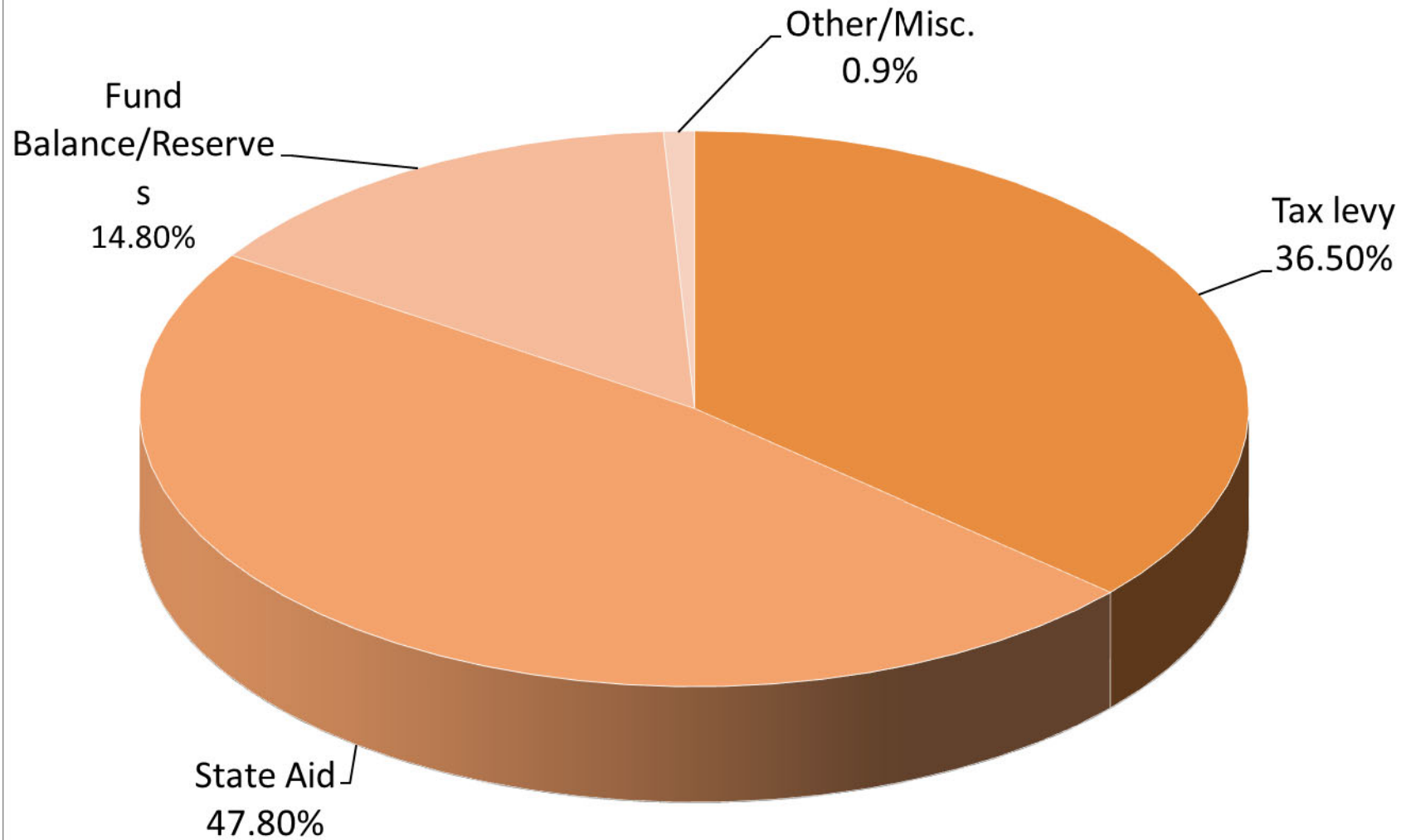

2026-2027 Budget Highlights

Maintain all current staffing positions to meet student needs.

Continue pre-school program integrated with special needs pupils.

Continue Multiple Disabled (MD) and Emotional Support (ES) programs, keeping students in their home district at a savings to the district.

