Club	Description
American Sign Language	Come learn how to communicate using American Sign Language! Students will practice basic signs, play fun games, and explore Deaf culture. No experience is needed—just bring your hands and a willingness to learn!

Book Club	SLJH breakfast book club meets on Wednesday mornings in the library to discuss a book(s) that we have read. We select books as a group and meet until we complete the book. We will do several different books throughout the school year. Members can decide which book discussions they would like to participate in.
