
- Students should take notes on significant characters and themes and should be neatly handwritten.
  - Reading Notes are those notes that the student takes intermittently during or after the reading. Those notes may be in a journal, on note cards, or typed.
  - Marginalia are those notes that the student writes in the margin of the text as he or she is reading. In addition, marginalia should include underlining or highlighting of what is important, potentially on every page.





