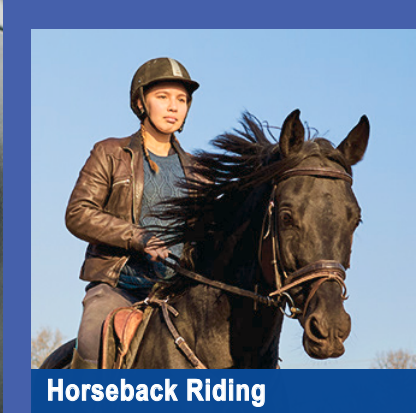

Community Programs Courses:

If we cancel a course for any reason, you will receive a full refund for that course.

If you need to withdraw from a course, please notify us at 359-7805.

- If you notify us at least one full week prior to the course start date, your entire course cost will be refunded.
- Notification received less than one full week prior to the course start date will be subject to a \$10 processing fee.
- If you notify us on or after a course start date, a refund will not be issued for that course.
- Refunds for supply fees will be issued based on whether course supplies were purchased before you withdrew.

'Learn to Swim Level 3' skills should be accomplished before enrolling in Level 4.

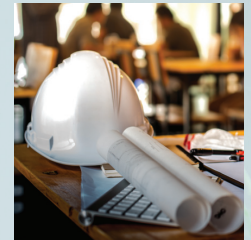

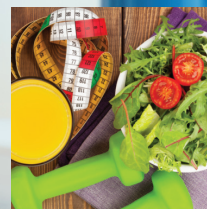

Driver and Traffic Safety Education (DTSE) is a joint partnership between the New York State Education Department and the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV). The Driver Education course is intended to educate students on appropriate driving skills and habits as well as playing a responsible role in the highway transportation/safety system.

Eligibility

- hold a valid NYS Learner's Permit by Thursday, June 25, 2026 for Session A; and by Monday, July 20, 2026 for session B
- minimum age of 16 years and enrolled in high school at the time of registration
- Attend the mandatory meeting for students & parents on Tuesday, June 23, 2026 at 6:00 p.m.

Course Requirements

- attend state-mandated 24 hours of lecture and 24 hours of road classes
- abide by Rush-Henrietta Student Code of Conduct
- mandatory driving time with a parent/guardian outside of DTSE course time
- obtain a minimum grade of 65 in both lecture and road classes

- All classes will be based out of the Rush-Henrietta Senior High School.
- The course cost is \$589
- Possible additional costs for a makeup and/or replacement certificate.
- Full payment with Visa or MasterCard is due with your online registration which begins May 13, 2026
- Scheduling priority is first come, first served
- Non-resident students must provide a letter of recommendation from their school principal