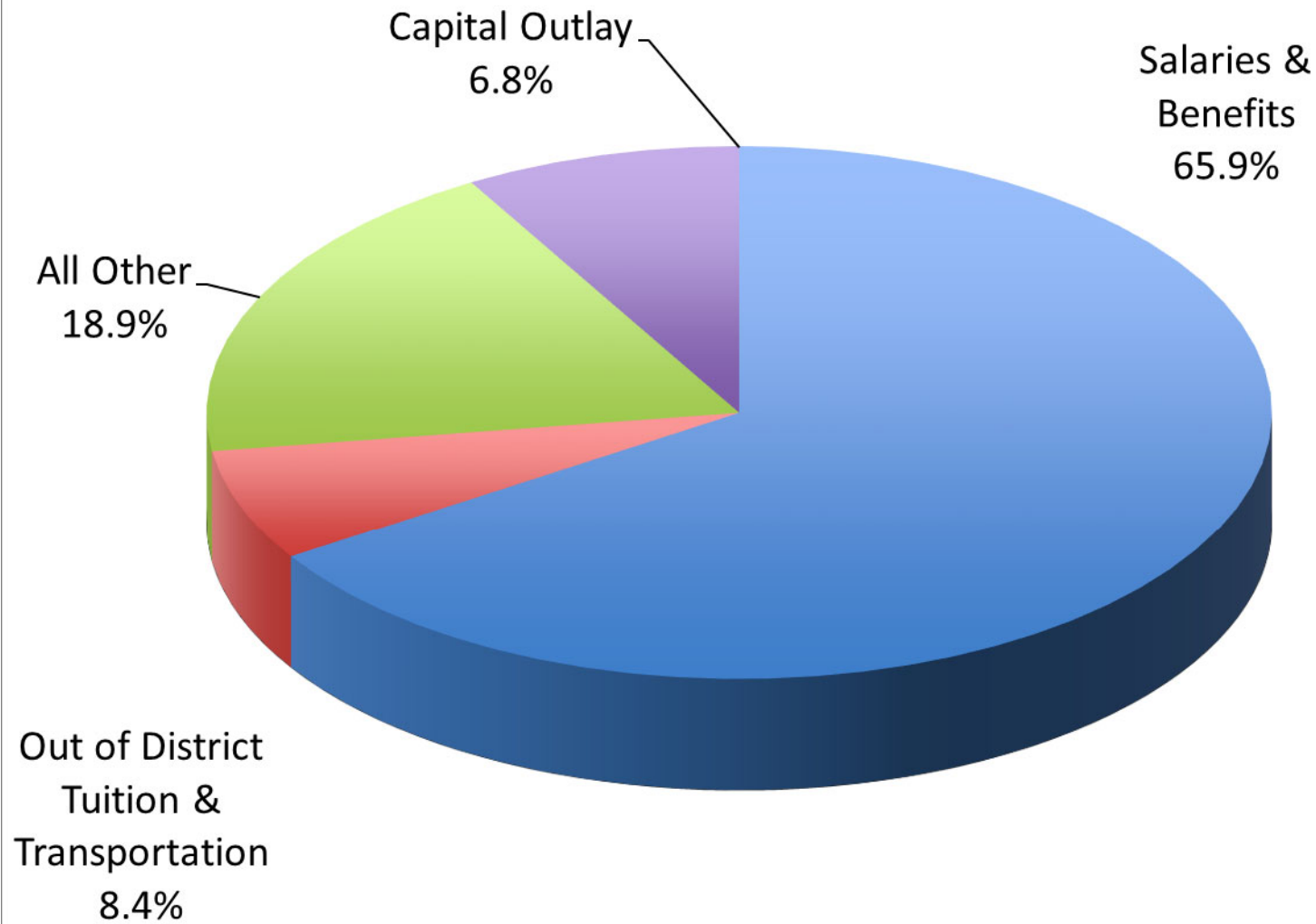
Purchase curriculum materials as needed in all areas.

Maintain SEL services through shared services with Westville.

Continue one-to-one chrome book initiative.

Capital projects: Install new bleachers in gym, continue concrete work to sidewalks and energy project (i.e. boilers, lighting, etc.)

SHARED SERVICES

Business Services - the district shares a School Business Administrator/Board Secretary, payroll, accounts payable, human resources and secretarial staff with Gateway Regional.

Buildings & Grounds - the district is in a shared service agreement with Gateway Regional utilizing the services of the Facility Director (CEFM).

Child Study Team - agreement with Gateway Regional who provides a director, psychologist, social workers, clerical staff and other special education related services/specialists.

Technology - agreement with Gateway Regional who provides a technology team for all technology needs.

Curriculum Office - the district is in a consortium with Gateway Regional, Wenonah, Westville and Woodbury Heights School Districts sharing a coordinator and instructional supervisors to provide articulation from elementary to middle/high school.

Food Service - the district receives food services from Sodexo for breakfast and lunch through an agreement with Gateway Regional.

Superintendent - the district shares a Superintendent with Gateway and Westville School Districts further reducing administrative costs.

Staffing (other) - The district is in additional shared service agreements with Gateway Regional for a Media Specialist (library services) and School Safety Officer, with Westville for a Master Teacher and Relief Teacher for the Preschool Program and a new agreement for a SEL employee, and with Woodbury Heights for a Foreign Language Teacher.

Transportation - the district has a jointure agreement with Gateway Regional for mandated bussing services for special education and homeless, allowing the district to share bus routes with other local districts for optimal cost savings.



OTHER COST SAVINGS

- ❖ **HEALTH BENEFITS** - the district belongs to the Public Employer Trust for medical, Rx and dental coverage aligning itself with a large number of districts for better rates. Although the renewals were significant this year, the Trust is still performing better other options available to the district.

- ❖ **PROPERTY INSURANCE** - the district belongs to the Gloucester, Cumberland, Salem School Districts Joint Insurance Fund to get better pricing for property, legal liability and workers compensation insurance.

- ❖ **CO-OPS & CONSORTIUMS** - the district has joined various groups: ACES (utilities), ACT (telephone), multiple local cooperatives (supplies and equipment), to name just a few, for maximum savings.

What is the **Calendar Year** tax impact?

- Tax Levy Increase: **6.3%**
- Total tax increase: **8.9 cents**
- Average assessed home = **\$141,249**
- Average taxpayer increase = **\$126/year**
